Dear Brothers and Sisters of Christ Lutheran Church

As we open the doors at Christ Lutheran Church today, Sunday, August 2nd, 2020, two blended services will be held at 9:00 am and II:00 am. To ensure the safety and well-being of everyone we wish to assure you that all of the guidelines and protocol provided by the Ontario Government and Public Health which allow for 70 people in our sanctuary (including the balcony) will be followed.

- Please maintain **Social Distancing** upon arrival and when leaving. You will find all the signs and markings that you have likely already seen around the city. Pews and various areas of the church will be appropriately marked or taped off.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at all entry and exit points. Please sanitize your hands
 upon entering and exiting the church. All areas of the church have been sanitized and
 will be sanitized between services.
- Masks will be available and we are asking that everyone entering the church wear a
 mask at all times with the exception of the Pastor, organist and soloist(s). Masks will not
 be required if you have breathing issues as per provincial regulations
- Enter only at the South-West (double glass doors) entrance. Inside the doors you will be asked the basic questions relating to wellness and travel prior to entering and your attendance will be recorded before being ushered to a pew. We will seat you from front to back pews.
- Following the service you will be ushered out from the pews, starting at the rear of the sanctuary. Families may sit together, singles will be placed 3 to a pew. Please keep in mind that it is unlikely that you will sit in your usual pew.
- The washroom in the narthex will be available, however we would ask that it only be used if absolutely necessary. It will be sanitized after each use.
- Please do not gather in groups in the narthex or parking lot before or after the service, continue to observe social distancing of at least 2 metres or 6 feet.
- Offering baskets will be placed at entrance/exit to the sanctuary
- Bulletins and Portals of Prayer (when they become available) will be available for pick up as you leave.
- For the time being there will be no choir

We are not planning to begin Holy Communion for the time being. You will be advised when we are prepared to add that to our active church practices.

It is possible that changes to the safety guidelines and protocols may occur prior to August 2nd but we will continue to practice the highest level of safety to protect all of our members and guests.

<u>VOLUNTEERS FOR RE-OPENING</u>: As we re-open today, we will have 2 services one at 9 a.m. and one at 11 a.m. In order to comply with the government and public health recommendations, we will need the assistance of volunteers for both services to usher, record attendance, temperature check and assist with sanitizing between services. Distributes food hampers, soap, essentials to Haitians amid pandemic

HAITI – The Haiti Lutheran Mission Society (HLMS) has been making great strides in adopting a new focus: Educating our Haiti brothers, laymen, to fill the role as spiritual leaders within their communities, in light of the lack of pastoral presence in the country. HLMS will, of course, still continue their relief work in service of those in need. Our brothers and sisters in Haiti experience much need, and it is often hard to understand in our vastly different style of living in Canada. One thing that is no different from Haitians and Canadians is that we are all created by our Lord God Almighty and are loved very, very much.

When HLMS asked our contacts in Haiti how the COVID-19 pandemic was affecting them, we were sad to learn that the situation is far worse than we had even anticipated.

The LORD will keep you from all evil; he will keep your life. The LORD will keep your going out and your coming in from this time forth and forevermore (Psalms 121: 7-8).

What comforting words King David wrote as he praised our Lord, "The LORD will keep your going out and your coming in from this time forth and forevermore". We have Jesus Christ with us every day, everywhere – during times of joy and, most assuredly, in times of stress and worry!

No country has been spared from this pressing reality that the human body can be quickly overcome with sickness and death. All life is precious. Our work in Haiti has always been centred on bringing the Good News of Jesus' salvation to all. We have learned that, in Haiti, the numbers of those infected and dying are increasing everyday by the thousands. The virus has infected the poor in the overcrowded slums of Port-au-Prince. It has infected policemen and doctors. It has even spread into the prisons, which do not offer much hope for physical distancing of inmates. Many Haitians are distrustful of the government and, as a result, many do not take seriously the threat of COVID-19. Despite orders to stay indoors, people still frequent shops and go about their daily routines in the streets, without masks or physical distancing.

Last month HLMS sent relief in the form of funding the distribution of food hampers and soap. With just a couple thousand dollars,

we helped 40 individuals receive food but more importantly soap to clean themselves and their clothing. The hampers contained rice, pasta, milk, oil, Clorox and soap. With your support, additional food and soap can be distributed to Haitians, along with the message of hope in Jesus Christ our Saviour. Please help us continue to support our brothers and sisters in Haiti. Your generous giving will provide essentials to these people as the pandemic continues to devastate the country. We also ask that you remember in prayer the hospital staff, doctors, and government workers in Haiti, that the Holy Spirit would work through them to care for the people during this crisis. We pray that the hearts of the leaders that govern are guided to facilitate the necessary care and education for their people; and that the people of Haiti hear and heed the recommendations by healthcare professionals; and that they would soon be delivered from the devastation of this pandemic.
