We have been blessed with a successful re-opening of the church and, with the arrival of Pastor Todd, a return to a Contemporary service at 9 a.m. and a Traditional service at 11 a.m. As the number of cases of Covid are beginning to rise in the Province, let us not be complacent; we cannot let our guard down. Kindly continue to follow the safety measures and protocols that are currently in place. If you have any of the symptoms outlined by Public Health, **please remain at home**. Sermons are available online. If attending worship please:

- Wear a mask (covering both your mouth and nose) at all times
- Sanitize your hands frequently
- Practice social distancing 2 metres or 6 feet apart.
- Ensure you have a temperature check before entering.
- Ensure that your attendance is noted at the entrance doors

COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION - "Pilgrim style"

- 1. An usher will direct each person, single file, socially distanced from the pew to walk using the main aisle, to the front of the sanctuary.
- 2. Please wear your mask.
- 3. As you approach the Pastor and Elder, drop down your mask to receive communion.
- 4. A Communion wafer will be placed into your hand by the Pastor using a tong.
- 5. You may then choose an individual glass of Communion wine to drink from the Elder holding the tray.
- 6. You may eat and drink and then reposition your face mask.
- 7. Return to your pew using the outer aisle
- 8. Resume worship.


The Epistle: Philippians 4: 4-9

[St. Paul writes:] Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me—practice these things, and the God of peace will be with you.

The Holy Gospel: St. Matthew 22: 1-14

And again Jesus spoke to them in parables, saying, "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son, and sent his servants to call those who were invited to the wedding feast, but they would not come. Again he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those who are invited, "See, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready. Come to the wedding feast." But they paid no attention and went off, one to his farm, another to his business, while the rest seized his servants, treated them shamefully, and killed them. The king was angry, and he sent his troops and destroyed those murderers and burned their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The wedding feast is ready, but those invited were not worthy. Go therefore to the main roads and invite to the wedding feast as many as you find.' And those servants went out into the roads and gathered all whom they found, both bad and good. So the wedding hall was filled with quests. "But when the king came in to look at the quests, he saw there a man who had no wedding garment. And he said to him, 'Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding garment?' And he was speechless. Then the king said to the attendants, 'Bind him hand and foot and cast him into the outer darkness. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of October 11th, 2020 teeth.' For many are called, but few are chosen."
