

THE "POPPY" — THE FLOWER OF REMEMBRANCE



On **Remembrance Day** everyone wears a poppy, a reminder of the bloodred flower which grew in the fields where many men died. Much of the fighting was done in a place called "**Flanders**". This was during the war of 1914—1918. Every Spring, the soldiers fighting in the trenches noticed the red flowers blooming on the battlegrounds. And as more and more of their friends were killed, the soldiers noticed that the poppies bloomed over the graves.

When the war was over and when the soldiers came home, they still thought of all their friends who were buried in Flanders. Each time they thought of the graves, they thought of the poppies which grew around the graves. Then the men who came back from the war decided that they would wear a poppy each year to show that they still remembered their friends.

November 11th was the day on which the fighting stopped in 1918. The men who had been in the war picked that day each year to wear a poppy. Other people who had not been in the war, but who loved the soldiers who had been killed, also wanted to show that they remembered the dead. so they also wore a poppy.

There were not enough real poppies to go around. Then some of the men who were wounded, and couldn't work at other jobs, began to make poppies out of cloth. That is why today everybody wears a poppy which is not a real flower but which reminds us of the flowers which grew over the graves of the men who died.


For many years after the first war, children stood with their parents on "Remembrance Day". Everybody was silent, and everybody wore a poppy and they all thought hard about the men who were killed.

By the time many of the children grew up, there was another war. They boys who were now young men went to war. Many of them went to the same places as the men they used to remember. In the fighting in those places, a lot of these young men died.

When the second war was over, more people than ever wanted to wear a poppy; now there were more dead soldiers than ever to remember. There were also sailors and airmen. All of these people went to war to protect Canada. They went to war to protect the people who were in Canada then, and also the people who would be born in the future—people like us.

They died so that you could enjoy all the good things in your life. They so that your home would be safe, so that you would be given a chance going to school and going to the church of your choice. They also died that you could make friends with whomever you chose.

So perhaps you didn't know these men who died in war. But they knew you. They wanted you to live in peace.



Therefore, on Remembrance Day, when everyone wears a poppy and stands in silence it is like a "<u>Thank You</u>" to all those who died for us.

The Epistle: 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

[St. Paul writes:] But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about those who have died, so that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have died. For this we declare to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will by no means precede those who have died. For the Lord himself, with a cry of command, with the archangel's call and with the sound of God's trumpet, will descend from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up in the clouds together with them to meet the Lord in the air; and so we will be with the Lord for ever. Therefore encourage one another with these words.

The Holy Gospel St. Matthew 25: 1-13

[Jesus says:] 'Then the kingdom of heaven will be like this. Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. When the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them; but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps. As the bridegroom was delayed, all of them became drowsy and slept. But at midnight there was a shout, "Look! Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him." Then all those bridesmaids got up and trimmed their lamps. The foolish said to the wise, "Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out." But the wise replied, "No! there will not be enough for you and for us; you had better go to the dealers and buy some for yourselves." And while they went to buy it, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went with him into the wedding banquet; and the door was shut. Later the other bridesmaids came also, saying, "Lord, lord, open to us." But he replied, "Truly I tell you, I do not know you." Keep awake therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour.



KAREEM & FAMILY REFUGEE SPONSORSHIP UPDATE

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, things are processing slowly with the application for Kareem and his family to immigrate to Canada. Jennifer and Muna at Canadian Lutheran World Relief are working to help in getting the government forms completed. This takes translation from Arabic into English and filling out the required forms online for the Canadian government. It has been a month long process, plus the men who transferred Kareem and his family from Turkey in a rubber raft to the island of Samos refugee camp took their passports and money and refused to give them their passports back. This family like many refugee families have faced a lot of struggles as they try to get to a safe and peaceful country to live in. We need to pray fervently that our government officials receive favourably the request from Canadian Lutheran World Relief to assign Kareem and his family to our congregation to welcome them into our community and care. We need to keep Jennifer and Muna in prayer as well as they guide our application request and get all the forms completed as required by immigration. Please also consider donating to our Refugee Resettlement Fund as we do need to raise \$25,000. I ask that you not redirect donations from supporting the local work of Christ with our new Pastor. However, as the Lord may bless you in ways that you may not have expected perhaps you could consider giving from those blessings. And remember this is a mission outreach so also think of it as a mission to show God's Love and forgiveness to Kareem and his family.
