The Old Testament: Isaiah 40:1-11

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins. A voice cries out: 'In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.'

A voice says, 'Cry out!' And I said, 'What shall I cry?" All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field. The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the Lord blows upon it; surely the people are grass. The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand for ever. Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, 'Here is your God!' See, the Lord God comes with might, and his arm rules for him; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him. He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms, and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep.

The Epistle: 2 Peter 3: 8-15a

Finally, all of you, have unity of spirit, sympathy, love for one another, a tender heart, and a humble mind. Do not repay evil for evil or abuse for abuse; but, on the contrary, repay with a blessing. It is for this that you were called—that you might inherit a blessing. For 'Those who desire life and desire to see good days, let them keep their tongues from evil and their lips from speaking deceit; let them turn away from evil and do good; let them seek peace and pursue it. For the eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and His ears are open to their prayer. But the face of the Lord is against those who do evil.' Now who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord.

The Holy Gospel: St. Mark 1: 1-8

The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. As it is written in Isaiah the prophet, "Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way, the voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight," John appeared, baptizing in the wilderness and proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And all the country of Judea and all Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist and ate locusts and wild honey. And he preached, saying, "After me comes he who is mightier than I, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

KAREEM & FAMILY REFUGEE SPONSORSHIP UPDATE

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, Translation of the ID documents and police check from Iraq are now in process. It will cost us \$300 for the translation which will be paid out of your donations to our Refugee Settlement Fund. The Government forms to which the ID documents will be attached have been completed by the hard work done by Jennifer and Muna at CLWR. It is planned that once the translation is completed that Jennifer will forward all of the documents and application to Ottawa and she will receive a registration number which she can give to Kareem and he can submit it to the government of Greece so they will not deport Kareem and his family back to Irag. Once Ottawa has reviewed the information submitted, the next step will be the interview with the family by our officials in Greece. I have now received from CLWR : Sponsorship Undertaking-Sponsorship Agreement Holders; Sponsor Assessment: Settlement Plan, Sponsorship Agreement Holders, these forms and forward them to CLWR for their records in case the government requests this information at any time. I will have a meeting with our Refugee committee before submitting the Settlement Plan. As of November 22, there has been \$3,450 donated in Sunday morning offerings and the Mary Martha has collected \$205 as at their November meeting. This gives us a total of \$3,655 to date. We need to continue to pray that CLWR can complete and send the documentation to Ottawa within the next couple of weeks, at least before Christmas. May God who is Lord over everything guide the hands of our government to bring us Kareem and his family. God bless, Pastor John 289-407-7662
