

Anyone who does not heed the words that the prophet shall speak in my name, I myself will hold accountable. But any prophet who speaks in the name of other gods, or who presumes to speak in my name a word that I have not commanded the prophet to speak—that prophet shall die.'

The Epistle *1 Corinthians 8: 1-13*

[St. Paul writes:] Now concerning food sacrificed to idols: we know that 'all of us possess knowledge.' Knowledge puffs up, but love builds up. Anyone who claims to know something does not yet have the necessary knowledge; but anyone who loves God is known by him. Hence, as to the eating of food offered to idols, we know that 'no idol in the world really exists', and that 'there is no God but one.' Indeed, even though there may be so-called gods in heaven or on earth—as in fact there are many gods and many lords— yet for us there is one God, the Father, from whom are all things and for whom we exist, and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist. It is not everyone, however, who has this knowledge. Since some have become so accustomed to idols until now, they still think of the food they eat as food offered to an idol; and their conscience, being weak, is defiled. 'Food will not bring us close to God.' We are no worse off if we do not eat, and no better off if we do. But take care that this liberty of yours does not somehow become a stumbling-block to the weak. For if others see you, who possess knowledge, eating in the temple of an idol, might they not, since their conscience is weak, be encouraged to the point of eating food sacrificed to idols? So by your knowledge those weak believers for whom Christ died are destroyed. But when you thus sin against members of your family, and wound their conscience when it is weak, you sin against Christ. Therefore, if food is a cause of their falling, I will never eat meat, so that I may not cause one of them to fall. This is the Word of the Lord.

St. Mark 1:21-28

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Mark, the 1st chapter:

Deuteronomy 18: 15-20

"GOD'S GREAT PROPHET PROFITS US"

January 31, 2021

"Moses said, 'The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your brothers. You must listen to him in everything he tells you."

It's good practice to say what you need to say.

In the moment. At the right time.

Pay attention. Listen. Wait.

Respond.

Firm but gentle.

Speak your peace.

Get things off f our chest.

Make your parting words count.

Leave a good lasting impression.

Since this parish is my 3rd pastoral call,

I've had 2 opportunities to write and deliver a final farewell sermon.

Share God's good word,

Remind them of grace,

convey the highs and lows and blessings of ministry together.

If you had a chance to say one last thing in your life, what would it be?

Like a last will and testament, make a legal document outlining wishes.

Maybe sum up a life well lived at a retirement banquet.

What would you write into your parting words?

Deuteronomy 18 begins Moses' final goodbye message to God's people, Israel.

God's call and covenant to them are all in place

as Moses' will depart and be with the Lord.

It's the 40th year of Israel's wilderness journey.

Moses led them to the east bank of the Jordan River.

He's standing in front of about 2 million people.

Moses, along with Joshua and Caleb, all had been adults

when they left slavery in Egypt.

The rest of the people had either been children then

or had been born and raised during the 40 year wilderness wandering.

Moses is helping them look to the future,

Taking one last time to explain God's Word of hope for their long term benefit.

Moses will die, but another must take his place.

Joshua takes over,

but is never considered a prophet as great as Moses.

After all, Moses saw the Lord God face to face, which forever changed him.

God called Moses with a voice emanating from a burning bush

To lead Israel into the freedom of the promised land.

With dry feet they escaped through the parted Red Sea waters.

Moses received the God's LAW, the TORAH,

the 10 living words of command and promises,

Not once,

But twice.

The 1st on Mount Sinai.

God gave Moses the stone tablets.

Then he broke them into pieces

in anger over seeing his people create a fake golden calf idol

when they hastily thought God left them on their own.

Then the wandering around through wilderness

The hunger, the sickness

The death ...

and then God etches stone tablets of His Law yet again.

As He knows they need His Word present physically with them.

This, the 2nd time on Mount Horeb.

Which means THE mountain of God.

A place of new re-invigorated covenant hope.

From mountain to mountain, they gradually found comfort in the Rock of Salvation.

Talk about looking toward the rock from which they had been carved!?

God is so holy, so patient, so compassionate, such a strong refuge of safety.

He is so powerful,

that humans can't see or hear the unvarnished,

unprotected version of God

And live.

God allowed Moses access.

But with the breaking of the Law,

The sin of the people,

They truly need a mediator.

This they even dared ask God for such a mediator when they arrived at Mount Horeb.

They will get what they wish

They will get a go between.

Like Moses.

Not right away, coming, in the future.

One man

God will personally raise up as a prophet

from among them like Moses.

Other prophets will come after him.

Elijah, Elisha, Jonah, Amos, Isaiah,

Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Daniel, even Prophetess Deborah...Anna...

They all grow up through the family tree of Israel...

Yet none of these ever get to see God like Moses.

They are not THE prophet.

Even John the Baptizer, the last voice, isn't THE PROPHET,

He isn't even good enough to untie his sandal.

THE PROPHET is more than another Moses.

THE PROPHET will be raised up and established BY GOD

From among the people of Israel,

"literally in the Hebrew, it means from 'HIS BRETHREN'S BOWELS."

Coming from Adam's ancestry.

From the earthiness of humanity.

Real

Like you,

Like people,

Like Israel,

But from God's raising

God's seed.

God's doing.

Not because they were so great,

But because God made them great through His promise.

A humbling promise.

A humbling purpose.

Reminds me of a saying old Country Music musicians say.

When an entertainer gets success, that they

"don't get above you're raisin'..."

Meaning: Don't forget who you are or what you come from.

Don't think you're more important that your roots,

as it makes up who you are.

Israel's lineage must be kept, treasured and protected.

Don't get arrogant.

When the people mourn the loss of Moses,

Or get captured into slavery again,

They will hear a prophet's voice and be reminded--

Yes, THE GREAT PROPHET is still coming.

They will carry on faithfully and humbly.

God is very clear: they must be PERFECT. [in verse 13]

That's a tall order, especially without Moses.

He's done so much for them on their behalf before God.

By being perfect in the Hebrew means "without blemish or stain."

If that sounds a bit like Passover talk, it is.

The word used for a perfect lamb

is used of Israel as a people holding the promise of the PROPHET.

A Passover lamb is an offering.

They as a people must be an offering

A living sacrifice from which all nations will be drawn towards.

Their wandering journey becomes their story of faith, forgiveness and new life.

Because the PROPHET yet to come

will be the very Lamb of God

Who takes away the sin of the world!

The PROPHET from among them will be their SAVIOUR,

Jesus the Christ.

HE will be very different from the other prophets.

He will be real, like Moses, a man, with Words to speak,

But so much greater and above Moses and all the others.

He will be the embodiment of perfect.

But how this divine and human combo will come to be

gave way to countless religious and political interpretations

by the time Jesus arrives on the scene.

"a prophet like me from among your own,"

Says very clearly Jesus is God in the flesh as a man.

And this is God's great prophet plan.

Israel was definitely expecting the Prophet to be truly God;

it would only come as a surprise to many

that he'd be a real human, with a human mother,

a humble, poor birth and a human ancestry leading all the way back to Adam.

And just as Moses stood as an imperfect mediator of the covenant given on Mount Sinai,

so now Christ is the perfect mediator of a new & better covenant,

the one that takes the place of Sinai's

and is so all encompassing,

complete & perfect & fulfilled on mount Calvary.

All will listen to Him

because the WORDS placed in His mouth ARE HIS

for He is the Word of God made man.

This is why the crowds had been astounded at Jesus' teaching

as HE taught like one with great authority.

He knows His own WORD.

His Word is power.

He is power.

This is why we're drawn to listen to Him.

We must not add nor subtract anything from His Word.

New prophets who come after our Lord,

Like Pastors and parishioners as the Church, the living Body of Christ,

Are called to remain faithful and rely only on God's Word.

The temptation is always there to add or subtract words from what God has given.

Fear and pride and arrogance make us want to cut away or add things into Scripture.

Either to make people rigidly behave or carelessly get them off the hook.

We dare not create a false following,

As to make people feel things are better or worse than they are;

But if there's anything we heading into 2021 can learn

from those ancient wilderness wanderings

is that

humility, faithfulness, forgiveness and hope all go together.

For they are Christ-centered traits.

We can't go it alone.

We can't create a faith oasis.

We can only be realistic about the world and who we are,

That all of us are fallen and in need of grace and mercy.

That part of our calling involves engaging the outside world

with witness and human contact and help and friendship

We can trust that God STILL MAKES THINGS HAPPEN

by moving around in our lives as HE HAS in the past.

Through Christ's work

we now can see

God endlessly at work in our workings

with His promised spirit.

Jesus always wowed people s

Made them raise eyebrows with Whom He shared His presence

How He made great those who serve

How He showed access to the Father comes through Him by all who live by faith.

He astounded many by speaking the very Word of God,

with authority, and not just a man's interpretation or opinion.

This also made certain people hate him

And reject him

not only as the PROPHET

but as the Lamb of God come to save them -- by dying

And yet in this very deadly rejection

God's prophet promise is made perfect;

By being killed on a cross

all the years of wandering and countless sinning and worlds' upheaval

and prophet's sermons and broken laws and shattered tablets

all get fixed and made new, made perfect, holy, without stain or blemish.

We are made perfect without stain or blemish.

In the perfect image of Christ crucified.

We have Christ within.

As sure as the Word washed over us with baptismal water.

His Words go into our mouths

As sure as the Word is placed in our mouth with Holy Communion's bread and cup.

Jesus is the promised prophet like Moses,

but in every way eternally better than Moses.

He is God's Son

And our brother.

His message is the saving Gospel

because He is the perfect prophet,

Our suffering servant,

Laying down His life for ours,

The glad tidings of great joy given for all people.

We can Listen to him

God has given us ears that are receptive to His great help

His Word is enough.

His grace is enough.

Our faith in him is enough –

sufficient for receiving and taking hold of his gracious promises of peace and renewal.

No longer is any of this centered around Moses,

or Jerusalem,

or a Temple,

or even a shared genetic legacy,

but instead

around the life, death, resurrection, ascension, and lordship of Jesus Christ and joyful living in His Kingdom.

A Kingdom we share when we say what we need to say.

A lineage we show is open to all, regardless of who they are.

A prophet promise made to every person we encounter for Jesus' sake.

May all of our words,


1st, middle or last words,


