REV. TODD HOEFFS Ascension of our Lord Scripture: Acts 1:1-11 May 16, 2021 Jesus says..."You will be my witnesses..."

Sometimes, endings are better than beginnings. Completion of a job well done. The end of our lockdown. The hope-full end to COVID? Jesus' send off to the Heavenly Kingdom back with His Father following His death on the cross and resurrection from the tomb. How the disciples have changed since they witnessed Jesus' 1st miracle of changing water into wine at a wedding....and yet, now.. He's still opening up the Scriptures to them before HE ascends. Reminds me of a scene on the final episode to the well-known TV show of the 70s' & 80's – MASH. As the army surgical hospital packs up after the war ends, each character says goodbye in their own unique manner. Doctors Hawkeye and BJ, who have been very anti-military and rarely went along with army regulations, not to mention, against the war, get ready to say goodbye to their beloved commander, Col. Potter (a vet of WW1, 2 and regular army). An old Cavalry man, Col Potter is ready to leave the camp on his horse Sophie. Both drs. Hawkeye and BJ want to give something to their beloved col 1 last time. "We have something to give you, Col," they say. "It's not much, but it comes from the heart"...they stand straight, and offer a full proper military salute. A tear-filled eye Col Salutes back and rides off into the sunset. Jesus sends off His disciples one last time by opening up their minds to see completely the plan of salvation Which He executed perfectly for the whole world And now He is bringing His earthly ministry to a close. And He is blessing them as they wait for the promised Holy Spirit. They come so far and yet have so much more to do, as the infant church needs them and the ministry of witness yet to come. Jesus' disciples. The last to touch him. The last to hear his voice. Only Paul on the Damascus road and John on Patmos will ever visually see Him again. But once the risen Jesus becomes the ascended Jesus, the way things had been and the way things continue to be is: no more hearing, no more touching, no more seeing Jesus. They will be His mouth and ears and hands and feet --

THEY WILL BE HIS WITNESSES IN THE WORLD.

The entire church will be the embodiment of Jesus from now on.

This is why we rejoice in Jesus' ascension.

If He hadn't, we couldn't access Him by faith no matter where we are.

So we even proclaim in our creeds, "He ascended into heaven"

as a statement of what we believe and treasure.

Ascension does not mean "no more Jesus"! Ascension means "so much more Jesus" yet to come! Being a witness comes with a fair amount of responsibility.

If you're an eyewitness to a crime, you'll likely make a statement to police

and maybe even testify in court. If you're a witness for a wedding, you'll have a sign the legal document indicating that you heard and saw everything that day.

If you're a witness for a baptism, you pray for that person, put them in mind of their baptism, and maybe even promise to take care of them if need be.

Witnesses don't do much good if they keep what they've seen to themselves.

Sharing the news is the point of witnessing.

The disciples are eyewitnesses of what Jesus did for about three years as a teaching rabbi on earth. While at times they may have forgotten that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God. They may have baulked at having to let down fishing nets at the wrong time of the day only to bring in a gigantic catch!

So it shouldn't surprise us that Jesus still has to enlarge their minds and hearts regarding Himself and what He's come to do.

What the law of Moses and the psalms and the prophets bear witness.

That He had to suffer, die on a cross, rise from the dead

and ASCEND back to heaven to sit at the Father's right hand.

This account in Luke's Gospel captures well the close of Jesus' work. .

His obedience to his heavenly Father's plan of saving the world wasn't just really good; it was flawless.

And Jesus' disciples along with Mary Magdalene and other women stayed with Jesus nearly every moment of every day.

Seeing miracles. Hearing His Word. They knew who Jesus was—

the smart teacher, the great provider, even the promised Savior.

They weren't always so sure, though, on what exactly he was going to do or how he was going to do it. Imagine what went through the disciples' heads on Good Friday

as a mob entices the weak-willed Roman governor to condemn a man that he himself admitted was innocent? The one everyone thought was going to fix everything ends up crucified, dead, and buried. The anguish, the emotion, from a bloodied cross to empty grave clothes.

He is risen. But no where to be found. At a moment when they might have just been starting to process that their dear friend and teacher was gone,

He comes to them – bringing peace. And even the ascension.

As Jesus bodily rises up above them, drawn upward into a cloud on the way to heaven, he warns the them not to leave Jerusalem, the center of all divine activity.

They need to wait for the Holy Spirit as promised.

They may be looking for the final Israeli restoration, an earthly kingdom,

just like they hoped when He rode into Jerusalem on a donkey.

[a fight which is still erupting in Jerusalem today – 2000 years later!]

Jesus' power isn't about worldly government. It's about witnessing the faith.

Being His Body in the world. Jesus leaves and two men "stand near."

Just like the two men sitting at the empty tomb

warning the women to stop looking for the living among the dead.

Living beings aren't found in graveyards any more than living beings remain in the sky. He'll return in the same way He came, but not now, or tomorrow or even next year. Ours is not to wonder when, but to GO as Jesus says, as HIS WITNESSES.

We are "his witnesses" to the world. But as you may guess, its far less demanding, to be a spectator than a witness. Spectators view from afar, keep ideas to themselves, expect others to do the work. Witnesses, on the other hand, speak and live and look and show the truth of the gospel: the truth of justice for the whole world,

the love of enemies, and the care for the downtrodden and outcast.

In fact, Jesus said IT IS FINISHED so that faith and renewal and transformation and repentance and forgiveness can be shouted out loudly in HIS NAME as HIS WITNESSES. Jesus is clear there's nothing left to accomplish.

There's nothing that needs to be done by anyone on this earth to make up for or remove sin. In Jesus' name that sin is gone.

Nothing that anyone can do can pay for sin and no one has to.

His death and resurrection destroyed death and brought eternal life to the world! Just witness. THE Greek word for WITNESS is Martyrion, which is where we get the English word MARTYR. So, does that mean being Jesus' witness involves dying? YES! But not necessarily like the early Christians thrown to the lions,

although various persecutions could come and will come in various communities of faith. What's most urgent is our dying to self, as the old sinner in us is crucified to the cross daily through remembrance of Baptism where all that harms us died with Christ. And once this dying happens, our new self-rises back up to new life, active,

witnessing to the hope we have as Christ lives in us and His Spirit animates our steps through this life. We also die to our pride if what we believe makes us uncomfortable Or helping someone out who others deem unsuited to being helped May cause your faith to be questioned. Others may believe conspiracies you deem as untrue and that may cause abrasion to your belief system. But while you hold to simple yet firm faith And trust that your embodiment of Jesus in the world is all that's needed, You will withstand any attack on such character.

Jesus still comes and opens up our minds to understand the Scriptures.

So that with eyes of faith we grasp the simple message

Of His Gospel cross-beam love for all people.

And that by ascending to Heaven HE seals this as complete for all time.

Life is new and Jesus' ascension proves it. He has gone where we will all go one day.

Until then, we are His witnesses. Our lives still proclaim the best sermon

in how we as Christians live our lives, serve all in need and how we cope with our everchanging lives. Life for so many people have grown tired of the faith

and no doubt can't see anything good coming out of any Christian mouth much less out of the church doors. Apathy, disinterest, neglect, those hurt us now. That's where our lives come into it. We show forth Christ and His amazing grace in how we react to life.

We're not called to fix all that's wrong. We're not called to make people toe the line.

We're not law mongers or legalists or doormats for the world.

We are simply JESUS' WITNESSES. We share what we see and hear and believe.

As we cling to Christ in faith because of His Word and the Holy Communion life of Jesus we share keeping us secure and nourished in the faith.

How we live, Whom we trust, unto Whom belongs all honour and worship,

we are, until we dine with Jesus as His Table in Heaven,

HIS WITNESSES.

THE WORD

The First Reading

Acts of the Apostles 1: 1-11

In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them over the course of forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. 'This', he said, 'is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.' So when they had come together, they asked him, 'Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.' When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up towards heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand

looking up towards heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.'

This is the Word of the Lord.

The Holy Gospel St. Luke 24:44-53

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Luke, the 24th chapter:

Glory to You, O Lord.
