

#### **The Epistle:** 2 *Corinthians* 4:13 – 5:1

[St. Paul writes:] But just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture—'I believed, and so I spoke'—we also believe, and so we speak, because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God. So we do not lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day. For this slight momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure, because we look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal. For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. This is the Word of the Lord.

### The Holy Gospel:St. Mark 3:20-35

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Mark, the 3<sup>rd</sup> chapter: **Glory to You, O Lord.** ....and the crowd came together again, so that [Jesus and His disciples] could not even eat. When Jesus' family heard it, they went out to restrain him, for people were saying, 'He has gone out of his mind.' And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem said, 'He has Beelzebul, and by the ruler of the demons he casts out demons.' And he called them to him, and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but his end has come. But no one can enter a strong man's house and plunder his property without first tying up the strong man; then indeed the house can be plundered. 'Truly I tell you, people will be forgiven for their sins and whatever blasphemies they utter; but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit can never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an eternal sin'— for they had said, 'He has an unclean spirit.' Then his mother and his brothers came; and standing outside, they sent to him and called him. A crowd was sitting around him; and they said to him, 'Your mother and your brothers and sisters are outside, asking for you.' And he replied, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' And looking at those who sat around him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers! Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother.' This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to You, O Christ.**



#### REV. TODD HOEFFS PENTECOST 2 Scripture: Genesis 3:8ff & St. Mark 3:20ff. June 6, 2021 F, S + HS. AMEN.

The adoption process teaches you very early on in life about what's within your control. These little ones arrive from different birth families with different health histories with unique traits and personalities. The entire adoption process is entrusted to others for placements and choices and meeting and eventual, permanent homes.

While they'll learn many things from their homelife and growing up, still there's certain things in the fabric of who they are.

Raising biological children is enough of a life lesson on parental control – but adoption truly comes from outside of who we are and what we know.

[We of course have the blessing of experiencing both in our lives.]

You learn that these aren't OUR children, as in direct ownership, but unique and wonderful gifts from God to love and nurture into wonderful adults.

[You may think, well, we know that...but you'd surprised how long it takes some parents to really believe that you can't control children!] Jesus teaches an amazing lesson today about family origin. He claims His mother and brothers and sisters are ANYONE doing the will of His Father. And what is the will of His Father,

BUT to believe in the name of our Saviour Jesus Christ. So... believers are JESUS' family members, not necessarily His family of origin!? Even life at the very beginning of creation centered around faith and trust. It's God taking the initiative. God creating. God shaping it all. He made us in His image. He created Adam and Eve, from the dust of the ground. Amazing new life from the newly sculpted world.

God walked with them, talked with them, shared a close, loving bond.

How quickly God's relationship in faith and trust with them got shattered once the serpent deceived the newlyweds in the garden about fruit from a tree.

They lie, they hide, they blame. It's over. Paradise lost, closed off to them...

carrying sin from one generation to another through childbirth. Sin taints us all, discolours even the unseen inner fabric of our being.God deemed Adam and Eve

worthy to give birth To many generations, His dear children, the nation of Israel, and with it, the promise of the Saviour. From Genesis 3:15 – the 1<sup>st</sup> proclamation of the good news of salvation – a SEED from the woman would be born to crush the satanic serpent. THAT SEED is JESUS; that woman chosen, Mary. The same mother Jesus says "isn't His mother". Why? Because it's all about faith, belief, trust, not family roots. This would've come as a HUGE shock to most the people of Jesus' day...

at least the people of Israel. While adoptions did occur, biology, lineage and family tree history was everything! Consider Jesus' history....from the house of David born in David's city, Bethlehem. Jesus' parents rooted deeply in Israel's beloved shepherd king. But Jesus was unique. He HAD to be born from direct ties to David, ultimately back to Adam's origin, Jesus is the SON OF MAN, the NEW PERFECT ADAM. Jesus is born of His mother and the seed from the Holy Spirit.

Almighty God is born as a MAN. Lowly so that He knows our human suffering.

Perfect [w/o sin] so that He can save us. Because all of us, MEN, WOMEN AND CHILDREN, are rooted in the 1<sup>st</sup> man and woman. We are born into this world And reborn into God's heavenly world...Jesus' audience would've assumed they're saved and going to Heaven because of their family origins.

Children of that 1<sup>st</sup> promise.

BUT that promise was never connected to ethnicity—it's only connected to FAITH! Adam and Eve's only hope of salvation was believing in that promise God 1<sup>st</sup> spoke to them. EVERYONE LOOKED FORWARD IN HOPE because The satanic snake would be crushed under the nail printed feet of God's Son born to die and He reverses the curse which darkened the entire universe. This good news would be everyone's hope This is why Jesus is so dangerous in the Gospel account from St. Mark.

He's angering so many who've long given up any idea that God would love anyone but a select few.Israel was a divided house, a divided Kingdom, ruled against their will by Roman occupation. The stronger man (that is, Satan) invaded their homes and temple and synagogues and robbed everyone of the life God always intended His people to enjoy. Only the good and perfect keepers of the Law (God's Law and Moses' Laws) could expect God's loveand only the outwardly and powerful religious said who was good and who wasn't. Jesus demolished this notion! By elevating any believer as one of Jesus' brothers or sisters, He's taking the religious leaders' birth certificates and tearing 'em up before their very eyes. ANYONE WHO BELIEVES includes Jew and Gentile, servant and banker and tax collector and sinner and low life and addicts and any person anywhere on the earth at any time!

ANY believer is a brother or sister or mother to Jesus. And many people He encountered did believe, even if it was only for the miracles He performed.

This is all part of God's plan of adopting all people into His gigantic Heavenly family.

By water, word and spirit – Baptism. God designed His family tree not according to birthplace but birthright in Jesus! Welcome news to outsiders. Imagine the good news to Gospel writer Mark's audience, many of whom would've been Greeks and Romans and various other people groups as well as Jewish converts! This ancient plan, this gift coming down from Adam and Eve to Noah to Abraham, Isaac, David BELONGS TO THEM & NOW TO YOU...SIMPLY BECAUSE OF GOD'S

GIFT OF GRACE THROUGH FAITH IN HIS SON!

Wow! How liberating this Gospel of Christ really is! This is how God restores the human family. Jesus comes and casts out Satan from the community.

He heals, teaches and overturns every bad idea anyone has about God.

Jesus is even accused of being demonic, which is so silly, but that's how difficult His good news is for them to comprehend. Although, there are times we have the same trouble. When things go so very wrong in our life and we expect God to pull us through faster than His wisdom dictates.

We're in love with control on so many levels, even wanting to escape control is wanting control in a different way. We're born and bred Lutherans and Christians and we feel we should be spared such aggravation in life.

Why don't the sinners out there suffer more than us in here?

We wind up missing the sin carried around in our own hearts, working to harden it toward God, His Word, and His Son. These are not to be harboured, God is in control, we are not. We only follow as God leads us by His Spirit. And thankfully, Jesus says such sins and bad thoughts, words and actions

are all FORGIVEN....REMOVED.... PAID IN FULL ---ALL. GONE...EXCEPT THAT ONE UNFORGIVEABLE SIN. There it is. We all wonder, is there anything God can't forgive? We probably think stealing or adultery or abortion or being gay or fraud or murder is all unforgiveable....which are noticeably easy outward things to pick apart in our own preconceived minds. Jesus' unforgivable sin in an inward issue.... beginning with the heart and attitude --sinning against the HOLY SPIRIT.

The Holy Spirit is the direct divine avenue to faith in Jesus.

Serious people who believe and say they want nothing to do with Jesus Christ and sincerely mean this most likely committing the unforgiveable sin.

I've known so many atheists and agnostics and non-church goers Who aren't committing this kind of sin. Only those who condemn Jesus and honestly want nothing to do with Him.That's not us. That's not many of us. My hope is that it's no one. But that's God's business at the end of all things. And we're not given our daily life in

this world to constantly worry that the next sin will be the unforgiveable one.

Stay connected to Christ Jesus. Get into the habit of confessing sins every day, trusting ever more in the forgiveness that's always there for you. Jesus willingly lived and died to pay for all sins, even that unforgiveable one. HE entered God's Holy City, Jerusalem, bound up the strong man, Satan, by getting His OWN BODY bound to a cross His saving death on the cross bridges the divide between nations, people, ideas and families. The whole world is welcomed into His bloody embrace.

And when His shed blood bleeds mysteriously into our Baptismal water, we're all adopted into God's Holy Family. A family going beyond human origins.

A family so amazing and heavenly For we're related to everyone all over the earth simply because we believe in God's Only Son, Jesus Christ, our Saviour and Lord. Even though families bicker and fight and are divided on so many issues, faith connects us to the most surprising people. You may find yourself closer to friends or co-workers or neighbours than members of your own family.

God surprises us at times letting us see faith from people we'd least expect. Even though technology connects us through the internet, we're never closer to anyone than when on bended knees as we eat and drink the meal Jesus' HOLY COMMUNION meal. A true family of faith feast joining earth and Heaven. We dine with all brothers and sisters and mothers and fathers who died and all those still living.

[I ALWAYS TELL THAT TO FAMILIES GRIEVING THE LOSS OF LOVED ONES AT FIUNERALS]

We share in the same promise of forgiveness and transformation of our lives and how we're inspired by the Holy Spirit to serve one another.

We learn to trust in our God residing deeply in our lives which are so often out of control. He makes our hearts His home. Trust doesn't give us better control, nor does faith. Trust and faith speaks loudly that God IS the one in control and His Spirit helps us live and make choices and serve our neighbour and worship our Lord and receive the treasures of His grace. Which means willingly forgiving and loving and welcoming all people as sisters and brothers of Jesus. Living His Will.

Not by birthplace but birthright as His Father's own. Amen.

Jesus always stands before us as the image of unity, wholeness, integration. He is the stronger one. He does for us what we cannot do for ourselves. He puts our lives and houses back in order. Jesus offers a different image of what life might look like. He does so by revealing the division in our lives, the houses that cannot stand, and the crumbling of our kingdoms.

Even when it is for our own good, with the offer of new life and intended for wholeness, that's a hard place to be. It means that one way or another change of some sort is coming. Most of us don't like that. It can be frightening.

He binds the forces that divide, heals the wounds that separate, and refashions pieces into a new whole. There is nothing about your life or my life that cannot be put back
