
Let us then confess our sins to God our Father:

The Epistle: 2 Corinthians 5: 1-10, 16-17

[St. Paul writes:] For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. For in this tent we groan, longing to be clothed with our heavenly dwelling— if indeed, when we have taken it off we will not be found naked. For while we are still in this tent, we groan under our burden, because we wish not to be unclothed but to be further clothed, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life. He who has prepared us for this very thing is God, who has given us the Spirit as a guarantee. So we are always confident; even though we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord— for we walk by faith, not by sight. Yes, we do have confidence, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord. So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him. For all of us must appear before the judgement seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense for what has been done in the body, whether good or evil.... From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! This the Word of the Lord**. Thanks be to God.**


GOSPEL VERSE

The Holy Gospel: St. Mark 4:26-34

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Mark, the 4th chapter: **Glory to You, O Lord.**

[Jesus] also said, 'The kingdom of God is as if someone would scatter seed on the ground, and would sleep and rise night and day, and the seed would sprout and grow, he does not know how. The earth produces of itself, first the stalk, then the head, then the full grain in the head. But when the grain is ripe, at once he goes in with his sickle, because the harvest has come.' He also said, 'With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable will we use for it? It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade.' With many such parables he spoke the word to them, as they were able to hear it; he did not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything in private to his disciples. This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to You, O Christ.**

REV. TODD HOEFFS PENTECOST 3 (series B) Scripture: St. Mark 4 Sower parable & mustard seed June 13, 2021

I grew up gardening. My dad loved it. He spent at least an hour everyday through the summer months taking care of it. It was his calm, happy place. He HATED his 28-year long assembly line job at a GM plant. Creating a vegetable garden gave him peace. I got to help dig up the soil, plant seeds, water, weed...he even got me to create little signs to mark which row grew which plant. Beans, corn, tomatoes & squash. He found great satisfaction in the growth. Now all that gardening experience would be handy as our own yard has so many different things growing which appear to have been there for many years. Gardening wasn't my favourite thing, but through the gardening I got to hear dad's stories of his past growing up on a dairy farm. Working with animals. Clearing fields. Plowing, harvesting. Gardening provided a way to hear about dad's family history. Jesus' gardening story of sowing seeds offers a way into understanding God's idea of growing His Kingdom. Jesus is the farmer sowing seeds. The seed is God's Word—with the purpose of planting faith. He very freely and liberally scatters the seeds. Not caring where they fall. Not worrying about how any of it takes root. Just spread the seed far and wide and the Kingdom WILL grow. The scattering is what's valuable in this story. And....the unusual part! No good farmer throws his seed around, wildly and indiscriminately. Seeds were valuable then, and costly. Throwing it around was wasteful and considered poor technique. There's no real way of predicting how any good growth could happen. But Jesus isn't teaching agriculture. He's teaching HOW His Father's Kingdom of grace must be shared. And Jesus' choosing a mustard seed as this great image for God's Kingdom is even more unusual. Mustard seeds were the tiniest of all seeds (similar to canola seeds today.) And they grew very wildly everywhere, looking like bushy shrubs, growing as high as up to 10 feet tall. Reminds me of a weed we encountered in our backyard – Choke weed. Grows fast and wild and covers the ground so well. Looks nice at first, but soon takes over everything, like other kinds of wild growth, mustard tree bushes were a nuisance, an aggressive, uncontrollable weed. Why use such a common, ordinary, pest of a plant as a picture of God's Kingdom? Why not big beautiful cedar trees, or date trees with sweet fruit? No, Jesus chooses a mustard seed bush. Not so grand and certainly not wanted. That's the point isn't it? This is precisely how God's Kingdom must take over. You can refuse to plant it. You can pull it up. You can cut it down. Regardless, it is there and it keeps coming back. This is how God's Kingdom flourishes. Looks powerless, unwanted, a nuisance - but so all encompassing and powerful in God's eyes. This is the way we as Christians are called to share God's Word and the riches of our faith as seeds thrown around every piece of ground we walk upon.

We don't always think about the scattering.

Usually, the details of the types of soil get our attention.

Some seeds fall on hard ground, rocky ground, some are eaten by birds,

some get burned up in the scorching sun, some fall into thorn and thistle-infested ground, and then some fall on nice, good soil. This is very telling of the sinful, human heart and how God penetrates our rocky hard stubborn ways.

Sowing the seed is what's important. Christ the seed-sower shares His presence as the living ancient Word made flesh come into the world.

He spends time near and far with all kinds of people He welcomed with open arms. Christ offers Himself to all regardless of how He's received.

Even though people have read & heard God's Word for centuries

leading up to His birth, still Jesus' coming to teach & heal & save forever changed how God's Kingdom would grow. It's not up to us to figure out HOW the seed will penetrate the hearer, just sow the seeds.

In university years I worked at a K-mart garden shop centre.

My job centered around watering hundreds upon hundreds of flowers, trees and shrubs. My manager told me very clearly, "water as many as you can, cuz you can't save 'em all." That's important. Sharing the seed of God's amazing message of hope is our calling as baptized believers. How it actually takes root and penetrates the human heart is God's work.

You and I can't save 'em all – it's not about you or I saving...anyone.

Its Christ and His Holy Spirit Who brings our witness and our message and He makes sure it impacts the human hearts we encounter.

Last year, Lutheran Hour Ministries funded a BARNA statistics report. 25 years earlier they funded a similar report and now the findings have been compared. The most interesting piece is:

- 25 years ago, over 80 percent of people asked said the CHURCH'S JOB IS TO EVANGELIZE AND BRING THE MESSAGE OF CHRIST TO PEOPLE.
- Now, 25 years later, only 19 percent of people asked believe the CHURCH'S ROLE IS IN SHARING THE MESSAGE OF CHRIST.
- *Reason:* "the local church" is somehow separate from the people who are a part of it or too many personal and cultural barriers to sharing faith.

THAT'S A HUGE DIFFERENCE. The church is no longer seen as relevant in spreading the faith to all others. WOW!

- Careful seeding isn't the answer
- Picking the right soil and the right location isn't the answer
- Good farmers do this
- The church isn't called to farm, JUST SPREAD SEEDS.
- Pastors and people spreading the good news, the gospel truth that God loved the world so much that He gave His only Son to live among us and die to save us from all that harms us.
- That our God loves each one of us so much He forgives us and wants us to be with Him forever and will one day raise us all up from the dead in His new Kingdom.

That's the good news of Jesus Christ. This Gospel seed message might be in words of comfort to someone grieving the death of a loved one.

- It might be in you telling the reason why you believe.
- It might be answering questions about a God Who allows so much destruction in culture, with pandemics, with harmful politics all over the world.
- It might be just giving our time and a listening ear to a person needing hope.

As the church, it's our mission to tell everyone. We need not think its wasteful Or fear rejection or be too concerned that nothing will grow.

God's good seed word of faith seems so insignificant when our problems and the worlds' problems seem so much bigger and more important....

But sharing the message of Christ is just as important for OUR growth as it is for others hearing it. We're transformed by the message we hold dear.

We are built up in the assurance that Christ crucified and risen for the life of the world saves us as it saves the entire world. If we don't share, we don't grow

and others won't see Christ through our lives. The forgiveness we receive gives us a new chance to start over each day with renewed hope and joy. God's kingdom

expands as we tell the story and show His grace. Just throw the gospel around tossing out handfuls of God's love, care & mercy to all who need to hear it and feel it. It will grow. Just as the tree of the cross grows because of Jesus' shed blood.

A living tree whose branches create shelter and healing and rejuvenation.

The bare wood which held Jesus now blossoms large and tall drawing all people from all nations into its foliage. The fruits of His cross we are invited to eat and drink. Holy Communion flows from the cross and the church's calling to make sure Christ is given to all who come in faith. A divine meal celebrating true unity, real fellowship, and a family of faith.

Whether you're male or female, child or student, old, young, middle aged, it's everyone's calling and way of life to daily spread Jesus' seed of hope.

Stepping out of our comfort zones and a stepping into areas where seeds of faith are needed. What a wonderful opportunity we meet a world thirsty for compassion ready for seeds of faith and hope not knowing who to trust

We do. We walk by faith, live in trust, relying upon a God who says just share His grace and He'll take care of the rest.

We can't save 'em all because HE ALREADY HAS.
