The Epistle:2 Corinthians 8: 7-15

[St. Paul writes:] Now as you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in utmost eagerness, and in our love for you—so we want you to excel also in this generous undertaking. I do not say this as a command, but I am testing the genuineness of your love against the earnestness of others. For you know the generous act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich. And in this matter I am giving my advice: it is appropriate for you who began last year not only to do something but even to desire to do something—now finish doing it, so that your eagerness may be matched by completing it according to your means. For if the eagerness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has—not according to what one does not have. I do not mean that there should be relief for others and pressure on you, but it is a question of a fair balance between your present abundance and their need, so that their abundance may be for your need, in order that there may be a fair balance. As it is written, 'The one who had much did not have too much, and the one who had little did not have too little.' This is the Word of the Lord.

The Holy Gospel St. Mark 5: 21-43

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Mark, the 5th chapter:

Glory to You, O Lord.

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a great crowd gathered round him; and he was by the lake. Then one of the leaders of the synagogue named Jairus came and, when he saw him, fell at his feet and begged him repeatedly, 'My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well, and live.' So he went with him. And a large crowd followed him and pressed in on him. Now there was a woman who had been suffering from hemorrhages for twelve years. She had endured much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had; and she was no better, but rather grew worse. She had heard about Jesus, and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, for she said, 'If I but touch his clothes, I will be made well.' Immediately her hemorrhage stopped; and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. Immediately aware that power had gone forth from him, Jesus turned about in the crowd and said, 'Who touched me?' ' He looked all round to see who had done it. But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and trembling, fell down before him, and told him the whole

truth. He said to her, 'Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease.' While he was still speaking, some people came from the leader's house to say, 'Your daughter is dead. Why trouble the teacher any further?' But overhearing what they said, Jesus said to the leader of the synagogue, 'Do not fear, only believe.' He allowed no one to follow him except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they came to the house of the leader of the synagogue, he saw a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. When he had entered, he said to them, 'Why do you make a commotion and weep? The child is not dead but sleeping.' And they laughed at him. Then he put them all outside, and took the child's father and mother and those who were with him, and went in where the child was. He took her by the hand and said to her, 'Talitha cum', which means, 'Little girl, get up!' And immediately the girl got up and began to walk about (she was twelve years of age). At this they were overcome with amazement. He strictly ordered them that no one should know this, and told them to give her something to eat.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.



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REV. TODD HOEFFS PENTECOST 5 Scripture: St. Mark 5ff Title: "Blood, Sweat & Tears" June 27, 2021

We can't escape politics - it's all around us.

The news we see, hear or read is flooded with so many conflicting political interests. When will our border be re-opened? The information on the vaccines...

Fighting among the middle east nations. Tariffs wars and angry words.

So much fear and uncertainty. And it might be this way for a while.

Author Mark Twain once wrote: If you get none of your news from the newspapers, you are uninformed; If you get all of your news from the newspapers, you are misinformed. Such is still true. We need to know but we must keep it in perspective and discern it.

With Canada Day this week, 154 years ago we became a united confederated nation – against the ugly backdrop of the bitter American Civil War.

Much uncertainty reigned in those years, too. Forts, farms and ox carts would give way to modernization. Lots of fear and uncertainty, then, as now. It doesn't really change all that much, does it?!

The Gospel of Jesus Christ has unique power. It speaks to politics & at the same time is above human politics. Jesus' Kingdom is, after all, not of this world.

The Gospel's saving message is so freshly relevant in the midst of anything political and at the same time this message from God desires that all people be saved and come to the knowledge of the true freedom in a crucified Lord.

Politics can be deadly. Most people don't like to talk about it.

Christians may dislike it but....

"politics is whenever you have more than one person in a room." True enough. Mark's Gospel today involves politics.

The nation of Israel tied their religion into their politics.

Many different people wound up on a list of those not loved or favoured by God according to their understanding of God's Law. And if you weren't favoured,

you had a poor standing in the community and most certainly could not enter heaven. Women stood outside the inner circle of Israel's favoured groups.

Wealthy men had the best footing. Poor men less so....then male children, then girls, then non-Jews....then the "sinners".

The long list of those labeled as sinners by the religious elite included the sick. The bleeding woman is considered a sinner because she's unclean.

A feminine bleeding problem for 12 years. That's 4,380 days. We don't know her name. We don't know where she's from. Anonymous; another unclean face in the crowd. We know she's sick, desperate, and in need. In all those 12 years no one has helped her get better. She's spent all she had: time, money, energy.

She's only gotten worse. Day after day, week after week, month after month, year after year it's always the same. Bleeding. Her condition made her religiously unclean to enter any holy sanctuary. She had to live far outside the regular community.

Under Israel's interpretation of the Law, a woman in this state is pronounced ritually unclean which means God couldn't accept her and was subsequently barred from entering any holy space until the blood flow stops. 12 years she had to stay away from any sort of public gathering, [talk about an isolated lockdown....how terrible...] whether it be worship, shopping, celebrations, family get-togethers, her life is a perpetual state of uncleanness. It's more than physical.

By losing blood, she's losing her life, its warmth, vitality, and fruitfulness.

That's a spiritual matter, too. Life and death always are. Placing her at odds with her faith, her family and her community. She has no power, no control, no advocacy. Alone, as good as dead. All of this derives from a misinterpretation of God's Law.

While certain rituals had to keep believers clean to show the world they belonged to God; it was being abused because people in need were refused help.

No one is beyond God's love. The religious leaders let culture and politics and controlling factions dictate how people should be treated. Jesus shows how God's Law must be believed and lived.

He is all about Mercy Compassion Serving Helping....

Jesus is very freeing. His Gospel is freeing. All are welcome. All are loved. All are included in God's grace. As Lutheran Christians we too misread God's Word, His Law, His teaching, because we desperately want to preserve some ideal. Soon legalism takes over. –

WE TEND TO WANT NO BOUNDARIES but create our own personal rules so we can do what we want, and ignore what makes us uncomfortable.

We often convince ourselves that once this or that happens everything will be better. As soon as he changes, as soon as she does what I want,

as soon as the economy gets better,

as soon as I get a new job,

as soon as I have enough money,

as soon as I have more time,

as soon as I get through this project, as soon as

Well, we all have our personal "as soon as" thoughts.

Soon we grow drained of life, just barely going through the motions.

We're alive but not really living. We feel disconnected, isolated, alone.

The bleeding woman ran out of "as soon as" plans.

Today's different. Something's changed. She's heard something about Jesus.

Maybe His teaching, about all the demons He's cast out or the sick people healed, or the storms He's calmed. Whatever she heard about Jesus it's enough to make her believe. She takes a daring, risky leap of faith chance. She's not just a person with a problem, she's someone wanting to get better. She's nowhere else to go, no one else left to turn to, risking getting hurt or abused or killed for polluting a crowd from her uncleanness, she takes matters into her own hands!

Jesus is amazing.

Just gently touch Him, just the outermost hem of his robe, He'll never know, He'll never miss whatever power leaves Him.

She knows Jesus can help just because of Who He is.

Many times, people bumped into Jesus and no doubt never got healed. Crowds elbowed each other all the time, especially traveling in a mob through ancient streets. But this touching is different. Divine power departs from Jesus BECAUSE faith has taken what Jesus freely gives.

Faith ties itself to Jesus, hoping against hope, and won't let go.

Mark choses a word in the Greek for this woman's touching of Jesus' hem which is used to describe the start of a campfire. It sparks, smokes, lights and whose flames blaze up from the wood. New life roaring. Something amazing is happening. Jesus' LIFE is flowing through her life, making her new again! This unknown woman,

whom the crowd would be angry towards, is called "DAUGHTER" by Jesus.

Daughter. God's daughter. Israel's daughter. Our daughter.

Not just another bleeding woman.

The ONLY time anyone in Mark's Gospel is called such. Not only a term of love,

but a lifting up as a holy example of someone who's been made to feel low.

And not only a daughter, but Jesus claims her faith has made her well.

Faith that stopped at nothing to get a little bit of Jesus' Heavenly power,

the only thing that could save her. Her faith made her well.

Jesus' own disciples are never said to have such "faith."

Yet, this anonymous, sick, destitute, unclean, woman has faith.

Now she has an identity, a place, and a relationship.

She has been healed and made whole. Fully alive and free to go in peace.

Jesus will heal others and feel all His divine power leave Him.

At the cross. When He dies on Calvary's hill, HIS HOLY PRECIOUS BLOOD flows from His veins. By bleeding and dying, HE cleanses the world.

All sins are washed away. Sickness is restored. Death is emptied of its scary power. All drained human beings have Jesus' blood pumping through them

by believing that He is the One Who heals all people.

Jesus saves all. And that includes you too. Bringing healing from the sickness of Sin, bringing order to your disordered life. He comes with you in mind.

For the joy of your salvation, He endures the cross, drains His life dry.

Only to fill you all up again in His resurrected glory!

In Baptism He touches you in a way that's even more personal than that encounter on the road with that woman. No, you don't touch His garment. He touches you with baptism. He makes you a son and daughter. His life-blood flows through your lifeblood. You touch His Body and Blood when you hold the piece of Bread and the drink

of Wine. His touch doesn't get more personal than that.

The hem of His robe is nothing compared with His crucified, risen and accessible Flesh and Blood. And it holds the same power of life. Yours to eat and to drink.

There's no medicine in the world like this. We may feel very much like that desperate woman. Helpless, alone, hurting. We may feel that God isn't listening to all those prayers.

We may wonder at times if there even is a God in Heaven when we see how people and communities and nations bicker and fight and kill each other.

We may be tempted to anxiety, worry, despair and live isolated lives.


We need not fear, our faith makes us well. We go in peace.
