



SCRIPTURE

The Old Testament Isaiah 29: 11-19

The vision of all this has become for you like the words of a sealed document. If it is given to those who can read, with the command, 'Read this', they say, 'We cannot, for it is sealed.' And if it is given to those who cannot read, saying, 'Read this', they say, 'We cannot read.' The Lord said: Because these people draw near with their mouths and honour me with their lips, while their hearts are far from me, and their worship of me is a human commandment learned by rote; so I will again do amazing things with this people shocking and amazing. The wisdom of their wise shall perish, and the discernment of the discerning shall be hidden. Ha! You who hide a plan too deep for the Lord, whose deeds are in the dark, and who say, 'Who sees us? Who knows us?' You turn things upside down! Shall the potter be regarded as the clay? Shall the thing made say of its maker, 'He did not make me'; or the thing formed say of the one who formed it, 'He has no understanding'? Shall not Lebanon in a very little while become a fruitful field, and the fruitful field be regarded as a forest? On that day the deaf shall hear the words of a scroll and out of their gloom and darkness the eyes of the blind shall see. The meek shall obtain fresh joy in the Lord, and the neediest people shall exult in the Holy One of Israel. This is the Word of the Lord.

The Epistle: Ephesians 6: 10-20

[St. Paul writes:] Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power. Put on the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to withstand on that evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm. Stand therefore, and fasten the belt of truth around your waist, and put on the breastplate of righteousness. As shoes for your feet put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace. With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to quench all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints. Pray also for me, so that when I speak, a message may be given to me to make known with boldness the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it boldly, as I must speak. This is the Word of the Lord.

The Holy Gospel St. John 6: 56-69

The Holy Gospel, according to St. John, the 6th chapter:

Glory to You, O Lord.

Jesus says: All those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live for ever.' He said these things while he was teaching in the synagogue at Capernaum. When many of his disciples heard it, they said, 'This teaching is difficult; who can accept it?' But Jesus, being aware that his disciples were complaining about it, said to them, 'Does this offend you? Then what if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? It is the spirit that gives life; the flesh is useless. The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life. But among you there are some who do not believe.' For Jesus knew from the first who were the ones that did not believe, and who was the one that would betray him. And he said, 'For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted by the Father.' Because of this many of his disciples turned back and no longer went about with him. So Jesus asked the twelve, 'Do you also wish to go away?' Simon Peter answered him, 'Lord, to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and know that you are the Holy One of God.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to You, O Christ!**



Sermon: St. John 6:56-69

August 22, 2021

Title: "Eating Our Words"

In the name of the Father and of the Son + and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Words. We use them all the time. Conversations have words.

Cards, letters, emails and texts have typed or handwritten words.

My sermon manuscript is full of words. Words get used and abused all the time and have a wide variety of meanings. The internet, Facebook & twitter are filled with words

Sometimes contradictory words creating contradictory thoughts all at the same time.

The right word at the right time can bring great comfort. The wrong word at the wrong time can deliver distress. With our words we make promises, we marry, we encourage, we hurt, we build up, we tear down, we destroy. Meanings of words change all the time.

How often are the words "love" or "happy" thrown around with little or no thought?!

I remember a time in my 1st call out west at a regional Lutheran event.

There was a church meal [which I was very used to] and I called it a "POT-LUCK".

Oh my, the reaction I got from that was so unexpected! LUCK was like a 4 letter curse word! Pot BLESSING was the term I was "expected" to use. But Blessing shouldn't be used as a nice neat little cover word for luck, as if luck is bad. God uses luck just as he would any other aspect of life and time in our lives. BLESSING in scripture isn't even aligned with material or earthly things.

BLESSING is always tied to faith. Faith in Christ is our best gift and only true blessing.

Grace is a blessing. The best we can say about our possessions is a humble gracious Attitude of thankfulness that God enables us to work and earn a living so that we can have material goods in our lives. That doesn't make us blessed But privileged Which means we as stewards of such gifts are expected to understand what we've been given and in turn give and serve all that much more! Which really is the point of the reaction Jesus is expecting from the crowds In Capernaum after being fed with the loaves and fish. Don't strain for the things that die. Yearn for the thing that never dies. Be grateful for what God has given freely. Treasure Jesus as the Living Bread that came down from Heaven. Jesus as the Living Word of God – the word these crowds heard read in their synagogues this living Word in the person of Jesus is God's physical word to them come to deliver

Jesus is connecting the feeding in the wilderness to the future feeding in the pastured fields in Heaven's paradise. Where no one hungers or thirsts any longer. These Words are Spirit and Life. Words of eternal life. Hard words. All who eat his flesh and drink his blood will have a life in Him as He has a life with in us. And that whoever does this will live forever.

These are the difficult, hard, harsh words that even the disciples don't get.

them from all their sins and connect them forever into the Heavenly Kingdom.

Literally, the Greek text has Jesus saying, "Eat me" and you will live. These are shocking words for those followers. Generations had been spent leading up to this day Believing Holding dear God's command not to eat any blood and meat together. Blood represented life. Life needed to be drained Meat sacrificed, Burned, offered, And prepared with this in mind when making meals.

Even the Passover lamb was fully roasted. Gospel writer John here knows exactly what he's doing as he crafts Jesus' words into this good news. Within the religious faith communities as John writes this Lurks people who are teaching that the human body is bad And all anyone should care about is the unseen spiritual realm of life. The human body does evil things, gets sick and dies

So a new philosophy emerged which celebrated the spirit world. So what does John do?

Quotes Jesus saying "eat my flesh and you have life"! Sarx in Greek – the daily basic marketplace word for meat. Which Jesus contrasts with the Flesh of the world

That is of no divine eternal help. Our flesh is polluted with sinfulness. Our flesh is selfish Our flesh desires only for what we want when we want it at all costs, not matter what.

Our flesh as it is can't help us. Our flesh is only of help When Jesus' flesh and Blood is within ours. And this happens when we eat and drink Jesus. Eating flesh and drinking blood though sounds icky, strange, weird, even downright barbaric. Even to us. Jesus gives no way around this either. He's not talking about spiritual eating. Its not a metaphor, or a symbolic ideal. He is purposefully telling us a specific truth.

He makes Himself sound very food-like. Very accessible. Very intimate. that's the heart of it.

God is coming close to us in Christ

In a very personal, internal manner.

This isn't really that NEW either.

This is part of the promise by God in drawing near His people.

Throughout the old testament

Every meal Every piece of manna and quale

And Passover

And sacrifice

And miraculous gift of bread or wine

Or the great banquet Isaiah writes about coming down from heaven

All of this pointed to the day

The Saviour would come down as the Bread feeding the world.

Coming to life in Bethlehem, the House of Bread.

The Bread Jesus gives for the life of the world is His flesh

conceived in the Virgin Mary's womb,

the baby body laid in a manger;

the same flesh nailed to the cross and laid in a tomb

the same flesh raised from the dead

yet new and glorified at the right hand of the Father.

Jesus' flesh and blood coming to us are divine medicine,

the cure for our Sin,

the holy vaccine keeping us safe from evil and all eternal harm.

His flesh bled and died for you:

His life-blood poured out for you and for all,

Creating a new covenant with all who believe in Him,

A baptismal covenant,

signed with His holy, precious blood

and sealed with the Holy Spirit.

Jesus ramps His word up a bit, saying,

"Well, if that teaching is hard and offends you,

what if you see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before?"

If you can't handle this, how will you handle a cross and empty tomb?!

How will you handle it when He must go back to Heaven

and send you the Holy Spirit?

SOME just pick up and go away.

You know, when things start to lose their meaning,

or you don't really feel like you understand,

or its getting too aggravating, it's pretty tempting to just leave, isn't it?

But did you notice what Jesus does when the people leave?

Hmm?

Nothing.

He doesn't do anything.

Why?

Why not just try to make it easier to understand?

Why doesn't Jesus give the people what they want?

Maybe because they don't even know what they want.

Human flesh can't help this.

Jesus is offering HIMSELF for them to eat and drink and live

Just like they ate the bread and fish a few days ago.

If they can't see that for the gift it is,

If they can't trust God in giving them this Saviour in their midst,

Then they have made their choice.

All who come to the Lord are drawn by the Father through faith.

That is all.

Many find it easier walking away.

Thinking a life of faith isn't helping.

The number one reason people leave churches

is because of unresolved angry words of conflict.

Not major fighting,

but the smaller phrases that eat away.

Or when conflict is hidden or stifled.

Only words of reconciliation,

of honest apology,

honest restitution and repentance,

only then words of forgiveness can melt away the angry words.

Jesus gives the crowds freedom to walk away. He welcomes all but not everyone will stay. He won't force anyone. Seems careless, but it's truly freeing. That's the wideness of God's Love. But then Jesus looks at the twelve disciples remaining, and he says, "Do you wish to go away too?" Anyone who has ever been abandoned by their friends or their colleagues, anyone who has suddenly found themselves isolated and alone, knows the depths of Jesus' heart and fear in this very moment. Thankfully, Peter speaks a beautiful word, a line that we say or sing in our Holy Communion liturgy before the Gospel reading: "Alleluia, Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. Alleluia, Alleluia." To whom CAN we go? Only to Christ, For He has come to us.

Even when Jesus' words sound crazy. He has the words of eternal life.

Even when they stretch our reason and imagination to the snapping point,

He has the words of eternal life. No one else does. Even when Jesus' words are hard words

Only He has the words and flesh and blood for eternal life.

And we want eternal life because the benefits of that eternal life are ours now.

The peace we will have for eternity we enjoy now. Along with joy and contentedness

And the forgiveness that heals us and our relationships today As we walk closer and closer to our Heavenly destination. The Word still gives life and meaning;

Baptism still reminds you of your need for grace in your faith life;

Holy Communion places the Flesh and Blood of Jesus into your bodies

And you are His life in the world. Jesus safely hides His flesh and blood in Bread and Wine so that we can dine upon Him in faith and confidence. You are in turn invited to feed others with the same gifts – Offer Jesus to those who cross your path, Not just here in this community

But when you leave this place. You're emptied of your sins and filled up with Christ.

His words become our words. His words in our lives tame our own words.

His life in our lives shapes our choices and work and relationships.

We share in it together. In relationship.

And when it's shared, we live as the flesh and blood body of Christ in the world.

You and I have His WORD on it.
