

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Matthew, the 5<sup>th</sup> chapter:

Glory to You, O Lord.



All Saints Day [observed]
Scripture: 1 John 3: 1-3
"Who In The World Are We?"
November 7, 2021

Message for All Saints Day is from the 1<sup>st</sup> letter of John, chapter 3: "See what Love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God and that is what we are. The reason that the world does not know us is that it did not know Him..."

In the name of the Father and of the Son + and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

All Saints Day is one of the oldest festivals celebrated in the church. Dating back to about 400 AD. Christians saw fit to honour those who died in the faith at the hands of Roman persecutors. The name "saint" is itself a misunderstood word.

This morning I picked up a cup of coffee at the Scott Street Starbucks. "going into work I see Todd?" Yes. What's going on? It's All Saints Day. Do you know about that? "Must be for those who're pretty close to God?!" Well...yes and no. Saints ARE close to God, But not because they're perfect But because they all belong to Him. A saint isn't like ancient art depictions of Peter and Paul with halos around their heads. A saint is anyone who believes in Jesus Christ. A saint is alive or part of the Heavenly Kingdom. And while we may honour those who have died in the faith, We also celebrate our community of the faithful right here. The Church doesn't make saints. God makes saints. God the Father loves us, and in loving us gives us a gift of faith so spectacular, so holy, and so glorious, that it actually makes us His own children of God. He makes us saints And as saints, we get everything Jesus has won -- - holiness, forgiveness and salvation. We are Jesus' witnesses. God adopts us as members of His family in the waters of Baptism. God's Love is defined by making us His children. That's AGAPE love here. A love that gives. A love that sacrifices. A love that protects and shelters and guards. A love that acts for the interests of others. A love that gives up a Son to win back a whole world. Writer John uses KOSMOS in Greek for the term "world". KOSMOS is the entire universe, planets, sun, moon, earth...People, animals, plants, sea life, all things. John also uses KOSMOS for the world that God so loved That He gave up His only Son So that all who believe will not perish but have eternal life. A World which did not know Christ. Though He was in the world, the world received Him not. The world did not take the time to listen and wait for Jesus' appearance. When Jesus became Flesh and dwelled among us, All who received Him by faith God gave power to become His children. This is what Apostle John is talking about here. When we leave the church today And walk back out into a world Does the world still not know us or know God? Do we make a definitive impression on the outside world as believers in Christ? Have we spoken of God Have we let our faith emanate into the work we do, fill the thoughts we have And motivate the kindness we show? In John's day believers had been getting put to death because of their faith. The world sure seemed against them. The world felt unsafe. Jesus died and rose for the world and yet being a believer meant trouble. Even today, It can be very challenging to imitate Christ in all we say and do. When He calls believers blessed in the Sermon on the Mount: Jesus calls us into chasing the truth, being merciful, and making peace. Even on a good day, it's hard to live in hope and show mercy, especially when we get ignored.

I know today there is a lot of worry and fretting over persecution in north America. I hear and read of pastors and people talking about it as if its happening And we must go underground, preserve what we have and hide out. I'm not fully sure why one would look for this? It unfortunately distracts all of us from seeing things as they really are. That persecution for the faith comes from other believers, From factions that have grown cold toward peoples' needs; That apathy and laziness and fear is persecuting us, and has been for decades. In my life time, I've seen very little if any mistreatment for being a Christian, But I have seen many, many believers mistreat others, especially those struggling

With doubts and hurts and differences. Perhaps aspects of the church as a global body has become more like the world Which does not know God nor the Gospel of Christ any longer? We forget we're saints and we still seek to not only figure God out But to be better than He is, That we can somehow know what's best for us. It's an identity crisis. We are God's children. But we don't know what that looks like. It's easy acting like we're in the dark when we can't see what being a saint looks like. We are in the dark. Sinful shadows hide away our hearts farther away from our belovedness in God. But this sinfulness, this darkness, this identity crisis, isn't the whole picture. We walk by faith not by sight. And we walk as God's children, Which is walking in the light. We are saints, we are believers, we are baptized into Christ. That is our identity That is who we are And we don't have to worry or search or seek out any other way forward. That trusting completely in Jesus Christ. And when trusting, we are hoping, and loving, and caring, and living in peace. This is what we are made for. Or better still, what we have been re-made for, Re-shaped and retooled more and more into the image of Jesus' face. We know what our Father in Heaven has done to us: We know that the life He intends for us is loving and saving and blessing and forgiving and merciful, and we even if [or when] we suffer. Jesus has our back, Jesus protects us Because He has laid down His life for us to make us His Father's children again. All that could keep us away Has been washed away in Jesus' shed Blood The perfect Holy Son Became a dirty crook And made each one of us And the world itself, Filled with dirty sins, Holy and righteous and justified in God's eyes For He sees each of us through the beams of the cross. And so now we are right up there close to God. We are in His Kingdom as fellow inheritors of an eternal place. And we will one day see this for what it is. When Christ reappears on the Last Day. Then it will all make sense. Because this end times justice belongs to Jesus. You and I can be compassionate now.

This is what a saint does in the world. To help, to forgive, to be full of mercy, to rest and rejoice and grow in AGAPE giving love that has saved us and cleansed us and made us children of God. Until the day the whole world gets to see Jesus for Who He is, We are Jesus' face and hands and mouth and feet in the world. The world will see Jesus by what we do and say. Every one of us here this morning has a story to share. How a life which shows a little wear and tear from trials and struggles Can still praise God and draw strength from Him, Who has adopted us into a family that is eternal. That makes our work not so burdensome, Because what we toil and sweat over is truly guarded in the Heavenly Kingdom. That makes peace making and peace keeping not only a necessity but a joy. To push back against evil [even when its out own evil] And draw closer through the Spirit into Jesus' Body. Today, as our heart may hurt in the absence of those we have lost and those we miss so dearly, we remember that God doesn't promise to remove our grief from our lives but rather He transforms it. He turns our tears of hurt into tears of compassion As we use our gifts to transform the very KOSMOS world we live in. Eventually, with time, we may see how those we encounter changed us and blessed us even as we helped change and bless them. Despite the chaos of our lives, we come together in the church, in community. When we walk up here together, Eating Jesus' Body, drinking Jesus' Blood, we commune together not only with each other but with all those wonderful people who've gone to Heaven before us now at rest with Jesus. It is through this entire communion of saints that we face the world. We are not alone. Christ is with us Christ is in us And the communion of saints Join us in our worship every time we join together our earthly voices. So yes, being a saint does mean we're pretty close to God. And we may begin to trust and treasure, just how deeply we are known and loved by God. And that in the activity we attempt to do, We will be a real AGAPE loving serving help for those who need it. The world which does not always know us Even the church that doesn't always know us Will no longer expect fear Or wish to hide But embrace a way forward As believers As children of God.

For that is what we are. Amen.
