

ORDER OF HOLY BAPTISM

The Lutheran Church of Australia Worship Resources

SCRIPTURAL COMMAND:

Our Lord Jesus Christ says: All authority in Heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to keep everything I have entrusted to you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.

ADDRESS:

Scripture teaches that we are born sinful and unclean. So our heavenly Father washes us clean in the waters of baptism. We are re-born as His children as the Holy Spirit renews us and gives us eternal life. Through baptism He graciously forgives us our sins and unites us with our Lord Jesus Christ, so that we share in His death and resurrection.

PRESENTATION:

Who brings this child for holy baptism? **I/we do.** How is this child named? (Name is spoken)

ADMONITION:

Since you as parents and sponsors have brought (Name) to be baptized, you are responsible for his/her upbringing in the Lutheran Church. Remember him/her in your prayers. Bring him/her to the services in God's House and teach him/her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed and the Ten Commandments. Remind him/her of her baptism, set him/her a good example, and provide for his/her instruction in the faith that he/she may join you and all believers around the Lord's Table to feast on Jesus' Body and Blood. REV. TODD HOEFFS Christ the King Sunday Scripture: Mark 13:24-27 November 21, 2021

I like staying up late. Watch TV. Do a bit of relaxation reading. Pray.

Sometimes do some left over work. I can often do my best thinking late at night. No matter how stressful a day in ministry has ever been, I've yet [in 23 years] to ever miss a meal or lose a night's sleep. I'd have trouble being awake and ready. Once I fall asleep I am out so soundly even a fire alarm won't wake me. Sleep is important. Experts say that the average adult needs somewhere between 7 and 9 hours of sleep per night. And yet Jesus says "Keep awake".

Countless demands can take away from our sleep—sick children, dirty dishes, a nagging

Countless demands can take away from our sleep—sick children, dirty dishes, a nagging assignment for work, an overdue bill. And yet, to a certain extent, our response is a matter of life choices.

To make ends meet some people are forced to work 2-3 different jobs. That leaves little time for rest or sleep. Transient people often have no real place to live. Imagine how difficult it would be for them to actually sleep. In the Biblical days, economic class and status affected sleep patterns. The wealthy, the influential and respected religious leaders all had the privilege and the means To live well, eat well, and have lavish bedrooms for sleep. In Jesus' parable it's the slaves and the doorkeeper of the home who are adamantly told to stay awake. Their existence is subjected to the whims of the master's return. Household slaves were expected to be awake first to prepare breakfast for their master and were the last to go to sleep. They made sure the house remained in proper order before they slept. Field laborers were expected to be out and at work at the crack of dawn. Only those of us who have enough sleep to "spare" can be alert---Jesus is leveling the playing field.

In the kingdoms of this world, many privileged people have the advantage—a nice place to sleep, well-rested bodies, and all that goes along with this—but in God's Kingdom each person is given the same belief system. Demanding to be in the "know", For any disciple to expect to know the day, hour and time For the end to come, Is expecting God to treat them as elitists. Jesus simply tells them, "But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father" (Mark 13:32). Being a follower of Jesus means you are part of His Kingdom. A kingdom which is not marked by strict details about the end of the world. It's a kingdom surviving on trust in God for all things. Trust that the days are in His hands, that He has the total number of days planned out.

While we may crave sleep. What we need it rest. While we want to know all the answers, What we need is a working knowledge of God's promises fulfilled. While we want to be ready, What we need is an attitude [heart] of being prepared. For anything. Any time Any hour. Jesus is clear: "In those days ... the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken." These are Jesus words to his disciples in the glow of the grand temple walls. A change is coming. The temple of the disciple's lives is soon coming down. A temple not built by stones, A temple built from the seed of the Holy Spirit in the Virgin Mary. He is the Light of Life soon to be snuffed out in brutality and crucifixion. How will we find anyone find their way forward when the Son of God Who illumined our path no longer shines and guides? What do we do when it feels as if everything around us is falling apart? So often it looks like darkness is our only companion and God is nowhere to be seen. When Jesus himself—the very one who is coming—does not know the day or the hour, the privilege and power that comes with such insider information is dismantled. Not knowing when the master will return, the wealthy could send their slaves to watch for the master's return, but the result is that the slaves receive the Kingdom and not the masters. If anyone is so tied to the need to sleep their way to the end of life, They fail at being "alert". (Mark 13:33). The truth is that although we do not all have equal access to sleep, we all must sleep. The question is—what kind of

rest do we need? And what do we do *when we're awake*? Jesus isn't saying live your lives away 24/7. God created the Sabbath for rest for a purpose: A day would be set aside to worship the Lord. Many times you can sleep but not feel rested. So spending your time trying to rest without worshiping the Lord in His Church, You may find no rest at all. This is still the time Jesus calls the "birth pangs."

Its but the beginning. Don't just look around and point out all the ways the world around us fails. Point out how we all can work to ease the suffering that other's endure. Time is wasted competing, predicting, convincing, spinning our wheels getting stuck on our own sinful judgements while ignoring the real rigorous work needed in our own selves. Trying to be the "best" or the "most ready" for his coming won't help. No, we only remain alert for the best who is coming into our midst. Just as our households need renovation and de-cluttering, So our hearts and lives need to be renovated and de-cluttered of sin, selfishness and the barriers we build to keep others away. By resting in Jesus, we remain alert to the people and the needs around us. Indeed, we grow alert to the presence of the "Son of Man" (Mark 13:26) in our midst. The dark times of life are threshold moments.

The temptation is to do something; to fix it, to ease the pain, to escape the uncertainly, and to get back to what used to be. We can never go back. God does not undo our life. God redeems our life. The presence of Christ is the ultimate answer to every prayer, to every light extinguishing loss, to every season of our life. The signs that the Son of Man is near will neither be brilliant nor frightening natural phenomena, but rather the care and acceptance of one of God's children for another. All of God's people *do* have access to a full night's sleep so that when we respond to Christ's coming we might all be alert and awake. Perhaps Christ is calling us to truly recognize one another before we will be able to recognize God in our midst. We've experienced losses. We moved cross country in a pandemic. There's lots of loss with that life-change. We all have some idea of what it is like to enter the darkness of change. It brings some kind of loss. It may be the loss of a relationship, the loss of a loved one, the loss of what is comfortable, familiar, safe. Regardless, the world as we have known it has ended. And when all the things look like the end is close, Jesus says, remember the fig tree.

When its branch becomes soft and it puts forth leaves you know summer is near. So also when the darkness overtakes your life know that the Son of Man is near. Jesus gives the sign of life. Just as He called the wars and disasters of this age the "birth pangs," so He compares these cosmic signs to the budding fig tree of spring. Again life is the theme. The destruction of the heavens and the earth is a sign of life! Because in the dark destructive falling apart is the knitting together of the new heavens and the new earth promised. Christ's presence for our renewal and our salvation always takes place in the dark and messy parts of life. We have not and never will be abandoned to the darkness. Christ is not only warning us with alertness, But is offering rest so that we remain alert and awake. Darkness is not our enemy as much as is falling asleep. We fall asleep whenever fear controls or life, when hope gives way to despair, when busyness is equated with goodness, when entitlement replaces thanksgiving, when we choose what is comfortable rather than life-giving. So we close our eyes. We fall asleep and we become part of the darkness. We refuse to see the One who is always coming to us. The danger in the darkness is that we do not give out eyes time to adjust. We can trust in the Coming One more than the darkness. We can rest, watch, watch and wait.

That is contrary to what most of the world believes and what our society rewards. With Christ living in our newly renovated hearts, we show up every moment of our lives representing Him. The Spirit moves our feet along that we can show up and be present in the darkness of life, is some of the hardest work we will ever do. As much as Jesus is Light He is also most present in our darkness. Because He entered into the darkness to battle sin, death and Satan. All these things Jesus predicts took place already. There was darkness and earthquake and even a resurrection when Jesus died on the cross. That, in a very real sense, was the end of the world as we know it.

Jesus embodied the whole world, the cosmos, in his own body, and so when He died, the world, for all intents and purposes ended. You've been baptized into the death of Jesus. His good Friday has become your last day. You've died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. Already, now. And we see now a redeemed world, Even as we look at each other as redeemed in Jesus' Blood. And one day we will see a new world. The Last Day end of all things will be a day of gathering, as the angels gather Christ's elect, His baptized believers, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven. It's a Day of reunion with the saints who have gone before us, a day of gathering the scattered church, a day of making one what now appears to be fragmented and hopelessly scattered.

As everything in this world falls apart, the church is brought together. We might be scattered, We might not look holy or brave We might not look united as a family, We move slower, we listen more than we speak, we know questions rather than answers. We wait expectantly but without specific expectations. Waiting in this ever is faithfulness and surrender to the Coming One, because in our waiting we are alert. We are present in the moment, Not reading the signs but trusting in God Who has it all in His hands.

We then will see the face of Christ in the tired mother wrangling little ones through the big-box store. We will witness Christ's love in a simple and random act of kindness on a busy street.

We will see and experience Jesus in the beloved community gathered to worship and feast at Holy Communion.

The time we do have is now.

Sleep and rest.

Rest in Christ.

Be ready and alert

A real wake-up call.
