

Kareem and Family

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, as I write this note of update it is exactly one year ago today that we were notified of the Approval of Sponsorship for AL HUMAIDI, Kareem Abadi and given a G application number from Immigration, Refugees, and Citizenship Canada. We all had high hopes that the process would only take one year. However, Covid effected it as everything in our community and world-wide. I contacted my MPP Vance Badawey after returning from my trip to Athens to visit Kareem and his family. Unfortunately, the Immigration and Refugee ministry had to lend employees to Canada Revenue Agency to pay out all the CERB money. It has just been this fall that the refugee ministry is starting to process applications, and of course the whole Afghan situation has complicated the process even further. I checked online and found that Kareem's file was still on hold waiting to be processed. I am in contact with Kareem and his family on a regular basis and we video call from time to time. It was just last December 24, 2020 that the family was moved to

the apartment building in Athens. Three families are living in a 3 bedroom apartment. There is a possibility that the family may have to move again. I would ask that you keep them in prayer that they would be able to remain where they are at present. We thank God for keeping them safe and in a clean apartment this past year. Ameer turned 4 on November 15th, and Asser will turn 2 on January 9, 2022. At the present time there is a balance of \$17,334.03 in the Refugee Settlement Fund, there were a few disbursements last year for translation services. When I preached at Clarington Lutheran Church in Bowmanville on November 21st, and told them about Kareem and his family there was interest in contributing towards our Refugee Fund. This is all the news I have to date. Please continue to pray for Kareem, Hamida, Ameer, and Asser, that despite the Refugee Ministry being overwhelmed that some how they will process the application for Kareem and his family before another year goes by. Just as we waited for an answer to our prayers for bringing us Pastor Todd, we pray in God's good timing he will bring Kareem and his family here for us to reach out to them with God's amazing grace and love.

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REV. TODD HOEFFS ADVENT 4 (series C) Scripture: Micah 5:2-4 December 19, 2021 F, S + HS. Amen.

My 1st Christmas away from my [1st home of origin] was spent as a Seminary student in Regina, SK. I was assigned there as a vicar [student pastor in training.] Growing up in Western NY, I never even heard of this place. Just another dot on a map. Certainly the song "No place like Home for the Holidays" took on a different meaning. In Regina, I was on my own. My new church family, my supervising pastor's family and my soon to be family through marriage all made me feel "at home". God's hand was in it. Back in my hometown family roots, already the relatives I grew up with were growing old and had been slowly dying year by year as our family Christmases began to change. Faces were missing around the dinner table. God was getting me ready [and my relatives ready] to say goodbye to one family and embrace another. And in this lesson, God taught me that home isn't always a place but THE PEOPLE you are with. The love of family makes a home. The love of God makes believers around the world into a family. Prophet Micah witnessed the family of believers in the people of Israel change. Micah lived most of his life in a rural setting, however, prophesied primarily against Jerusalem. He condemned God's children because of dishonesty in the marketplace and corruption in their governing. He warned of future destruction if ways and hearts were not turned toward God. And in Micah's words heard this day, he says Bethlehem [NOT JERUSALEM] will be the place of God's Son to appear. Bethlehem seemed like an unlikely home for the promised Saviour. A suburb of sorts in relation to the big city of Jerusalem. 8 kilometers away. Bethlehem Ephratha is in the vicinity of this landscape. Ephrathah was originally a small Jewish clan of Benjamin within the nation of Israel. Making this area really of no great importance or power in terms of politics, military status, arts and culture. Small, hidden, insignificant Bethlehem originally belonged to the Canaanites. They lived in regions now known as Lebanon, Jordan and Palestine. They were a mix of Jewish, Egyptian and Phoenician, worshipping various gods but not the one true God of Israel. Originally, Bethlehem's name meant "the house or sanctuary city of Lahum." "Lahum" was the Canaanite's god of war. "After the conquest of Palestine, the Jews changed the name Laham to make it read lehem which means "Bread."-So Bethlehem the city of David, became the "house of bread." Its significant that Jesus is born in Bethlehem, the "House of Bread'. This place held the answer to mankind's deepest need – to be fed by God, on the bread of eternal life. Where one eats of Him and never hungers again. For Jesus comes to feeds us on the love of God. Love which feeds the hope for this world. We also know that by God's promise to the prophet Samuel, a long time before the prophet Micah. God told him to enter Bethlehem and find a king. God had chosen a new king to replace Saul.

Samuel obeyed the Lord and went to Bethlehem to the family of Jesse. Jesse made his 10 sons walk past Samuel so he could find the one that the Lord had chosen to be King of the whole nation. There was one of Jesse's sons missing that day. He was out in the field keeping the sheep. Samuel didn't find God's anointed king among the 10 big brothers. But when the youngest came in hot and sweaty from being out with the sheep all day, he was anointed to be king of Israel. His name was David and all of this happened in little Bethlehem (1 Samuel 16).

God chooses what seems small to accomplish his big things.

David became the greatest King, not in wealth, power or world status – his son Solomon really reached those pinnacles. David became King and was a "man after God's own heart". He sinned greatly but repented often and he put his trust in the Lord for his life.

The truly great and extraordinary king has been promised and is coming into the world. This ultimate Power and Life from ancient days has come into the world in the same way that we human, limited, finite, fragile people all came into the world. God keeps his promises for 1000 years and turns up in a way that is everything opposite to what we might want him to be.

Our God has always been creating His plans in small, seemingly insignificant ways. Patriarch Moses was a reluctant leader. Think of the other prophets; Elijah, Ezekiel, Jeremiah, Isaiah, Micah – all lived in weakness and powerlessness. Or David – chosen so young, making so many mistakes, always forgiven. Think of Elizabeth and Mary – an older woman bearing John the last prophet and a young girl who would carry the Christ child, the hope for her and all generations!

Think of yourself. Your home of origin. Your faith in Christ given in baptism. What's so great about us that we should be chosen to receive God's grace and be here in this place? God with us in the form of Christ with the Holy Spirit makes us great. Great in God's Kingdom. It is by His Word of assurance that get the privileged to sit at Jesus' Table and receive his Bread of Life and Wine of love. God chooses weak people, sinning people, careless people: all the "wrong" people to be with him. The disciples. The tax collectors and sinners He ate with a visited, sharing His holy presence. Thanks be to God! For we now have life and a future in God's work of gathering all people into his family. Even the wise men came to Israel after their long journey from the East they didn't go to Bethlehem. They headed straight for Jerusalem – the big city and the bright lights. The holy city where the huge and awe inspiring temple stood, where the holy sacrifices were offered up to God. At times we miss out on Jesus because we assume he'll show up in big ways or in triumphant times or arrive when we think He better show up. But that's not for us to decide. It's for us to trust that He comes in His own way and time and will work through the people He's given us in our lives. For the answer to our deepest needs is found in the manger in Bethlehem, and not in the magnificent Temple in Jerusalem. Jesus is found down the street, in a manger, where animals live

magnificent Temple in Jerusalem. Jesus is found down the street, in a manger, where animals live and feed. In small Bethlehem. It's this humbled Jesus who later goes through the horrific suffering and death so we can live forever with hearts of peace and contentment. The manger isn't far from the cross. Any more than our suffering is far from God's sight or control. The Holy Spirit knows our needs and leads us to Jesus Table where he offers us His very own living bread from heaven, which unites us with His Body and every believer around the world.

In the quiet of home where we enjoy our bread in peace – along with platefuls of other food – we might tend to forget that Jesus has come to be with us. The living Jesus is in the bread and wine in Holy Communion so that he can come into us and live in us in our humble little homes. His Word is food for our souls when we read the Scriptures in the peace and quiet of our homes. Our homes can be the Bethlehem where we feed on the Bread of eternal life.

And so our future as God's family community in this little corner of the earth is secure. God has not stopped working with us and through us. Jesus remains the bread of life Who feeds and the shepherd who stands and protects us with his love, grace, peace and power; as he shapes our minds and hearts so that the word we speak and the action we take reflects the Christ of the Scriptures to the world around us.

Like the people of Micah's day, we wait for his coming. Like a pregnant Mary, we wait for the coming of the world's King, the Saviour Who fights using a manger and a cross, to secure our future as His forgiven brothers and sisters. Who has made His home little Bethlehem and makes into a family whenever 2 or 3 gather together in His holy name. Micah waited. We wait. In faith. In hope. In expectation that our God will work through our humble faithful witness. For Jesus will be the lasting peace in our lives and in our world. We wait in the struggle with joy at the news we have heard and upon which we pin our lives, and live as a family who trusts and hopes.

A wise old pastor and servant of the early days of the church, helping the downtrodden and lowly once said: if you can't find Jesus in the person of need around your door, then you will not find Jesus in the Communion Cup either.
