THE WORD

Old Testament: *Nehemiah 8: 1-3, 5-6, 8-10*

All the people gathered together into the square before the Water Gate. They told the scribe Ezra to bring the book of the law of Moses, which the LORD had given to Israel. Accordingly, the priest Ezra brought the law before the assembly, both men and women and all who could hear with understanding. This was on the first day of the seventh month. He read from it facing the square before the Water Gate from early morning until midday, in the presence of the men and the women and those who could understand; and the ears of all the people were attentive to the book of the law. And Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people, for he was standing above all the people; and when he opened it, all the people stood up. Then Ezra blessed the LORD, the great God, and all the people answered, 'Amen, Amen', lifting up their hands. Then they bowed their heads and worshipped the LORD with their faces to the ground. So they read from the book, from the law of God, with interpretation. They gave the sense, so that the people understood the reading. And Nehemiah, who was the governor, and Ezra the priest and scribe, and the Levites who taught the people said to all the people, 'This day is holy to the LORD your God; do not mourn or weep.' For all the people wept when they heard the words of the law. Then he said to them, 'Go your way, eat the fat and drink sweet wine and send portions of them to those for whom nothing is prepared, for this day is holy to our LORD; and do not be grieved, for the joy of the LORD is your strength.'

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

The Epistle: 1 Corinthians 12: 12-31a

[St. Paul writes]: For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body. though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot were to say, 'Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body, that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear were to say, 'Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body', that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many members, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, 'I have no need of you', nor again the head to the feet, 'I have no need of you.' On the contrary, the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and those members of the body that we think less honourable we clothe with greater honour, and our less respectable members are treated with greater respect; whereas our more respectable members do not need this. But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honour to the inferior member, that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is

honoured, all rejoice together with it. Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers; then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kinds of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? Do all possess gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret? But strive for the greater gifts. And I will show you a still more excellent way. This is the Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

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The Holy Gospel: St. Luke 4: 14-21

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Luke, the 4th chapter:

Glory to You, O Lord.

Then Jesus, filled with the power of the Spirit, returned to Galilee, and a report about him spread through all the surrounding country. He began to teach in their synagogues and was praised by everyone. When Jesus came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written: 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.' And he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. The eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to say to them, 'Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.




THE LORD'S PRAYER:





THE WORD

Old Testament: *Nehemiah 8: 1-3, 5-6, 8-10*

All the people gathered together into the square before the Water Gate. They told the scribe Ezra to bring the book of the law of Moses, which the LORD had given to Israel. Accordingly, the priest Ezra brought the law before the assembly, both men and women and all who could hear with understanding. This was on the first day of the seventh month. He read from it facing the square before the Water Gate from early morning until midday, in the presence of the men and the women and those who could understand; and the ears of all the people were attentive to the book of the law. And Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people, for he was standing above all the people; and when he opened it, all the people stood up. Then Ezra blessed the LORD, the great God, and all the people answered, 'Amen, Amen', lifting up their hands. Then they bowed their heads and worshipped the LORD with their faces to the ground. So they read from the book, from the law of God, with interpretation. They gave the

sense, so that the people understood the reading. And Nehemiah, who was the governor, and Ezra the priest and scribe, and the Levites who taught the people said to all the people, 'This day is holy to the LORD your God; do not mourn or weep.' For all the people wept when they heard the words of the law. Then he said to them, 'Go your way, eat the fat and drink sweet wine and send portions of them to those for whom nothing is prepared, for this day is holy to our LORD; and do not be grieved, for the joy of the LORD is your strength.'

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

The Epistle: 1 Corinthians 12: 12-31a

[St. Paul writes]: For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot were to say, 'Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body', that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear were to say, 'Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body', that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many members, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, 'I have no need of you', nor again the head to the feet, 'I have no need of you.' On the contrary, the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and those members of the body that we think less honourable we clothe with greater honour, and our less respectable members are treated with greater respect; whereas our more respectable members do not need this. But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honour to the inferior member, that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honoured, all rejoice together with it. Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers; then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kinds of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? Do all possess gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret? But strive for the greater gifts. And I will show you a still more excellent way. This is the Word of the Lord.







Scripture: St. Luke 4:14-20

January 23, 2022

Words matter. No matter what people say!

Nearly 2 years ago, I remember when the pandemic started. I was still in Winnipeg. We had a crazy rush on groceries [and toilet paper]. I still remember one of the hand written store signs posted on the shelves -1^{st} time I ever saw such a thing: "Please take only one per customer, think of our more vulnerable people". Not sure if people respected those words...shelves were empty for a long time. There was a time when words meant everything. Then a time where actions speak louder than words. Now, words matter a bit more again because we've been so restricted and isolated, we aren't seeing people take action much right now. Truth be told, words AND actions matter. Like Jesus.

His words matter. They matter in the synagogue where he once worshipped as a boy and now returns as a young man. The newly baptized Jesus of Nazareth, in his hometown. At first everyone speaks well of him.

But He doesn't hold their approval very long. People often fail to turn amazement into gratitude. Jesus IS the Word He speaks. That's frightening. Change is something people say they want but really don't. Jesus is up against a difficult time in Galilee. Poverty is pandemic. Roman military occupation leaves many angry and hopeless. Religious fanaticism turns zealously violent, and end times visions are the conspiracy theories of the day. So Jesus invites people to celebrate the Lord's Liberation The Old Testament Jubilee!

Outlined in Leviticus 25: every 50 years (7x7+1=50) the land rests (no tilling or planting), foreclosed property is returned to the original family that owned it, all slaves get set free, and all debts forgiven. Sadly, Israel rarely if ever practiced the Jubilee Year. Setting people free from cultural and financial shackles took aware the control Israel needed to hold under Roman rule. For Jesus, divine liberation will create social healing, which jumpstarts the draw for all people into His Heavenly Kingdom. Just like the prayer He gives us: "Forgive us our debts as we forgive those in debt to us" (Matt 6:12). By stepping up to read, Jesus starts in motion the power of His Words. Words WITH action. Taking the scroll handed to Him.

Reading portions from Isaiah 61 & 58;

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to preach good news to the poor...freedom for prisoners...sight for the blind...release for the oppressed...and proclaim the [Jubilee] year of God's favor" (Luke 4:18-19).

These sound like wonderful words.

Yes, bless the poor and bring sight to the blind! Great work indeed.

But then Jesus says:

"Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing!"

Even better news! Change is on the way today, not just somewhere on the horizon. Which means everyone who hears these words of truth Will have to act. After all, we dare not be confronted with the truth and go on living as though the truth doesn't make a difference.

The religious people in the synagogue on the day Jesus read from Isaiah also liked scripture; at least, they liked the idea of scripture. They liked being seen reading or listening to scripture. It made them feel better and made them look righteous. Rules and order are easy to trust. Laws are enforceable. Good news is not. It spreads uncontrollably. Freedom and release and forgiveness seem to good to be true --- And cost us all something we might hold dear. Can we practice the Lord's Liberating

Word in our time of a pandemic? We've worshiped and tasted and benefited from God's grace; will the kingdom of God be within us too?

For all of us now, in this life, things are continually falling apart. The core of what nations are building with human pride and ambition never holds. It was true in Isaiah's day, it was true in Jesus' time, and it is true in ours. Things in life are always falling apart, from crumbling walls to erosion of values, Another day closer to the final end. Are you and I going to live on the basis of everything being horrible and the only future you have is bleak? Are you and I going to make the assumption that the world is going down the drain and there's nothing you can do anyways? Then you and I will be dominated by fear, despair, and anger. Or are you and I going to live in Isaiah's Word and Jesus' Word of promise that He sets in motion by actively dying and rising anew!? In other words, will we keep on living by faith. Then courage, endurance, resolution, hope, and compassion will open up to us.

Maybe Jesus' Words DO matter because He has lived them. They're a done deal.

Release means the world to a people chained to sin, Satan and eternal pain.

Countless marginalized folks struggled under debt payment, physical illness or oppressed by demons, and all got excluded from the religious community. Freedom here involves a total break of the chains which lock people down To all the things that harm us.

Our own selves. Stress. Demands. Frustrations. Pains, illnesses, cares.

Starts with the gift of forgiveness – release from our own sins and the sins others afflict onto us.

All of us here harbor some form of hatred against another person or group of people.

Know and trust that God has forgiven you all your wrongs. That strength makes it possible (not easy, but possible) to forgive even those people who have not sought your forgiveness, even those people who insist they're right and you're wrong. By forgiving others we heal the wounds in our soul and continue the chain-reaction of grace that began with God's promise of forgiveness for all people. And who doesn't need some form of healing? Blind eyes can be opened to see many things. Not only the physical world, but the Spiritual world. The world of God and grace and freedom. The world of actions following words. Every one of us can be an avenue of healing. With Kindness, as we daily meet people in need of mental, emotional and soul healing. We can encourage and develop a place of welcome and acceptance So that all people can receive the grace and mercy of our God as we experience. This is how people heal and grow and live transformed lives. Proclaim the year of the Lord's favor...yes, now, more than ever. Isolated folks need to hear that they're loved and worthy of love. Things won't fill any voids. So many people live without any understanding that they're loved. But it's not true. God loves them. They too have a place here, at Jesus' table. They, too, have a welcomed invitation to eat and drink with our God. For this Feast today celebrates the completeness of Jesus' words and work. He has fulfilled all of Scripture. The plain truth hanging life-less on the cross where hatred for Jesus' Word and Action Met their end. And in their ending, In Jesus' bloody finishing, Is completeness for you, me and our world.

Complete and fulfilled love,

And freedom

And sight

And release.

Free in the Spirit to live as Christ. Where word and action matter.

Jesus' Word is fulfilled in the active choices we make and the way we serve and love our neighbour. It gives us Spirit-driven power to be the church Jesus calls us to be – to be the people Jesus calls us to be.

In the way we speak And in what we show.

This is life changing.

This is Christ

Fulfilling His Word and Work in Your hearing.
