

ORDER OF HOLY BAPTISM

The Lutheran Church of Australia Worship Resources

SCRIPTURAL COMMAND:

Our Lord Jesus Christ says: All authority in Heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to keep everything I have entrusted to you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age. Through baptism God graciously forgives us our sins and unites us with our Lord Jesus Christ, so that we share in His death and resurrection.

GOSPEL ADDRESS

As people brought children to Jesus that He might touch them, the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this He was extremely angry. He said: Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them, because the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. I tell you the truth; unless you receive the Kingdom of God like a little child you shall never enter it.

PRESENTATION:

Who brings this child for holy baptism? **I/we do.** How is this child named? (Name is spoken)

ADMONITION:

Since you as parents and sponsors have brought (Name) to be baptized, you are responsible for his/her upbringing in the Lutheran Church. Remember him/her in your prayers. Bring him/her to the services in God's House and teach him/her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed and the Ten Commandments. Remind him/her of her baptism, set him/her a good example, and provide for his/her instruction in the faith that he/she may join you and all believers around the Lord's Table to feast on Jesus' Body and Blood. Do you intend to joyfully do this?

Yes, I/we do.

MARKING OF THE CROSS:

(Name), receive the sign of the holy cross †, upon your forehead and upon your heart, to mark you as one redeemed by Christ the crucified.

THE LORD'SPRAYER:

Let us ask the blessing of our Lord Jesus Christ on (Name) and pray together the prayer He has taught us:

Our Father, Who art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil; for Thine is the Kingdom, and the power and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

PUBLIC CONFESSION OF THE FAITH:

I ask you now to publicly speak your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the Church, the faith in which we baptize.

Do you renounce the devil and all his works and all his ways?

Yes, I do renounce them.

Do you believe in God, the Father almighty?

Yes, I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of Heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord?

Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into Heaven, and sits at the right hand of God, the Father almighty, from thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the + life everlasting. Amen.

BAPTISM:

(Name), I baptize you in the name of the Father † and of the Son † and of the Holy Spirit †. Amen. May God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who has given you the new birth by water and the Spirit and has forgiven you all your sins, strengthen you with His Spirit, so that you receive eternal life. **Amen.**

PRESENTATION OF CANDLE:

Receive this burning light. Live always by the Light of Christ and be ever watchful for His coming that you may meet Him with joy and enter with Him to the Marriage Feast of the Lamb in His Kingdom, which has no end.

Let your light so shine before others, that they see your good works and glorify Your Father Who is in Heaven.

PRAYER:

Heavenly Father, we join with (Name's) parents in thanking you for giving them this child and for adopting him/her as Your own child in holy baptism. Strengthen him/her faith by Your Holy Spirit, so that his/her sinful self may die each day and he/she may rise to new life with Christ forever. As You have written his/her name in the book of life and have made him/her a member of the body of Your Son, guide him/her, so that, with all Your saints, he/she may one day abide in Your Heavenly Home; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

PRESENTATION OF BAPTIZED:

Through Baptism, God has added this new brother/sister a member of the Priesthood we all share in Christ Jesus, that we may proclaim the praise of God and show forth His creative and redeeming Word to all the world:

We welcome you into the Lord's family. We receive you as fellow members of the body of Christ, children of the same Heavenly Father, and workers with us in His Kingdom.

The peace of the Lord be with you always. And also with you.

But the LORD said to me, 'Do not say, "I am only a boy"; for you shall go to all to whom I send you, and you shall speak whatever I command you. 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The Epistle: 1 Corinthians 13:1-13

[St. Paul writes:] If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing. Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrong doing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love. This is the Word of the Lord.

The Holy Gospel: St. Luke 4: 21-30

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Luke, the 4th chapter:

Glory to You, O Lord.

Then Jesus began to say to them, 'Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.' All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. They said, 'Is not this Joseph's son?' He said to them, 'Doubtless you will quote to me this proverb, "Doctor, cure yourself!" And you will say, "Do here also in your home town the things that we have heard you did at Capernaum." 'And he said, 'Truly I tell you, no prophet is accepted in the prophet's home town. But the truth is, there were many widows in Israel in the time of Elijah, when the heaven was shut up for three years and six months, and there was a severe famine over all the land; yet Elijah was sent to none of them except to a widow at Zarephath in Sidon. There were also many lepers in Israel in the time of the prophet Elisha, and none of them was cleansed except Naaman the Syrian.' When they heard this, all in the synagogue were filled with rage. They got up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built, so that they might hurl him off the cliff. But he passed through the midst of them and went on his way. This is the Gospel of the Lord.



worse. And it shouldn't be - things don't ever stop changing. I regretted the times I went back home over the years. You expect family to welcome with open arms And show how they're thrilled to see you and your growing family. And then the reality that they are not so thrilled at all. It made for very uncomfortable times where there was little rest or reconnecting. I have to say, the 1st time I went back home to preach in my home church [in EA NY] I received a warm welcome. Even MY own pastor came and sat in the pew to listen. That was a good experience. But old home nostalgia is just that, nostalgia. Sentimentality. You can never go back and see it the same way. You'd think someone like JESUS could return to His hometown and be blown over with the towns' joy, excitement and happiness. "All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words" But then his time concludes with, "....all in the synagogue were filled with rage. They got up, drove him out of the town..."? Why? Because He told them all those in need of healing, those who are poor, Those who are blind, those who are held in bondage All of them – Are healed and made rich and given sight and released! Forgiven - set free - everyone - Today. Today Jesus says, THIS IS FULFILLED IN YOUR HEARING. That's what causes upheaval in the hometown synagogue. Jesus makes it clear that He isn't there to offer these familiar faces a special place of privilege in the Kingdom of God. Instead, it's unlikely they even want what He freely gives. Jesus' gentle condemnation of Israel's past suggests his ministry will be marked by blessings for outsiders and judgement for insiders. After all, neither Elijah nor Elisha were known for hometown healing.

Going back home. This idea is as interesting as it is stressful. It's never the same, for better or

The widow from Zarephath Elijah healed was not Jewish. Prophet Elisha healed the leader of an enemy army. Namaan. A Syrian general! Israel repeatedly cried out for God to pour judgement upon other nations; Jesus would rather pour out His grace on all people – And that not just Israel But everyone in the entire world is supposed to benefit from God's mercy. God was always rescuing the wrong people, the outsiders, and Jesus intended to completely fulfill this by bringing all outsiders inside. Jesus knows this town. He grew up in its cultural climate. People always marvelled over what He could do Considering His parents' Joseph and Mary's relationship....a "VIRGIN" birth, really? Jesus could see how Samaritans passing through their towns got rejected, and sense the hatred toward tax-collectors and Roman Rule. Jesus was one of them and yet not one of them at all. He is God born as man. His Gospel, His release to all who are burdened and chained to sin Paints Him with a negative brush. Jesus' truth, his welcome, his embrace, his compassion, his humility is there for anyone who receives Him and His Way. He goes to great pains to remind them that God's power is often focused on those on the outlying fringe of our little worlds. Sure, there were people in need right there in His own community. Yet, he reminds them, God has always looked out for those in need beyond the community of faith, beyond the boundaries of our towns, our countries. He uses us to reach them – Even against our will -- Since its God's power, not ours. God Himself is not ours to own. Rather, we are his. He holds us together. It's too much for those folks to hear. Jesus must go. Run him out of town ---off the edge of a cliff--just as the people had done with the prophets of old-- when they said the truth no one wished to hear. And you should see the bottom of those town cliffs in Israel. Often, these served as garbage dumps. With fires and the ashes that are always burning to dispose of it. Him and His Word are as good as garbage to be burned. Jesus just passes through the crowds unharmed. All Jesus has to do is favor them over everyone else. That's all any of us want. Special treatment for putting up with being a believer in our times. Polar opposite

ideals mark our times quite vividly. Pandemic life with so much information and restriction has created so much fear and anger and resentment and isolation.

It's hard to focus, listen or understand. It's all about he's right, you're wrong. Very little binds people together. It's lonely and frustrating. God knows this. He doesn't sympathize. He doesn't simply empathize. HE acts. Jesus is His huge active step out of glory and down into the arena of human mess. Jesus' message of truth challenges all hearers Because it disrupts preconceived hopes and assumptions. We do not respond by pushing Jesus off of a cliff, We choose to ignore it or not believe it or twist its meaning. All believers, in truth, all people, Can benefit from a greater self-awareness, deeper personal reflection of their life and spiritual well-being, with more openness to God's sometimes inconvenient work in daily living. Its means thinking that God gives Jesus Christ to the world Not just for my good, but for the good of all people. The time is now for the church to wrestle with this And re-evaluate mission and purpose. If Jesus fulfills His Scripture in my hearing, It is fulfilled for my neighbour, too. If Jesus died for me, He died for all. Jesus avoided the push off the cliff Because He dove head first into our sinful abyss When He LAID DOWN His Body on the cross To pay for sin's evil hold on humanity. Nails and thorns and wood and a spear has completely Released all, healed all, soothed all, forgiven all. Jesus did this for you. Jesus did this for everyone out there too. When we believe this, when the Holy Spirit inspires this in our hearts and minds, We go about doing the work Jesus does. We are partners with Him, walking by faith, going all the way back to the wilderness, the Exodus, and the Ten Commandments --

that all of us are anointed by God washed in Baptism sealed with the Spirit, with grace and forgiveness poured out on us--for this is how we can live as Jesus' own special community of hope--As Paul has written so well, that in this community, the greatest is love. [1 Cor. 13], SO our mission and purpose remains Jesus' message —binding up the broken-hearted; Giving hope to those without vision. Lightening the load of the burdened. Forgiving freely and openly as the Father has so forgiven us so freely in Christ.

For our God doesn't only love Israel, or outsiders, or our nation, or our enemies, Or the Christian tradition, the Church, our denomination, our parish, or whatever boundaries we wish to set. He loves all. No one is outside of His generous grace. God is not ours. Jesus is not ours.

We are his. He has called us all by name.

We live and work and witness where and when He leads us.

In faith we let go of all notions that Jesus, the hometown kid, is ours, and begin to believe and live what it means that "we are his."

As His, we also belong, united with, each other, in here and out there.

This is how we will live as a community of Love, a people of faith and hope— a people not known by our home town, but a people known by our Heavenly Kingdom.
