

SCRIPTURE:

The Old Testament: Deuteronomy 34:1-12

Then Moses went up from the plains of Moab to Mount Nebo, to the top of Pisgah, which is opposite Jericho, and the LORD showed him the whole land: Gilead as far as Dan, all Naphtali, the land of Ephraim and Manasseh, all the land of Judah as far as the Western Sea, the Negeb, and the Plain that is, the valley of Jericho, the city of palm trees—as far as Zoar. The LORD said to him, 'This is the land of which I swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, saying, "I will give it to your descendants"; I have let you see it with your eyes, but you shall not cross over there.' Then Moses, the servant of the LORD, died there in the land of Moab, at the LORD's command. He was buried in a valley in the land of Moab, opposite Beth-peor, but no one knows his burial place to this day. Moses was one hundred and twenty years old when he died; his sight was unimpaired and his vigour had not abated. The Israelites wept for Moses in the plains of Moab for thirty days; then the period of mourning for Moses was ended. Joshua son of Nun was full of the spirit of wisdom, because Moses had laid his hands on him: and the Israelites obeyed him, doing as the LORD had commanded Moses. Never since has there arisen a prophet in Israel like Moses, whom the LORD knew face to face. He was unequalled for all the signs and wonders that the LORD sent him to perform in the land of Egypt, against Pharaoh and all his servants and his entire land, and for all the mighty deeds and all the terrifying displays of power that Moses performed in the sight of all Israel. This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

The Epistle: Hebrews 3:1-6

Therefore, brothers and sisters, holy partners in a heavenly calling, consider that Jesus, the apostle and high priest of our confession, was faithful to the one who appointed

him, just as Moses also 'was faithful in all God's house.' Yet Jesus is worthy of more glory than Moses, just as the builder of a house has more honour than the house itself. (For every house is built by someone, but the builder of all things is God.) Now Moses was faithful in all God's house as a servant, to testify to the things that would be spoken later. Christ, however, was faithful over God's house as a son, and we are his house if we hold firm the confidence and the pride that belong to hope. This is the Word of the Lord.

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The Holy Gospel: St. Luke 9:28-36

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Luke, the 9th chapter:

Glory to You, O Lord.

Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah'—not knowing what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, 'This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!' When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen. This is the Gospel of the Lord.

THE NICENE CREED:






THE WORDS OF INSTITUTION:

³⁵ Then a voice from the cloud said, "This is my Son, my Chosen One. Listen to him." When the voice finished, Jesus was there alone. They didn't tell anyone at that time what they had seen.

Transfiguration, like any transformation, makes us think of outward changes. Like when a saggy body gets muscular through workouts. Or when an entertainer creates a new look for themselves. But when this kind of change involves the divine, It's not just an outward change.

All who are involved see life new and different. The ordinary appears extraordinary. There's an art project with kids that involves ordinary household objects.

A mixing spoon, a hand-mixer, maybe a hammer, a clamp, or pliers. You take these objects and trace them onto large paper in different directions, Over-lapping, to create outline patterns. It helps kids develop an understanding and appreciation for simple tools By seeing them in a new and different way. Jesus' disciples see Him in a different way. Epiphany began with worship of wise-men, A baptism by John and a wonderful sign of making wine from water. Jesus is once again THE BELOVED SON Who silences the disciples from sharing this news. Clearly Peter, James, and John experienced Jesus' beloved divine sonship, but also their own—in being chosen for such a mountaintop



moment. Mountaintops have always been a place where the divine is encountered. We think about Noah landing on Mt. Ararat after seeing the rainbow promise of God, of God providing for Abraham on Mt. Moriah rather than needing to have his son sacrificed, of Moses receiving the Ten Commandments on Mt. Sinai and later seeing the Promised Land from Mt. Pisgah, of Elijah on Mt. Carmel proving God's power to supreme, of the mountain-hill on the shores of the Sea of Galilee where Jesus gave his famous sermon on the Mount or Mt. Olive where Jesus would pray in the Garden of Gethsemane before His death. And today the disciples ascend Mt. Tabor and have this other-worldly encounter.

Mt. Tabor is nearby the Sea of Galilee and marks a place where Israel defeated their Canaanite enemies generations prior. Mountains serve as places for experiencing God's presence, His guidance, even His grace. I've personally never been a huge fan of mountains. Most likely my own fear of heights. Or when travelling, the fear of driving off the edge One can almost feel claustrophobic going through them--[drive down to US border beyond Calgary very nice with mountains and foothills and buttes] Most people like mountains. The climb upwards, the risk, the solitude, the alone-ness, feeling closer to the Heavens. Jesus goes on the mountain to be alone, taking 3 disciples, witnesses. While in prayer, with His Father – Jesus is transfigured. This is a metamorphosis. A change in His Form. His face is different; His clothing glowing bright like the sun; His inner divine, God-like nature is coming through His Body, So that the almighty power glows with His human flesh and blood. Patriarch Moses and Prophet Elijah appear with Him, bathed in heavenly glory, and it is magnificent....(!) But the disciples are heavy with sleep. They don't see bright, shiny Jesus, let alone Moses and Elijah; Makes you wonder how one could sleep with this going on!? I totally get it. I HEAR NOTHING AT NIGHT IN MY SLEEP Alarms could sound, a tornado could whisk away our house & I'd never know! Maybe it's just as well Peter, James and John sleep.

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Moses and Elijah are talking with Jesus. That would've been scary and strange. Dead people aren't
supposed to talk much less appear on earth. Their divine discussion is about Jesus' departure.
Literally, HIS EXODUS. Ancient Israel endured an Exodus. Enslaved under Egypt, led to freedom and
the promised Land by Moses. Years of wilderness wanderings up to the borders of Canaan.
Their Exodus is a true deliverance by God with the 10 Commandments and a covenant. Promised of
salvation from the real enemy of sin by the Saviour of all nations. For Peter, James, and John, and for
all of you, This Exodus brings this Old Testament history in full view. Recollection of God's mighty
acts in history to save, rescue, and deliver His people. Jesus' exodus is all of that and more.
More impressive than the fiery chariots that bore Elijah to heaven. More powerful than the plagues
and the parting of the Red Sea. This is the greater exodus, the one that finally brings Moses and all
believers into the Promised Land. Jesus will accomplish this Exodus by travelling to Jerusalem.
Jesus' Transfiguration gives us a picture of the saving Gospel. His exodus will bear the weight of
every sin from every generation before and since. The sad and painful story that began in the Garden
of Eden with sin and exile finds its joyful end in the crucified and resurrected Son sitting at the right
hand of God and waiting for the day when He returns and bring us to the mansions He's prepared for
us in the heavenly Eden, with free access to the living tree of life near the river of life. Jesus exodus
reverses the curse and opens the entrance to life everlasting forever. So when Jesus glows it's with
the power that will enable Him to suffer death But rise again to new life. The life with the Father and
His sonship as a member of the Holy Trinity Will keep Him focused on this Exodus plan to cleanse
the world in His Blood. This exodus discussion and this glorious Gospel encounter wakes the
disciples up! Awakened now, maybe they can actually see Jesus for Who He is.
The ordinary rabbi, the Son of God Who makes them feel inferior. Peter, James, and John are still
human; and so, like all of you, they struggle with this whole thing. This is all brand new. As they look,
Moses and Elijah seem to shine as brightly as their Lord. Elijah and Moses glow, but only because of
Jesus' shining body. Like the moon, they reflect the light from this True SON. They make the mistake
of putting Jesus, Moses, and Elijah on the same level. This is why Peter suggest giving them each a
tent to sleep in. He didn't mean to, or at least he wasn't aware of what he was saying, but its strange
putting Moses and Elijah on the same level with Jesus. Or is it?
It is good for us all to be here isn't it? Jesus doesn't correct Peter. No scolding. No rebuking.
Moses and Elijah testify to Jesus' Word and work. Doesn't the risen Lord appear with the Emmaus
travellers And open up the Scriptures to them, beginning with Moses, the prophets and the Psalms?!
The Old is fulfilled in the New. Jesus fulfills the Law of Love. Jesus' exodus is the end of every
iourney in search of identify and renewal. This wakes up every child born in the sleep of sluggish sin.
We've all been woken up by Water and the Word, in Holy Baptism, And now you can see all these
things as they are. Even though we may struggle to trust. To see a light at the end of the tunnel.
We'd like to house the holiness of God on earth close to us too. Sometimes we put other things on
the same level as Jesus, maybe even on a higher level that He is. We pay little attention to our
spiritual health. Your Father in heaven knows this about you, of course. He knows that you struggle.
He knows that you are still learning to see, Needing a lot of encouragement to trust and live in hope.
and that this will be an on-going daily awareness. So it would make so much sense for God to show
us things. To make our spiritual health come to life. But instead, God goes to work on our ears.
Just like the 3 disciples. When the cloud overshadows them, they can't see anymore.
Kind of like when we [or I'm] asleep. And they hear just one thing: God's booming voice:
This is My Beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to Him. Listen to Him.
From the Greek word here we get the English term ACOUSTICS. And with acoustics, word and
sounds fill the air so everyone is able to hear no matter when they sit or stand.
The beloved Son's Words fill the space of our whole beings. Listening is so important.
As we can easily hear without listening. It's as much as your attentive focus as it is your hearing.
Simple yet profound advice. In this cloud all the things you think you see rightly are hard to see.
Try walking around your house at night in the dark, You have to trust your ears to navigate without
light. Because all the glow and the power and the appearance of Moses and Elijah are meaningless
unless they reflect Jesus' glory and His message. It's all foolishness apart from Christ.
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None of this has any glory of its own. As the cloud overshadows us, and Lent approaches, please don't run away. You can't see where you're going anyways.

Let every distraction be cast aside and every obstacle to trust thrown away. May all ears be open to your heavenly Father, who says of His Son: "Listen to Him." Listen. Listen for words of encouragement. Listen for cries of help. Listen for the prayers of the hurting. Listen for opportunities to help. Even the disciples kept silent and told no one in those days any of this.

But that was them then. It means that listening comes before speaking; Listening happens before you offer prayer or encouragement. Listening begins the act of mercy and compassionate help. Because this is how the real change lives on from the Mount of transfiguration. After the cloud drifts away, Jesus looks like Himself again. Jesus was fully God and fully Man before the Transfiguration, and Jesus is fully God and fully Man after the Transfiguration. The real change occurs in His disciples: Peter, James, John, and you. Their eyes now see what their ears have heard. Your eyes see Jesus in the face of those who call on you for help. Your eyes see Jesus in the bread and wine of Holy Communion Which is a meal that keeps transforming you. Forgiveness wakens you from the sleepiness of all your suffering. Our interactions with others, not only with God, change us, literally transfigure us, because our listening forms our understanding. And our normal, everyday appearance reveals a gentler glow of Jesus and His Spirit. Through our experiences, we gain patience, wisdom, love and mercy. This is why it's good Lord to be here. It's good to encounter Jesus in a time of worship which keeps transfiguring.

It's good

Because we receive and show Jesus' glowing Face of grace.

Amen.
