

- 5) Lighting and extinguishing of altar candles



But Abram said, 'O Lord God, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?' And Abram said, 'You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir.' But the word of the Lord came to him, 'This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir.' He brought him outside and said, 'Look towards heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them.' Then he said to him, 'So shall your descendants be.' And he believed the Lord; and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness. Then he said to him, 'I am the Lord who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans. to give you this land to possess.' But he said, 'O Lord God, how am I to know that I shall possess it?' He said to him, 'Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtle-dove, and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these and cut them in two, laying each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two. And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away. As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell upon Abram, and a deep and terrifying darkness descended upon him. When the sun had gone down and it was dark, a smoking fire-pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. On that day the Lord made a covenant with Abram, saying, 'To your descendants I give this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the river Euphrates.

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

The Epistle: Philippians 3:17 – 4:1

[St. Paul writes:] Brothers and sisters, join in imitating me, and observe those who live according to the example you have in us. For many live as enemies of the cross of Christ; I have often told you of them, and now I tell you even with tears. Their end is destruction; their god is the belly; and their glory is in their shame; their minds are set on earthly things. But our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ. He will transform the body of our humiliation so that it may be conformed to the body of his glory, by the power that also enables him to make all things subject to himself. Therefore, my brothers and sisters, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, my beloved.





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
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THE LORD'S PRAYER:





REV. TODD HOEFFS LENT 2

Scripture: Luke 13:31-35 "How to make Jesus cry"

March 13, 2022

While going to visit a dying member in a palliative care facility [in WPG] I met a grieving family while riding in the hospital elevator. They noticed my clergy collar and asked if I was a catholic priest. I said, no, a Lutheran "priest". Our mom is near death. Our priest isn't able to come, can you help? If it's not too late? Sure. I followed them into the room. Just seconds before I entered the room, their mom died. "Oh, it's too late. She's gone" they cried out. "It's not too late. She's in Heaven with Jesus; you're all still here. I will commend her to the Lord and bless you with strength to meet the days ahead. I used parts of our commendation of the dying, we prayed the Lord's Prayer, And I recited the Song of Simeon. I left them sad, but in hope. {Then I visited my member who was delighted to hear of this occurrence.) It's not too late. There still is time to face life in the face of Jesus. This is central to today's Gospel reading from Luke. Oh, we can be easily distracted by the ongoing feud between Jesus and Herod. We can wonder about how the powers of the world fit into the drama before us – then and now. Putin invading Ukraine for example, and his meaningless devastation. Nations coming together in global unity over this. Jesus turns his back on Herod. He dismisses him and his crooked status and power. And Jesus turns his heart towards Jerusalem. It's not too late. Not even for those who have broken the heart of Jesus. Not when he uttered this aching lament nearly 2000 years ago. Jerusalem breaks Jesus' heart. That holy city which had been the seat of God's presence since ancient times. Jerusalem, where he found his home as a boy in the temple. Jerusalem, which would soon claim his life.

"Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it!

The city that murders the prophets is also the center of Jesus' world. Luke's Gospel story begins and ends with Jesus in the Temple, facing Jerusalem. Which is why Jesus calls Israel his baby chickens. As a Mother Hen, Jesus wants to hide and protect them against all that threatens them, Especially their own selves. A Mother Hens sitting on a nest protecting her chicks is a strong formidable image. While foxes love to eat chickens, and are very sly, foxes are above all, cowardly. A protective mother hen may be overtaken by the right pounce at the right angle – but foxes know they'll be pecked and clawed and flapped at and scratched and might even get killed in the process. Foxes will leave protecting hens alone. It's when chicks scatter out from under the wings that create danger and death. Chicks know they're vulnerable when straying apart from mom hen, inevitably, they go astray and become targets for a fox. Herod is a fox, a cowardly, devilish leader who only serves his own desires. Jesus, always the protecting Hen, guarding, caring, nurturing, saving, will take the attacks and in the end die, but in dying, He'll destroy the power of sin and death forever. How often [has Jesus] desired to gather the children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing!"

These words are uttered by Protective One Who will be vulnerable, betrayed, Who has loved completely, but whose love has been thrown insultingly back into His face. The one who has suffered rejection and who will too soon suffer unspeakably and die at the hands of that rejection. Only the story is not done yet.

- Not for the Pharisees who warned Jesus of Herod's intent.
- Not for his disciples standing nearby.
- Not for the crowds who have been listening to his teaching nor the broken in mind, body, and spirit who have received his healing.

It was not too late then and it is not too late now. Not even for you and me. Jesus is not accusing us. Jesus is not accusing Jerusalem. He is lamenting Jerusalem. When he finally sees Jerusalem,

Luke tells us, "He cries over it" (Luke 19:41). He is sorrowing and protesting the end, the death, the narrowness and short-sightedness, of Jerusalem. For though Jesus' concern was spoken over Jerusalem, we can be certain he still has great concern over us, His followers.

He no longer weeps for us, because His Blood has washed us into faith in Him. Against our will, we have embraced His way among us. Even when we reject his embrace. When with our hearts and with our lives we turn our back on him still. And Jesus' lament is fitting, for even at our very best when we reject the promised protection and love of God, we set ourselves up to try to live in a world on our own where for all of our best intentions, we will not do, can never be enough.

And where our hopes turn to cynicism and our resolve to do good too often dissolves under the pressures of the world. And at our worst? Well, we know too well what that looks like.

Again, the cry of Jesus is one of betrayal. It is directed at those with whom God's best gifts have been invested. The very likes of you and me. In what ways are your eyes, ears, or heart closed today? What needs to happen, to change, to be let go of, for them to begin opening? What would it take for you to bless an unknown promise, an unforeseeable future, an uncertain life? That won't change what is coming, but it will change us. "And you were not willing!" Jerusalem has closed to the future. The door of their house is locked and the windows are boarded up. "See, your house is left to you," Jesus says (Luke 13:35). Jerusalem has refused to respond to the promise and give existence to the insistence of life.

I see so much fear and the succumbing to that fear. Irrational fear. We need not fear, but remain strong and confident and formidable in our faith. We continue the ministry of serving from compassion that the Gospel will always lead. Jesus determines to continue his ministry despite Herod threat. He states that he will work "today and tomorrow, and on the third day,

I [he] finish my [his] work" (v. 32). Jesus means his death and resurrection in Jerusalem. Because Jesus' ministry is part of God's plan, Herod cannot kill him. Jesus also emphasizes the impossibility for a prophet to be killed outside of Jerusalem. Jesus is very much devoted to us, like a mother, who is willing to give his own life to save his people, His Father's dear children. But it's not too late. It is not too late. Not then and not now.

We worship a Lord who is fearless, on account of a great, sacrificial love.

"There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear" (1 John 4:18). God's love in Jesus Christ's own protective unconditional grace and fierce loyalty. For the God of this church is not a fox, out to get us, out to scare us. But a God who wraps loving arms to hold us up, and be our strength, no matter what.

After all these many generations, Jesus prophetic message still speaks to the church today.

The church needs to choose between the fox and the hen. It is not too late.

The church needs to decide whether to continue Christ mission or to fear the rules and rigidity of expectations. In other words, are we going to follow Christ to the cross?

A fox will always threaten the church that accepts to be a hen. The church history proves that the church of Jesus has encountered many foxes. But Jesus assures us that mother hen is not afraid of the fox; to the contrary, she is willing to fight for her children. This is the ultimate love of Jesus Christ. When we refuse to come under his protection, he will never give us up.

Jesus Christ embraced his death on the cross and in doing so, embraces us and the world, inspite of Jerusalem's rejection.

This story is important for us as we are walking on our Lenten journey.

Jesus is determined to love you. No matter what you will face in your life, you are under Jesus' wings. And nothing you can do can make Him cry.
