REV. TODD HOEFFS <u>PALM SUNDAY 11 AM</u> Scripture: John 12:1-11 "Palms, Parade, Promises & Perseverance" April 10, 2022 In the name of the Father and of the Son + and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

As many look forward to Holy Week, to Easter, spring warmth, peace -- War and devastation rages on in Ukraine. Amid the tragic news emerge small stories of faith and hope. Aid workers can see how prayers from around the globe offer the closeness needed during times of war.

God's presence is felt when bombs fall and do not blow up said a soldier.

A little girl, 12 year old Nastya slept under a table as missiles screamed through night skies. She said the table was just a piece of furniture, now it is like God, my refuge and home. To see God as a refuge in times of havoc is itself, a miracle.

Palm Sunday and Holy Week is all about miraculous faith. The hope of the world, our very refuge and strength, enters humbly. As the saying goes, restraint is true power. Jesus IS true power. Within His hand rests the universe. Jesus doesn't expect a parade like He gets. Psalm 118, the verses we spoke at the bigging of our service, Flow from the lips of these people that day. There's a feeling of victory in the air.

Jerusalem has countless palm trees. Images of life and happiness.

Palm branches had been viewed then as not only protective shade, But water, rest, glory, power, success. Palms had become Israel's national symbol, even appearing on their coins. No different than the Maple Leafs on Canada Day. Palms decorate the temple Conjuring up feelings of beauty and prosperity. What better welcome for a King?! But kings don't ride in parades on donkeys. A stubborn, hard working animal, but also an animal of peace and humility. Jesus isn't a conquering hero, He's a servant. He is full of peace. He is ready to give up everything to win. He Who faces death is greeted with joy and triumph. Well, there is a belief that for good luck, you laugh at a funeral? Maybe this is where is starts? But it's not just the crowd of people. Palms also speak of a deeper, more Heavenly welcome. St. John writes years later in his Revelation how he sees palms in the hands of those how have come through the great tribulation and have been washed in the blood of the Lamb. They take up palms to identify with our Lord's entry into Jerusalem as a sacrifice and the victory over harmful sin, satanic threats and eternal death. Those are defeated in Jerusalem.

This is why we celebrate.

We are not yet through the great tribulation, That will end when the world ends and Jesus returns in glory. When we see Jesus face to face. Now, we only see with eyes of faith. We trust that all those with Him in Heaven gather around us When we gather. The witnesses with Palms. We echo their words, like the words of the people with Jesus heading into Jerusalem –Hosanna, Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.

"Hosanna"-- the Hebrew word meaning 'Help, save us." A prayerful ask of immediate divine intervention. It's not so unusual. The people following Jesus heard and saw so much. Many knew He raised Lazarus from the dead weeks before. They're wanting to see what He's going to do next. Maybe He will help them now. Religious zealots want instant help by removing the Roman occupation. Messiah seekers want Heaven brought down to earth now. "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord." They believe, though maybe not completely understand. They know He can do something great. Few if any recognized in the euphoric moment the fulfillment of Zechariah's prophecy: Rejoice greatly...Your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is he, humble and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. But Jesus recognized the moment. And so he "found a young donkey and sat on it". The Pharisees watched all of this very critically from a short distance – Seeing nothing good in it -- Look, the world has gone after him" they claim.

The joy only hardened the authorities' resolve to kill the dead-raising Son of God. But He knew exactly what he was doing. His hour had come at last. The news must spread. It's time for the city gates to raise their heads, and the ancient doors lift up and open in honour. The King of glory is on his way (Psalm 24:7). Jesus also knows the result of this: triggering the fulfillment of another prophecy, this time from Isaiah: Jesus was pierced for our transgressions; crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed. (Isaiah 53:5) *He is* innocent. But His expiration from agony on the cross results in His freely giving away Of his holiness and His Holy Spirit through His shed Blood.

And His will be a resurrection far more glorious and world-shaking than Lazarus's. His resurrection will be the blueprint for ever believer who lives and dies in Him. "If anyone serves Me, he must follow Me; and where I am,

there will my servant be also. If anyone serves Me, the Father will honor him." The Pharisees grumbled that the world has gone after Jesus – And thanks be to God, the world still does. All those in the world who do believe.

All who see value in the Gospel message of forgiveness and peace.

The truth of it all is that no one seeks Jesus, He finds you.

Your faith comes from Him, not from you. Where there is Gospel, cross, Scripture, there is Jesus. This doesn't make us better or nicer or greater, It does make us more aware, more reflective of our imperfect condition....And it really should humble us further, for all in our life is gift from God. In losing our pride and ego we gain the same as Christ: the cross and then an empty tomb. Let us hope the world will go after Him, After us, Bother us with questions about our faith that makes us hang in there.

And we can win them over with kindness and listening.

Together, we will understand each other in the image of One Who comes not in all His glory and majesty, but in the lowly forms—such as in the bread and wine.

Hosanna we sing Holy Holy We sing.

For Jesus comes in another form to save us in this holy meal.

Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord." He comes to us We go out to others in the name of the Lord. Give witness to the world of Christ and Him crucified by centering your own life your activities your relationships

by centering your own life, your activities, your relationships

upon the life of Jesus Which we have access in the Church,

which is the life of Christ He gives to His Church.

When weak voices cry out "save us now",

May the Spirit move us in our liturgical Hosannas

To save others now in every way we can.

While we and the outside world go after other things -

Even day dream of better days, warmer weather,

No more war or bombs or destruction -

May we, shoulder to shoulder with people out there – go after Jesus,

gaining nothing but His cross and new life.

Amen.
