COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION STARTING JULY 2022

Beginning Sunday, July 10, Christ Lutheran Church will offer Holy Communion distribution in the manner which pre-dated COVID Pandemic time. Instead of the single file "pilgrim style" method --

- 1) Worshippers will be directed to the communion rail in the inner chancel and kneel to receive.
- 2) Distancing between worshippers will be considered, for the best interests of our people.
- 3) The communion bread/wafer/host will still be given with silver tongs.

4) The common cup [or chalice] will be offered along with the tray of individual glasses. Appropriate handling and cleansing will be considered and applied.

- 5) The pastoral blessing will be spoken after each table [rail] communes.
- 6) Worshippers will return to their pew via the outer aisle.

7) As always, facemasks may or may not be worn according to comfort level of worshipper.

While the church realizes this is familiar and yet new, after 2 years without this custom, any

worshipper who would rather not receive Communion in this manner yet, please alert Pastor Todd or an elder/usher. Adjustments and modifications can be made for the welfare of all of our people. Any questions, comments or concerns, please let Pastor Todd know.

THE WORD

The Old Testament: 1 Kings 1-4, 8-15

Ahab told Jezebel all that Elijah had done, and how he had killed all the prophets with the sword. Then Jezebel sent a messenger to Elijah, saying, 'So may the gods do to me, and more also, if I do not make your life like the life of one of them by this time tomorrow.' Then he was afraid; he got up and fled for his life, and came to Beer-sheba, which belongs to Judah; he left his servant there. But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a solitary broom tree. He asked that he might die: 'It is enough; now, O Lord, take away my life, for I am no better than my ancestors.'....He got up, and ate and drank; then he went in the strength of that food for forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God. At that place he came to a cave, and spent the night there. Then the word of the Lord came to him, saying, 'What are you doing here, Elijah?' He answered, 'I have been very zealous for the Lord, the God of hosts; for the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, thrown down

your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away.' He said, 'Go out and stand on the mountain before the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by.' Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire; and after the fire a sound of sheer silence. When Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his mantle and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. Then there came a voice to him that said, 'What are you doing here, Elijah?' He answered, 'I have been very zealous for the Lord, the God of hosts; for the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away.' Then the Lord said to him, 'Go, return on your way to the wilderness of Damascus; when you arrive, you shall anoint Hazael as king over Aram. This is the Word of the Lord.

The Epistle: Galatians 3:23-29

[St. Paul writes:] Now before faith came, we were held captive under the law, imprisoned until the coming faith would be revealed. So then, the law was our guardian until Christ came, in order that we might be justified by faith. But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian, for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. And if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to promise. This is the Word of the Lord.

The Holy Gospel: St. Luke 8: 26-39

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Luke, the 8th chapter: Glory to You, O Lord.

Then they sailed to the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee. When Jesus had stepped out on land, there met him a man from the city who had demons. For a long time he had worn no clothes, and he had not lived in a house but among the tombs. When he saw Jesus, he cried out and fell down before him and said with a loud voice, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, do not torment me." For he had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many a time it had seized him. He was kept under guard and bound with chains and shackles, but he would break the bonds and be driven by the demon into the desert.) Jesus then asked him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Legion," for many demons had entered him. And they begged him not to command them to depart into the abyss. Now a large herd of pigs was feeding there on the hillside, and they begged him to let them enter these. So he gave them permission. Then the demons came out of the man and entered the pigs, and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and drowned. When the herdsmen saw what had happened, they fled and told it in the city and in the country. Then people went out to see what had happened, and they came to Jesus and found the man from whom the demons had gone, sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind, and they were afraid. And those who had seen it told them how the demon-possessed man had been healed. Then all the people of the surrounding country of the Gerasenes asked him to depart from them, for they were seized with great fear. So he got into the boat and returned. The man from whom the demons had gone begged that he might be with him, but Jesus sent him away, saying, "Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you." And he went away, proclaiming throughout the whole city how much Jesus had done for him. This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to You, O Christ.

Then Jezebel sent a messenger to Elijah, saying, 'So may the gods do to me, and more also, if I do not make your life like the life of one of them by this time tomorrow.' Then he was afraid; he got up and fled for his life, and came to Beer-sheba, which belongs to Judah; he left his servant there. But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a solitary broom tree. He asked that he might die: 'It is enough; now, O Lord, take away my life, for I am no better than my ancestors.'....He got up, and ate and drank; then he went in the strength of that food

for forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God. At that place he came to a cave, and spent the night there. Then the word of the Lord came to him, saying, 'What are you doing here, Elijah?' He answered, 'I have been very zealous for the Lord, the God of hosts; for the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away.' He said, 'Go out and stand on the mountain before the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by.' Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake; and after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire; and after the fire a sound of sheer silence. When Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his mantle and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. Then there came a voice to him that said, 'What are you doing here, Elijah?' He answered, 'I have been very zealous for the Lord, the God of hosts; for the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away.' Then the Lord said to him, 'Go, return on your way to the wilderness of Damascus; when you arrive, you shall anoint Hazael as king over Aram. This is the Word of the Lord.

The Epistle: Galatians 3:23-29

[St. Paul writes:] Now before faith came, we were held captive under the law, imprisoned until the coming faith would be revealed. So then, the law was our guardian until Christ came, in order that we might be justified by faith. But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian, for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. And if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to promise. This is the Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**



The Holy Gospel: St. Luke 8: 26-39

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Luke, the 8th chapter:

Glory to You, O Lord.

Then they sailed to the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee. When Jesus had stepped out on land, there met him a man from the city who had demons. For a long time he had worn no clothes, and he had not lived in a house but among the tombs. When he saw Jesus, he cried out and fell down before him and said with a loud voice, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most

High God? I beg you, do not torment me." For he had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many a time it had seized him. He was kept under guard and bound with chains and shackles, but he would break the bonds and be driven by the demon into the desert.) Jesus then asked him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Legion," for many demons had entered him. And they begged him not to command them to depart into the abyss. Now a large herd of pigs was feeding there on the hillside, and they begged him to let them enter these. So he gave them permission. Then the demons came out of the man and entered the pigs, and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and drowned. When the herdsmen saw what had happened, they fled and told it in the city and in the country. Then people went out to see what had happened, and they came to Jesus and found the man from whom the demons had gone, sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind, and they were afraid. And those who had seen it told them how the demon-possessed man had been healed. Then all the people of the surrounding country of the Gerasenes asked him to depart from them, for they were seized with great fear. So he got into the boat and returned. The man from whom the demons had gone begged that he might be with him, but Jesus sent him away, saying, "Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you." And he went away, proclaiming throughout the whole city how much Jesus had done for him.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to You, O Christ.

THE NICENE CREED:

Rev. Todd Hoeffs Pentecost 2 [Father's Day] Galatians 3:23-29 June 19, 2022

In many different areas of Winnipeg children would walk to school together hand in hand, creating a human school bus. Often stopping by homes and apartments where kids might be neglected or where parents are too busy to even take their kids to school...the line of children [often with an adult] would create a safe convoy to school. Step by step, led to school across busy streets or vacant lots.

This kept kids safely guarded on the way to school in all kinds of weather. Once at school breakfasts may even need to be served before learning takes place.

Being ready for the day is important.

I'm sure there are dads or brothers or uncles here who might do this for their families. Keeping the family moving forward. Safe. Guarded. Protected.

This is the schoolmaster/tutor Apostle Paul describes for the Galatian church and us today. A very understandable image for them, a church made up of Jewish Christians and a

multicultural Arab and Roman blend from the bustling city centre in what's not called Turkey.

You, see, the Law of God was perfectly normal to the Jewish Christian, other than thinking they still needed to work at living u to it. And for the other groups of people, the Law was merely Roman or Greek civil law.

So Paul calls the Law a tutor. The Greek word he used we have for a term in education: pedagogy. Which is not only what is taught but how subjects get taught. Only upper classes went to school in the ancient world, and only male kids. Roman slaves were called pedagogies and they led male children by the hand on the way to school [like the human school bus]. Sometimes even stayed all day nearby. Watching out for their best interests. These slaves guarded the kids from all kinds of danger to the age of accountability [13 or 14].

Keep on the straight and narrow is a saying coming out of this.

That had been God's idea of the Law.

The 10 Commands are such a guardian and tutor.

The Law literally led people by the hand up to the era where the Christ of God would be born. Sinners need guarding.

Sin infested the human race so badly that even a Lawful guard could not change how deeply ingrained rebellion is in our human fabric. The Law could not lead us to the Heavenly Kingdom. If the law guards and guides, it can't change what's inside so that we CAN be seated at our Father's Table.

The Law only wound up divided people into various categories. God didn't when He gave the Law, but the religious establishment interpreted in divisive ways to ensure THEY got in and others remained OUT. The divide separated Jews from Greeks, slave from free, male from female, sick from healthy. Jews observed the Mosaic law; Gentiles did not; some laws were for slaves and some for free people; circumcision was for men and other rules applied to women. Men got away with very much, women were tied to their husbands and his reputation.

Paul is here to re-emphasize what Christ Himself not only said but lived. The old distinctions have all given way before a greater LAW of LOVE, binding us all together by faith in Christ.

This could be very confusing. Like the rules of the game are changing in mid-play.

Apostle Paul reminds them no one is under any Old Covenant. The gathering of animals for sacrifices on certain days of the month are over. Separate seats in the Temple have given way to welcoming all in through the new sanctuary in the heart of everyone redeemed by Christ. Because Christ our Lord is the New Covenant Who poured out His life in Blood and sealed the promise by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

The Law can only confront us with how sinful we are. It cannot save us from its hard convicting words. There's no divine traffic signal keeping us from running life's red lights. When the Law of God uncovers the wrongs we try to hide its done its job.

Grace takes over to bring us into a right relationship with God. Forgiveness leads to repentance. Not as a pre-requisite for new life. Repentance rightly and freely grows out from a life that has been transformed in the blood of Christ. The pedagogy school master guardian is out of work.

We are no longer led to Christ by an ancient understanding of the law.

We don't read the Old Testament as either a forgotten history or as a map for living life on earth. Its not a rule book to be a better believer. The point of the Old Testament is recognizing the reason for Christ to come and redeem the world God so loved. Christ is the heart of the Scriptures and the only justification for getting us right with our Father. And we need to be made right with God. Every prayer and reading of Scripture and worship service brings us again and again around the throne of our God.

While a guide and schoolmaster is a thing of the past, a clothing item is needed.

And not the preverbal Father's Day necktie either or golf shirt. No special earthly things to make us look better.

No, all must be clothed with Christ.

You can't clothe yourself either. You can't buy the garment nor live a life of faith in Jesus without it. All of you are clothed with Christ BECAUSE YOU ARE BAPTIZED WITH CHRIST!

Simple as that.

Baptism saves you.

Baptism makes you God's child and Jesus' sibling.

Baptism makes siblings of us all across all global boundaries. Baptism doesn't lead us anywhere, but covers over us as we journey on earth.

We are dressed in Jesus' Body made pure from all evil.

We wear exactly what Jesus displayed on the cross without covering of clothing.

His garment was a bloody wash that flows into every single little baptismal font when the Holy Trinity is invoked in Baptism.

We wear His Righteousness, His Wisdom, His Power, His salvation and His new Life.

Peace and Comfort is draped on our shoulders. (not "Levi's") because there is nothing that

Forgiveness and God's Favour mark our place in the Kingdom.

THIS IS NOT an IN CROWD invite.

Being in the Body of Christ in the church is not another guide leading us to a better seat in life's pathway.

Being baptized into Christ means WE HAVE WHAT HE HAS.

HE lives in us.

We aren't brought near to Him, He are IN HIM as He is IN US.

Being clothed with Christ is not a costume party where we wear masks and pretend to be what we are not.

All facades crumble as all obstacles blocking the way to God are gone because of Jesus.

We are simply sons and daughters in a family our eyes rarely see but our faith trusts is there.

This baptismal life is not just a one-time past event either.

It is a present reality that we return to each day.

As we see our need for God and trust in His love and forgiveness.

When Jesus' clothing feels like its wearing thin,

the Spirit sews up the holes with the memory of God's goodness

and the comforting message that we are seen and loved and well-protected.

When our strength is barely palpable, when we feel too tired to even pray,

Jesus' Flesh and Blood is available to eat and drink to physically assure us that His life of love is our too.

A blessed communion reminder we are not alone.

When we don't feel like we're good enough, or when we feel better than others Or more deserving and that sinful privilege rears its ugly head,

The Gospel assures us that we're not a part of Jesus' Body because of US.

We are part of Him because HE has washed us in.

This is why Paul strongly affirms NOW, as a believing body of Christ, baptized and clothed in Him, *"There is no longer Jew or Gentile, slave or free, male or female.*

For you are all one in Christ Jesus." (Gal 3: 28)

This is a dramatic shift. For the Galatian church. When the entire ancient world economy thrived on such hierarchal dfferences. And still a dramatic shift for the church today.

When we think a shifting world is not good enough to spend eternity with us so we either ignore or deride. Sometimes the haunts of the past come full circle and the life we think we've overcome or outgrown is there again. Calling out for justice and healing and Gospel centering.

That's where our witness as the Body of Christ lives freely.

Life in Christ is beyond gender, race, ethnicity, religion, and ownership.

Instead, those made righteous by faith in Christ are literally ONE in Him.

It doesn't mean we live colour blind.

It doesn't mean we pretend we are not unique or different.

Those are realities. Those are also realities to protect and celebrate and treasure.

But it means these differences don't make us better. Christ has given us all a new identity.

And we all share in God's inheritance promised first to Abraham.

ALL believers are related to Abraham. Because our guardian has stopped.

Christ is ours. We are His. No matter what era or trend we live in,

Christ clothing is on our bodies to stay. It never goes out of style.

And it makes us all one well-dressed family reunion around the Heavenly table. Amen.
