COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION STARTING JULY 2022

Beginning Sunday, July 10, Christ Lutheran Church will offer Holy Communion distribution in the manner which pre-dated COVID Pandemic time. Instead of the single file "pilgrim style" method --

- 1) Worshippers will be directed to the communion rail in the inner chancel and kneel to receive.
- 2) Distancing between worshippers will be considered, for the best interests of our people.
- 3) The communion bread/wafer/host will still be given with silver tongs.

4) The common cup [or chalice] will be offered along with the tray of individual glasses. Appropriate handling and cleansing will be considered and applied.

- 5) The pastoral blessing will be spoken after each table [rail] communes.
- 6) Worshippers will return to their pew via the outer aisle.

7) As always, facemasks may or may not be worn according to comfort level of worshipper.

While the church realizes this is familiar and yet new, after 2 years without this custom, any worshipper who would rather not receive Communion in this manner yet, please alert Pastor Todd or an elder/usher. Adjustments and modifications can be made for the welfare of all of our people. Any questions, comments or concerns, please let Pastor Todd know. Thank you and peace.

COVID 19 PROTOCOL: With the lifting of essentially all Covid protocols by the Ontario Government, it is a "personal choice" whether or not you continue to wear a mask for Worship Services and activities within the church. We ask that everyone continue to be diligent in monitoring themselves for fever, cold and flu-like symptoms, and if any of the symptoms are present, please refrain from attending in-person services and activities. PRAYER FOR OUR CONGREGATION AND OUR PASTOR:

On Wednesday evening at the Voter's meeting, Pastor Todd presented to us, his desire to go to, and continue with, one blended Service at 10 a.m. even after the summer and going forward into the fall. Going to one Service would help him to use his energy to guide us in other areas of Pastoral ministry as well. So whether you are pleased with the idea or disappointed because you really like and wanted your preferred time or style of Service to remain, let us try to remember that it is not about us but about God!!!! We trusted in God's will to send us the Pastor that He wanted us to have, so let us continue in that trust and show our Pastor how much we appreciate and value him, knowing that it is through prayer and discernment that he is leading in what he feels is God's will for us at this time.

As leader of the prayer chain, I regularly send out requests for prayers for the needs of many in our congregation, their families and friends; but praying for the needs of our congregation as a whole, as part of the Body of Christ, is one that we should pray often, that we continue to grow in faith and service, trusting in God's will for us.

Thank you for the gift of salvation; help us to share that Gospel with others. Give us Your Holy Spirit and help our congregation to grow and flourish like a tree planted by streams of water, yielding fruit and not withering. Renew us and transform us. The Old Testament:1 Kings 2:1,2, 6-14

Now when the Lord was about to take Elijah up to heaven by a whirlwind, Elijah and Elisha were on their way from Gilgal. Elijah said to Elisha, 'Stay here; for the Lord has sent me as far as Bethel.' But Elisha said, 'As the Lord lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you.' So they went down to Bethel.... Then Elijah said to him, 'Stay here; for the Lord has sent me to the Jordan.' But he said. 'As the Lord lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you.' So the two of them went on. Fifty men of the company of prophets also went, and stood at some distance from them, as they both were standing by the Jordan. Then Elijah took his mantle and rolled it up, and struck the water; the water was parted to the one side and to the other, until the two of them crossed on dry ground. When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, 'Tell me what I may do for you, before I am taken from you.' Elisha said, 'Please let me inherit a double share of your spirit.' He responded, 'You have asked a hard thing; yet, if you see me as I am being taken from you, it will be granted you; if not, it will not.' As they continued walking and talking, a chariot of fire and horses of fire separated the two of them, and Elijah ascended in a whirlwind into heaven. Elisha kept watching and crying out, 'Father, father! The chariots of Israel and its horsemen!' But when he could no longer see him, he grasped his own clothes and tore them in two pieces. He picked up the mantle of Elijah that had fallen from him, and went back and stood on the bank of the Jordan. He took the mantle of Elijah that had fallen from him, and struck the water, saying, 'Where is the Lord, the God of Elijah?' The Epistle: Galatians 5: 1, 13-26

[St. Paul writes:] For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery....For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." But if you bite and devour one another, watch out that you are not consumed by one another. But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. Now the works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions, envy, drunkenness, orgies,

and things like these. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, provoking one another, envying one another. This is the Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

REV. TODD HOEFFS Pentecost 3 [Picnic service] Luke 9:51-62 [57-62] June 26, 2022

The 1st time I heard this reading about Jesus having no place to lay His head, I couldn't help but think, "It's Jesus. Couldn't someone get Him a pillow!?" We sing how Jesus "laid down His sweet head" in a manger with no crib for a bed. Maybe it shouldn't be so surprising that GOD would come down To our little earth Which HE designed, decorated and delivered, without a home or a chair or a table. Birds have nests, foxes have holes in the ground, But not the SON OF MAN.

A title Jesus often used of Himself. Not in religious or political terms of a new King or an overthrower of Roman rule. He is SON of MAN for He is one of us, Yet highly placed to be our Redeemer and Saviour. So then Jesus makes it His ministry that every life on earth He touched He made His home and His chair and His table. Every home he entered to heal a person Every time He sat down to listen Every time He ate and drank with people He had their heart His dwelling.

As He so graciously does with us, and will continue through the Holy Spirit And the gathering of His church. At times it seems easy to follow Jesus. But Luke's Gospel records Jesus' own way of challenging this ease. He's basically calling into guestion the direction of our life, the values we claim to hold, and how we're living and embodying those values. He is asking us to look at ourselves rather than the sum total of our existence. Jesus won't let us turn away from the people and situations that are right in front of us or the future that is coming to us. Jesus recognizes and holds before us the tension in which we live. On the one hand we say to him, "I will follow you wherever you go." On the other hand we say to him, "But first let me go and" You probably know what that's like. We all do. In one sentence we pray for reliefand yet deep-down hope it doesn't cost me too much of anything to dig up or give up or live without. Part of that tension is a constantly changing daily life. Even if you're bored its somewhat worse because life moves right by you, without you. The Jesus' mission entourage is moving again. They are "going on the way." (In all 4 gospels, Jesus mission is always written as "on the way.") Specific places are not identified today - Luke demarcates history, not geography. The point is on movement and commitment [faithfulness]. A would-be follower asks to follow Jesus. He will follow Jesus no matter where he goes. Jesus responds by talking about the difficulties of itinerant life of following. Message: Be aware. If you want to follow, you might be homeless. This was a terrorizing thought in the ancient world. No home, no family, no culture, no community, no identity. Total isolation. Today, people can be all alone in the home and be happy or miserable. Then, it was death. In pastoral work, with movement all over [as we've done], Every place is home and yet no place is home. In the early days of the church pastors in training [by the disciples] Made people return to their home of origin to "do church" While at the same time journey far on monthly trips to reach ALL with the Gospel. Home was a safe hub, but not the only ministry centre. That's why when I left the Seminary they flung as far west [so they said]. But this passage isn't about ministry families, It's about believing families. Following Jesus can leave you without a true sense of home. Or this life of faith may ask other things of you that are tough to give up. We easily let our preconceived ideas that "were so good" and all the others are so bad Or they all go to church so why bother seeing if they follow Or why bother acting like a Christian....?! It's a tension. But an easy tension. Love God Love your neighbour as you love yourself. Easy. Love God by having faith in Jesus and following. Which is a gift from God anyway. Love others. Be patient. Listen. Help. Encourage. Re-direct, correct, serve, befriend. Things we know. Things we think are easy, But if you really think about it we don't do them. Not always. Not willingly. That's the tension, the stress we feel when we don't want to do it. BUT being on the side of people in need is at the core of our Lord Jesus' values.

Jesus doesn't dominate the other, avoid the other, colonize the other, intimidate the other, demonize the other, or marginalize the other. He incarnates into the other, joins the other in solidarity, protects the other, listens to the other, serves the other, even lays down his life for the other.

Brian D. McLaren #DROPTHESTONES He's going the way for this very mission. The direction is facing —head on, face first -- Down the Jerusalem Road. Sounds easy enough. Seat of God, the Temple, the ancient faith. Like following Jesus means just going to church...But it's so much harder and messier to follow Jesus in real life. We're all in favor of love, hospitality, forgiveness, and mercy until we meet the unlovable, the stranger who scares us, the unforgivable act, the one who throws the first punch, or the person who makes our life bitter. Then it's a different story and that story usually begins with, "Oh, but first...." Jesus puts no qualifications, limitations, or exceptions on where he's going, who is included, or what he's offering. He doesn't care

who we are, where we're from, or what we've done or left undone. And that goes for ALL of His followers. In Christ there's no why, no conditions, attached to love, hospitality or forgiveness. There's absolutely no room for BUT FIRST.... "But first" is our condition on the unconditional. But first – let me bid farewell to family....let me bury my dead father....In God's kingdom, traditional loyalties get all re-arranged. Even one's family, and one's obligations to them, takes second place. This should not be surprising. The family is the tradition par excellence. Each person is the product of generations upon generations of ancestors. Each person is the living face of old family trees and investments and legacies. We are contemporary embodiments of "the past." But In God's kingdom, we're not defined by our past –but by our future.

This is why focusing on the past-maintaining strict duty to traditional practices, placing one's tradition above "the way of the Lord"-does not leave one "well-placed" for following Jesus and having life in His name. For Jesus, "the way" only goes forward. Elijah and Elisha had been allowed to pass on the prophetic mantle. That was then. In Jesus, the now is to look to His road and no more "looking into the past." We honour those who've gone before us best by honouring God and in doing so, honouring His Son Who calls us to partner with Him and honour the true Christian FAMILY - the Father, Son and Holy Spirit --And all the faithful He abides in. There's no more room for backing our way into the Kingdom while keeping an eye on the door. We can't walk backwards into our future, not wanting to see or deal with what is before us. We're plowing a row in a field, looking back – which makes a very crooked mark in the soil. Jesus makes straight what LONG has been crooked. He is the Son of Man. Exalted as a man for all humanity on the cross, lifted high for all to see. Paying for ancient debts and future sins by His ONE death. His Blood gives us access to His way. Baptism into His Body makes us His followers. Eating and drinking His Body and Blood makes us little Christs to the world. All according to faith. Not steps up the Christian ladder Not looking back to see what was. Not keeping track of who's deserving and who isn't – God sees us ALL the same in the view of His Son's cross. This is what Jesus' GOSPEL IS ALL ABOUT - resolving ourselves, resolving our heart, in the way of our Lord. Living in this world, enjoying the light of Jesus shine from behind our faces and through the work of our hands, relating to others, letting the Spirit lead our steps. We know the path. We know the end of the journey. We know there's no other way. We follow best when we travel in Him. It's the Footprints poem so well known that completes this message - when we see just one set of footprints in our life of faith, it's never that we're alone or following by ourselves, IT IS THEN THAT CHRIST IS CARRYING US.
