COMMUNION AT THE RAIL:

This past Sunday, July 10, communion distribution returned to the method of receiving the Body and Blood of Christ at the rail. This had been the practice prior to the restrictions of the Covid Pandemic. A number of concerns were voiced since that Sunday. The following are the most common raised:

- 1) The time for the overall distribution was lengthy;
- 2) Worshippers visibly experienced a physical struggle going up and down the chancel stairs;
- 3) Worshippers displayed difficulty physically kneeling at the railing and then having difficulty rising back up again;
- 4) The voice levels in the pews with conversations during the distribution was distracting as this is also a time for prayer and reflection before receiving the Sacrament;
- 5) The former Pilgrim Style method of distribution may be preferred. The common cup will still be offered as well.

Since returning to pre-Covid practices has been the motive for the benefit of all worshippers, your feedback is appreciated. We ask your prayerful patience at this time as our church leaders, ushers and staff seek to act in the church's best interest. Please feel free to make your concerns known to Pastor Todd or Judy Slingerland following the service or in the days ahead. This is helpful so that how we serve is for the glory of God and the building up of you and all members of the Body of Christ.

The Old Testament: Genesis 18: 1-14

And the LORD appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the door of his tent in the heat of the day. He lifted up his eyes and looked, and behold, three men were standing in front of him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent door to meet them and bowed himself to the earth and said, "O Lord, if I have found favour in your sight, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree, while I bring a morsel of bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant." So they said, "Do as you have said." And Abraham went quickly into the tent to Sarah and said, "Quick! Seven quarts of fine flour! Knead it, and make cakes." And Abraham ran to the herd and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to a young man, who prepared it guickly. At the appointed time I will return to you, about this time next year, and Sarah shall have a son."

The Epistle: Colossians 1: 21-29

[St. Paul writes:] And you, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil

deeds, he has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before him, if indeed you continue in the faith, stable and steadfast, not shifting from the hope of the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed in all creation under heaven, and of which I, Paul, became a minister. Rev. Todd Hoeffs Pentecost 6 Scripture: Luke 10:38-42 July 17, 2022

In the name of the Father and of the Son + and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

You have a very long list of things to do in a day.

Laundry Garbage Meals Shopping Pick up from work Take the dog to the vet Yard work Whom to phone That's its own list – The listing goes on, And it's so easy finding all sorts of new things to add to it. My problem – I will create a list – And then forget to look at it – As if making the list was the biggest job and now I'm done! So where is Jesus? Is He at the top of the list? I hope not. If there's anywhere Jesus doesn't want to be, it's on our to-do lists.

If you want to forget about someone fast, put them on a checklist.

Out of sight, out of mind, done. Check!

Just look at Martha. She puts Jesus first. She's terrific at it.

Jesus comes. Jesus enters. And she receives Him into her home. Jesus is on the top of Martha's list. But her list is long. And now, having received Him into her home, she's on to the next thing. That's the problem with lists. You cross of what's accomplished, feels so good, and then you move

on. When Jesus and His Word becomes just another thing we "do",

And the people He gives you in your life become a to-do project, All of a sudden the One thing needful is equivalent to groceries. That ONE thing IS Jesus Himself the faith to see Him as the ONLY thing needed. In the best-case scenario of life, we--: Woke up and prayed this AM. Check.

We got to Church on Sunday. Check. Move on. I will take what I received and live it out this week. Check. That's best-case. In more believable scenarios of life the standard is far lower.

Sunday comes. You just don't feel like getting ready to go. Maybe there's too many other things left undone....Maybe the routine is broken...So and so still believes. Something's changed, diverted attention to other places or things...Jesus no longer makes it even to the check list....So many people have just -- moved on. That's the risk of putting Jesus first. The risk is that you check the box, and move on. And eventually, in a world full of better options, the One thing needful becomes the one thing optional. And so Jesus teaches us today that instead of being first,

HE DESIRES THE CENTRE OF OUR LIVES! He wants all of you, body, soul, mind, will, attention, all of it. The world doesn't revolve around you – you revolve around Him. Jesus refuses to be the first on a list of many things needful. He is the One thing, the ONLY THING needful.

Which means that every other thing, however necessary we think it to be, is not.

It may still be important. It may still need attention. But Christ in the centre prioritizes our lives and out hearts. Puts everything into perspective. Mary sees this. That's why she's sitting down at Jesus' feet. It's the position of a disciple. A place for learning. Like kids sitting at a K teacher's feet while reading a book.

In Mary we see the picture of discipleship that our Lord gives us in Matthew 28.

....Go out...baptize and teach people to observe all what I have given to you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

In Holy Baptism Jesus made His home with you. In fact, He and you are ONE.

But that's not the end of it. Baptism, Catechism instruction, worship in the church, witnessing the faith – None of these are just once and never again. Jesus' Spirit holds you in the ONE thing needful And disciples you every day of your lives. Making disciples means mentoring followers which involves teaching But word and example. By listening and by sharing what is heard.

Mary is being *discipled*. She's not checking off a box. She's not moving on. Jesus is not first on her list. Jesus is central. He is her life. Everything else in her life now orbits around Him and His gifts.

Martha does not share that interest. And not because she is focused on serving as opposed to listening. Jesus scolds Martha here because her own anxiety and distraction Is sabotaging her own desire to offer true hospitality. Which involves welcoming Jesus for Who He is

Not what WE feel WE must do for Him. He tells us what is needed. He offers Himself as a sign of divine welcome and Mary receives it with listening joy. And she gets communion with the Word made flesh. We all get distracted and anxious with life's busyness. Doing too much good in too many directions is one way of thwarting your own desire to offer hospitality.

PROPER SERVING comes from PROPER VIEW OF JESUS & setting in your life.

He is the one thing needful. And he will not be taken away from Mary. We dare not risk the idea that service is NOT needed. Jesus doesn't need it, but your neighbour does. You serve the person you see because you worship the Lord Who is unseen. Martha eventually learns this. Later when Mary and Martha's brother Lazarus dies. The sisters weep. Jesus raised him from the dead, and the week before His crucifixion, Jesus is a guest in their home again. Martha is serving. Mary is at Jesus' feet, anointing Him with oil. But this time there is no scolding for Martha.

She's not checking boxes anymore. Her serving has taken on a new character. She's been at Jesus' feet, too. She saw the Living Lord make her brother come back to life And breathe new life into her. She's no longer anxious and troubled about many things, and she doesn't insist that Mary be either. She is free. And in the freedom Christ gives, everything is different. When you have the ONE thing needful, Life is overflowing with hope. Hope won when Jesus became the ONE NEEDED sacrifice on the cross. Where He dies for Mary, Martha's sins, yours, mine and the world's. After all, He did not come to be served but to serve. And to give His life as a ransom for many. You are ransomed. You are free. Free from condemnation. Free from the spiritual checklist. Free to live a resurrected life right now. With Jesus at the very center of it all. This makes others your centre in life. Your family, friends, neighbours. Your choices are informed by Christ-centred living, For the good of those in your life and their well-being.

Compassion

A way of living

Not a way of being - like lists and things and running around

Christ is the one thing needful.

To all of you, His disciples, He will not be taken away from you.

And you will not be taken away from Him.

And life in Jesus goes from good to better.
