



The Old Testament: Deuteronomy 30: 15-20





The Epistle: Philemon 1-21

Paul, a prisoner for Christ Jesus, and Timothy our brother, to Philemon our beloved fellow worker and Apphia our sister and Archippus our fellow soldier, and the church in your house: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I thank my God always when I remember you in my prayers, because I hear of your love and of the faith that you have toward the Lord Jesus and for all the saints, and I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective for the full knowledge of every good thing that is in us for the sake of Christ. For I have derived much joy and comfort from your love, my brother, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed through you. Accordingly, though I am bold enough in Christ to command you to do what is required, yet for love's sake I prefer to appeal to you—I, Paul, an old man and now a prisoner also for Christ Jesus—I appeal to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I became in my imprisonment. (Formerly he was useless to you, but now he is indeed useful to you and to me.) I am sending him back to you, sending my very heart. I would have been glad to keep him with me, in order that he might serve me on your behalf during my imprisonment for the gospel, but I preferred to do nothing without your consent in order that your goodness might not be by compulsion but of your own accord. For this perhaps is why he was parted from you for a while, that you might have him back forever, no longer as a bondservant but more than a bondservant, as a beloved brother—especially to me, but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord. So if you consider me your partner, receive him as you would receive me. If he has wronged you at all, or owes you anything, charge that to my account. I, Paul, write this with my own hand: I will repay it to say nothing of your owing me even your own self. Yes, brother, I want some benefit from you in the Lord. Refresh my heart in Christ. Confident of your obedience, I write to you, knowing that you will do even more than I say. This is the Word of the Lord.

The Holy Gospel: St. Luke 14: 25-35


The Holy Gospel, according to St. Luke, the 14th chapter: Glory to You, O Lord.

Now great crowds accompanied [Jesus], and he turned and said to them, "If anyone comes to me and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. For which of you, desiring to build a tower, does not first sit down and count the cost, whether he has enough to complete it? Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it begin to mock him, saying, 'This man began to build and was not able to finish.' Or what king, going out to encounter another king in war, will not sit down first and deliberate whether he is able with ten thousand to meet him who comes against him with twenty thousand? And if not, while the other is yet a great way off, he sends a delegation and asks for terms of peace. So therefore, any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple. "Salt is good, but if salt has lost its taste, how shall its saltiness be restored? It is of no use either for the soil or for the manure pile. It is thrown away. He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to You, O Christ.

Lay down your sorrow, calm your fear, the Father bids you come; With open arms He welcomes you, to your eternal home.



Scripture: St. Luke 14:25-35

Title: "Holy Hate"

September 4, 2022 + 10 AM

We've all grown up with hearing "GOD IS LOVE". Today's Gospel sounds more like "God is hate"? Hate is hard to hear. Hate has a whole new revived place in our world today, too. It's in politics, entertainment, news, almost every corner of life. We have laws against speaking or writing "hate speech". Unfortunately, outlawing hate, as admirable as it might seem, won't ever stop hatred. Not in this lifetime. Jesus in His wisdom shows us how to love....and how to hate. Yes. How to hate. The crowds around Jesus are still too much in love with what He produces for them. They like His celebrity status. Jesus' disciples (& us) see & hear this so He must set everyone straight. Following Him around will end up in suffering. We all must prepare for some measure of suffering. So...Hate family? Hate parents? Hate our spouse? Hate our kids? Hate what we love most dearly to follow Jesus? Doesn't Jesus love the human family? Hate your own life? I thought we're supposed to love ourselves like we love our neighbour? Hating today in our world involves a passionate detest and a strong dislike for someone or something. Even wishing someone dead. Eradicating anything apprehensible & evil from our lives. But in the ancient world...hating one's family means something different. Hating family means injuring them by causing them public disgrace. In a world where name and reputation mean everything, public embarrassment is a death sentence. Life is family centered, and the honour of the family is of prime importance. Honour must be held as sacred by every family member. Kinda like what we all see in those old Godfather mafia movies. Family Loyalty. If some members of a family join a strange movement like Jesus is talking about, and abandon their home, this brings disgrace on the family. New religious movements rose up constantly and disrupted, even divided families. Letters survive to this day of some Roman families complaining that their son or daughter ran off and joined some group called the "Christians." Jesus' saying is still hard and all-encompassing. No other loyalties are to have precedence over journeying with Jesus "on the way" of discipleship. Hating one's own self means that the person disconnects from everything that has defined that person. So a person's past no longer defines who they are. One's identity is no longer formed by one's former allegiances, nor one's experiences in life, nor even one's human origin. These are part of the old world giving way to the new world of God's Kingdom in Jesus. His disciple must not be defined by the past, but by their work in the present and their future hope. And so, if we sit down reasonably and tally the costs—as Jesus himself suggests that we do—the only reasonable decision is to choose not to follow Christ. At least from an economic and cultural standpoint. But that is where the economics fail. Being a follower of Christ is not a numbers game.

It's not a question of giving up ONE THING (family, friends, possessions) in order to get SOMETHING FROM GOD in return. No, Jesus has something quite different in mind. A cross. Bear the cross, go after Jesus the way He calls us to follow and you're His disciple. Crosses kill. They torture criminals to death. To take up your cross is to take up your death. You can't follow Jesus without a cross. His way is the way of death before any hope of resurrected new life. That didn't even enter any minds yet.

It's hard getting past the death part. It stands to reason that if you can't die, you can't rise, and if you can't rise, well, you're kind of stuck in your unredeemable mess. Following Jesus now sounds dangerous, deadly even. But we don't want to misunderstand hating one's life and family. Its sounds like a choosing one over the other, but it isn't. It's re-arranging priorities and loyalties. Humanly speaking, we WANT to love our possession and the people in our lives because we get something out of it. Life in God's eyes isn't supposed to be transactional. That's not how He made us, and that's

not truly LOVE. SO hate them only to love them better, more, freely. Hate your sinful life so that you can love Christ & desire what He desires which always begins and ends with loving God 1st! We can only truly love our families and ourselves when we 1st love God and Jesus Christ, His Son. When you realize this life we live while it is a blessing and a joy it is but a dim shadow compared to the life that we have in Jesus and the life waiting for us in His Heavenly Kingdom.

This doesn't mean we take vows of poverty in this life to gain wealth in the next life. Jesus doesn't even say that His disciples will receive *different* or *better* families in return—He says they'll receive *more*—Jesus' way is of abundance, not scarcity. By leaving behind their families and their possessions, It's not an not an exchange for something better, but a prelude to something bigger—to the Kingdom to which Jesus promises those very same families are actually invited to be part of. Families and possessions get cared for best when they revolve around God. So DO count the cost. Do the math. Calculate the loyalties. We do it all the time. Like me, you may've recently filled up your car with gas. Sometimes at those stations which make you pay 1st. You got to figure out how much to buy before it's in the tank. Not my favorite kind of gas station....but that's how life often works. You set out to build something, and you get bids and work out the costs to make sure there's enough money available, otherwise you'll pour a foundation, run out of funds, and your slab of concrete will stand as a monument to your shortsighted lack of planning. We've all seen it. Many things stand partially finished. When a king goes to battle, he counts the cost of war.

Can he afford it? Can his ten thousand troops match his enemy's twenty thousand? And if they can't, he sends the peace delegation in to negotiate terms. Many of our decisions are economic more than anything else. Can we afford it? Will it break the bank? Is there enough money? We make important choices in our lives by counting the cost. And we're shortsighted fools if we don't. What's hard about following Jesus is that it costs everything...your own dear life. Dietrich Bonhoeffer says it best in his book "Cost of Discipleship": when JESUS calls us, He bids us to COME and DIE. Following Jesus on His road to die and rise is literally going to cost you your life before you gain any new life. Truth be told, if you ran the cost of following Jesus, you wouldn't.

If you counted the cost, you'd never come to Baptism, never trust in Christ, never follow Him. You'd never believe that eating a wafer of bread & a drinking in a sip of wine brings Christ into your life. No one would believe it. That's why God doesn't make following Jesus a choice.

No one would choose it. We don't take up our crosses willingly. No one wants to die before living. No one wants to love God and His Son 1st and then trust that their love at work in us will make us love our families the best way! We see death, and we run the other way as fast as we can. This is why Jesus calls coming to faith a "rebirth", being born anew from above, becoming a "new creation." Baptism is a washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. Seriously, would anyone want to be born if they counted the cost leaving the womb? Not a chance! This is why Jesus has to go the way of the cross alone. There is not a human being alive who'd be willing to take up his cross and follow. Even Simon of Cyrene had to be forced to carry Jesus' cross. We won't do that. The cost is too great. Jesus bears the cost of discipleship. That's the good news hidden in today's Lovingly hateful Gospel. Jesus bears the cost. He lays down His life to save the world. He becomes the world's Sin. He dies our Death. Jesus counted the cost of being the world's Saviour. Jesus counted the cost of rescuing you from your Sin and Death. And it was worth every drop of His holy, precious blood to save you.

He gave up everything that's His – His honor, glory, dominion, power, His entire life – and for the joy of your salvation, He took up His cross to save you. He didn't ask you to choose Him. He chose you. He baptized you. He called you by His Spirit. He put you on the path of life before you even knew it was happening. You were captive to Sin and Death, and God made you free in Christ. Before you believed, before you were born, before you ever were, Christ was your Savior and Lord and Redeemer.

Even if you came to faith as an adult and sought out Baptism, came to Communion later in life, you still didn't choose Him. He chose you. He made sure your life path twisted & turned back to Jesus.

He laid His cross on you, not to kill you, but to bring you life. People do want the most out of life.

And our God doesn't begrudge that. Life has work and dignity and value. But that most we want out of life begins by believing that nothing on earth can offer the most.

The most and best comes from Christ Who is in us.

He's greater than anything in the world.

And that colours our vision to see every other person out there as great because of Christ.

And you follow Him, even to death, in His death, to find life.

It's all by grace, gift, free, gratis in Jesus.

And that's not "cheap grace", that's free grace.

Free to you; costly to Jesus.

The cost of following is high.

But thanks be to God Jesus pays the cost in full.

By learning how to hate, we truly learn how to LOVE.

Amen.
