It is he alone who has immortality and dwells in unapproachable light, whom no one has ever seen or can see; to him be honor and eternal dominion. Amen.

The Holy Gospel: St. Luke 16:19-31

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Luke, the 16th chapter: **Glory to You, O Lord.**

"There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man's table; even the dogs would come and lick his sores. The poor man died and was carried away by the angels to be with Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. In Hades, where he was being tormented, he lifted up his eyes and saw Abraham far away with Lazarus by his side. He called out, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in agony in these flames.' But Abraham said, 'Child, remember that during your lifetime you received your good things and Lazarus in like manner evil things, but now he is comforted here, and you are in agony. Besides all this, between you and us a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who might want to pass from here to you cannot do so, and no one can cross from there to us.' He said, 'Then I beg you, father, to send him to my father's house—for I have five brothers—that he may warn them, so that they will not also come into this place of torment.' Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets; they should listen to them.' He said, 'No, father Abraham, but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.' He said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead.'

REV TODD HOEFFS PENTECOST 19 (series C) Scripture: St. Luke 16:19-31 Title: "You Never Give Me Your Money..." September 25, 2022

"Hungry. Homeless. Anything helps. God bless you". That's what's usually written in black marker on the cardboard signs people hold on the corners hoping for something from a driver. Some people give pocket change, or an extra cup of coffee or a bottle of water - We don't see them anymore, those folks on the corners. As we walk through life we don't notice them and don't even think about them. I've seen people walk by them on the sidewalk and give and angry stare to them-As if it's their fault they're begging, like they're an annoyance and shouldn't be there. As I waited for a cup of coffee at a Tim Horton's, a middle aged Asian man standing nearby Pointed to my collar and asked if I was a minister. I nodded. He asked what church and I told him. He explained about his apartment building nearby, how he's the landlord. "Do you attend church?" I asked. "Oh....I used to, many years ago....[pause]....I have church in my heart." "Many Christians do not have church in their heart." "One of my tenants – Goes to church every week, talks about being Christian, but he lies, he doesn't pay his rent on time, doesn't show being Christian very well..." "yes, that's a very poor witness". "Yes. Many many people in the world don't go to church but they have church in their hearts." Yes. God works through people everywhere - and church needs them. Going to church----church in the heart. That's an unforgettable conversation. And a profound lesson. Being aware of what we do and how we live is a vivid witness. Being aware of Lazarus is all that the rich man needed to do. He needed to care. The rich man in Jesus' story does not see Lazarus. And there are plenty of Lazarus' around. In some ways we are nowhere near the place Lazarus is in And in some ways it wouldn't take much to end up in the same place as Lazarus With the global economy as it is now. Too, too often, people are simply invisible to us. Daily Lazarus sits and begs at the rich man's gate. A gate to a house, with servants and guests and "lives sumptuously". Lazarus means "God is my help." And without a doubt, in the end God was the only help Lazarus had. This rich man isn't bad because he's rich, or because he never goes without what he wants or desires. The rich man's problem is ----he doesn't care. Lazarus is in need and is sick and weak and lays there hoping to even get a crumb from the table. Dogs come to lick his sores, which may seem touching but is the height of public embarrassment in ancient middle-eastern life. The Old Testament is very clear: Care for those in need around you, from within the house of Israel and even the "stranger ate the gate". All of our lives are caught up with one another in ways that have consequences now and consequences into eternity. For Jesus Christ is not only present in His believers but also in the lives and hearts and faces of those who have need. Anyone. And when we truly see others, notice others, we live in a way that acknowledges the truth that we all belong to one another. In this life. Right now. As we are our brother (and sister's) keepers. And again, the RICH MAN is not hell bound because of his riches nor that Lazarus is bound for Heaven because HE IS POOR AND DOWNTRODDEN. To Jesus' audience hearing this story then, it would've been shocking. A big role and class and religious reversal. Everyone, rich or poor fully believed that the rich were blessed by God and loved more than others, instantly added to the Heavenly Kingdom. It would be the poor Lazarus types going to hell 'cause God DIDN'T HELP THEM IN THIS LIFE WITH EARTHLY MEANS. So we shouldn't go away blaming ourselves that we do not focus all our energy on helping every beggar on every corner become comfortable like we are. It would be an impossible task and it wouldn't be enough. As much as Jesus loved and cared for the poor, sick and hurting in life, He also said "the poor you will always have." Does that mean if we give a few loonies to a guy on the corner we'll be in Abraham's bosom and not in Hell?!. No, that's not what this is about.

No amount of charity will buy your way into Heaven and will not reduce the vast space between Heaven and Hell. Lazarus is rewarded because he trusted in GOD FOR HELP, lived a lowly existence off the generosity of others, was cast away as garbage, ate the crumbs along with dogs and was a humble, meek person whom God helped in the end. The rich man, was happy in his riches, FEASTED SUMPTUOUSLY and, like the Pharisees heard from Jesus often, was a lover of money. There's a difference between being rich and a lover of money. Anyone can be a lover of money, for what you treasure is what you love. A lover of money is greedy, obsessed, doing whatever it takes to create more and more. Our Lord is concerned about all people in need.

As His dear siblings we daily reveal God's presence in our lives by sharing His concerns and by being HIS PRESNECE wherever we go. Helping people is important and we do so whenever and however we're able because that's simply who and how God's people are to be. The question isn't what's in it for me but what's in it for them. Remember, there is a relationship between this life and the next life. The choices we make, the words we speak, and the actions we take in this life matter today and when we reach the end of our lives. Our beliefs, our way of living out Christ in our daily walk, The church in our hearts offers a deep abiding relationship with God Who raises up the broken down through His Son. NO ONE is even ignored or unseen by God. He knows the secrets of all people's hearts. He knows our struggles, our fears, our worries, our sicknesses and hurts as well as our joys and delights and reasons to celebrate. We can all name times when life has been good, full, and easy. Likewise, we can name times when life has simply left us destitute, broken, and in sorrow and suffering. Jesus comes and offers us a way out. His life bridges the gap, that great chasm, which human sin and death have enlarged.. Our Lord, the Architect of the Universe,

became nothing, one from whom people hid their faces, a rabbi no one wanted to listen to much less look at. And yet as the world looked on Him whom they pierced with nails and a spear,

at the cross, the divide between life and death, have and have not is bridged with a blood stained crucifix. In fact the wall dividing humanity and God in the temple was torn in half from top to bottom. All have access to God, to Heaven, to hope and new life. ALL. Resurrected and living Jesus becomes the door all may enter through Into the joys of eternal life and rest. We've been drawn near to God as He's reached down into our lives through Baptism. Not only do we have free access,

but this is how the living Lord lives inside each one of us. The marking of His cross on us makes us then bridges of help to others. That's what an ambassador for Christ is – a bridge builder.

And so the divide becomes shorter in distance when we love our neighbor as ourselves, every time we love our enemies, every time we see and treat one another as created in the image and likeness of God, gates are opened and divides are made accessible. Christ's love, mercy, grace, and presence make it possible for us to open our gates in life and insure they do not become wide spaces which divide us. There's enough polarity in culture, politics and religion today.

We need more church in peoples' hearts. The fate for the rich man is doom. He desires no bridge, no help, no forgiveness. HE doesn't apologize. He doesn't think he should've lived differently.

He only asks for ease in the hellish life he sits in. His only concern is for his five remaining brothers. They're living the same kind of life he lived. And so they're at peril of the same fate. The rich man begs Abraham up in Heaven to warn them with a real shocker. Send Lazarus back from the dead. Wow! What an arrogant ask. Why Lazarus? They have Moses and the prophets. They have the word of God in their very midst, God's revelation in their sacred scrolls. let them listen or read those. It's all in there to care for others. But if someone should come back from the dead they'd change their ways. Nope, Abraham says if they don't listen to the Word of God they won't be convinced even if a corpse talks. Those who can resist the word of God in Scripture won't find it difficult to explain away some guy whose been dead. Many struggle believing in Jesus Himself rising from the dead! Humility of Lazarus shows us how rich we are because we belong to God. Our Lord offers a meal of welcome, where unknown guests are turned into friends and beneficiaries of grace.

God's forgiveness and the very Flesh and Blood of Jesus, Who has opened the path to paradise for all to eat and drink and live new lives by His Holy Spirit's work. This is what the kingdom of God looks like. We already have everything we need. That was Abraham's point in not sending Lazarus to the rich man's brothers. If they can't help those who are seen in need, how will they believe one they cannot see, God Himself, even when He rises from the dead. And He will. He did. Easter happened. Heaven restored. Nothing is lacking. In the message of the Gospel the world has all it needs to enjoy peace and new life. Sometimes we will be like Lazarus, lowly, meek, in need, dependent on the Lord; and sometimes we will be the rich man, feasting sumptuously on what the Lord provides, confident in our faith, able to see the LORD

in the face of those the LORD gives to us on our path.

We have so much to give.

All we are is from God.

All we have to share is His Son's Gospel.

And the church that is in our hearts.
