

YOUTH CATECHISM CLASS 2022—Christ Lutheran Church – Rev. Todd Hoeffs

Youth Catechism Class with Pastor Todd is a time for young people to see their own unique place in God's Story of love, acceptance, and new life in Jesus Christ. Scripture-rich lessons focus on our identity as Jesus' brothers and sisters through our Baptismal faith. ORDER OF HOLY BAPTISM

The Lutheran Church of Australia

SCRIPTURAL COMMAND

Our Lord Jesus Christ says: All authority in Heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to keep everything I have entrusted to you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.

ADDRESS

Scripture teaches that we are born sinful and unclean, but that our heavenly Father washes us clean in the waters of baptism. We are re-born as His children as the Holy Spirit renews us and gives us eternal life. Through baptism He graciously forgives us our sins and unites us with our Lord Jesus Christ, so that we share in His death and resurrection.

PRESENTATION

Who brings this child for holy baptism? We do. How is this child named? (Name is spoken)

ADMONITION

Since you as parents and sponsors have brought (Name) to be baptized, you are responsible for his/her upbringing in the Lutheran Church. Remember him/her in your prayers. Bring him/her to the services in God's House and teach him/her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed and the Ten Commandments. Remind him/her of her baptism, set him/her a good example, and provide for his/her instruction in the faith that he/she may join you and all believers around the Lord's Table to feast on Jesus' Body and Blood. Do you intend to joyfully do this? Yes, I/we do.

MARKING OF THE CROSS

(Name), receive the sign of the holy cross †, upon your forehead and upon your heart, to mark you as one redeemed by Christ the crucified.

GOSPEL PROCLAIMATION

Now receive the Good News of our Lord: As people brought children to Jesus that He might touch them, the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this He was extremely angry. He said: Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them, because the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. I tell you the truth; unless you receive the Kingdom of God like a little child you shall never enter it.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Let us ask the blessing of our Lord Jesus Christ on (Name) and pray together the prayer He has taught us:

Our Father, Who art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil; for Thine is the Kingdom, and the power and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

PUBLIC CONFESSION OF THE FAITH

I ask you now to publicly speak your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the Church, the faith in which we baptize.

Do you renounce the devil and all his works and all his ways?

Yes, I do renounce them.

Do you believe in God, the Father almighty?

Yes, I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of Heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord?

Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into Heaven, and sits at the right hand of God, the Father almighty, from thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the + life everlasting. Amen.

BAPTISM

(Name), I baptize you in the name of the Father † and of the Son † and of the Holy Spirit †. Amen.

May God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who has given you the new birth by water and the Spirit and has forgiven you all your sins, strengthen you with His Spirit, so that you receive eternal life. Amen.

PRESENTATION OF CANDLE

Receive this burning light. Live always by the Light of Christ and be ever watchful for His coming that you may meet Him with joy and enter with Him to the Marriage Feast of the Lamb in His Kingdom, which has no end.

Let your light so shine before others, that they see your good works and glorify Your Father Who is in Heaven.

PRAYER

Heavenly Father, we join with (Name's) parents in thanking you for giving them this child and for adopting him/her as Your own child in holy baptism. Strengthen him/her faith by Your Holy Spirit, so that his/her sinful self may die each day and he/she may rise to new life with Christ forever. As You have written his/her name in the book of life and have made him/her a member of the body of Your Son, guide him/her, so that, with all Your saints, he/she may one day abide in Your Heavenly Home; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

PRESENTATION OF BAPTIZED

Through Baptism, God has added this new brother/sister a member of the Priesthood we all share in Christ Jesus, that we may proclaim the praise of God and show forth His creative and redeeming Word to all the world:

We welcome you into the Lord's family. We receive you as fellow members of the body of Christ, children of the same Heavenly Father, and workers with us in His Kingdom.

The peace of the Lord be with you always.

And also with you.

When our love grows cold, warm us with the Light of Your Son, that with fervour we may love our neighbours and serve them for the sake of Jesus Christ, our Saviour and Lord, Who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**


THE WORD



The Epistle: 2 Timothy 1: 1-14

[St. Paul writes:] Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, for the sake of the promise of life that is in Christ Jesus, to Timothy, my beloved child: Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord. I am grateful to God-whom I worship with a clear conscience, as my ancestors did—when I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. Recalling your tears, I long to see you so that I may be filled with joy. I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that lived first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, lives in you. For this reason I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you through the laying on of my hands; for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline. Do not be ashamed, then, of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner, but join with me in suffering for the gospel, relying on the power of God, who saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works but according to his own purpose and grace. This grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Saviour Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. For this gospel I was appointed a herald and an apostle and a teacher, and for this reason I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know the one in whom I have put my trust, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that day what I have entrusted to him. Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. Guard the good treasure entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us. This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.



The Holy Gospel: St. Luke 17: 5-10

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Luke, the 17th chapter:

Glory to You, O Lord.

The apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith!' The Lord replied, 'If you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, "Be uprooted and planted in the sea", and it would obey you. 'Who among you would say to your slave who has just come in from ploughing or tending sheep in the field, "Come here at once and take your place at the table"? Would you not rather say to him, "Prepare supper for me, put on your apron and serve me while I eat and drink; later you may eat and drink"? Do you thank the slave for doing what was commanded? So you also, when you have done all that you were ordered to do, say, "We are worthless slaves; we have done only what we ought to have done!" 'This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Scripture: St. Luke 17:5-10

October 2, 2022

From a very small beginning can emerge a large, vibrant movement.

The Lutheran Women's Missionary League of Canada began this way as a small dedicated interest in supporting the work of the church at home and overseas.

In my 1st parish in Edmonton one of my [then] 88 year old shut-ins was Ellen Witte.

She became the founding member of the LWML in the Alberta district back in the early 1940s. She would ride the city street car to the north end of the city to visit people in the hospital and mental institution. The street car would only take her so far. She had to walk the rest of the way – about 3 miles. So after summer passed and winter set it, she went back to her church to see who could help her get a ride there. A few visits led to a phone call and a meeting of interested women.

From something small grew very large. Like the mustard seed faith. Faith comes by hearing, and hearing the Word of Christ. Faith also comes with splashes of water and the spoken Word of God. Baptism is a direct gift given out here in the church. You're saved by the Water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. And you are made part of the Body of Christ.

This belonging and sharing creates growth and maturity in what you believe. That faith given to a baby or a child or an adult is enough to last a lifetime. And yet Jesus' disciples ask Him to "increase" their faith. Most of us would find such a request intriguing. We'd offer them good prayer books, some educational Christian websites to visit, maybe download the free Luther's Catechism phone app. But Jesus? He brushes them off. No tips. No tricks. Not even much encouragement.

They want more, and Jesus tells them they need hardly any. Just a mustard seed's worth. We even pray for increases of faith. But in those prayers we are usually seeking strength or help. We don't mean to say small faith is bad, There's always the temptation to turn faith into something complex. Something you need to become an "expert" in. A never-ending quest to get more and more, better and better. Jesus tells the disciples that faith is simple. You just need a little to move mountains. That's not to say there's not room to grow and develop faith, but it's also not a journey to accumulate more insight or earthly things or status. This can even become a distraction to the kind of faith that Jesus actually gives. The faith of Jesus is about loving God and loving neighbour, not about getting more and more of something for yourself. When I first taught Kindergarten art class, children needed to know how much glue to squeeze out of the Elmer's glue bottle.

If you didn't teach them, they'd think you needed pools of glue for one little piece of paper.

So I showed them a dot of glue on a page and the catch phrase, "just a dab'll do ya."

When it comes to faith, sometimes a just a dab'll do ya. Why? Because faith is powerful.

It only takes a small light to pierce the darkness, and God doesn't require one to be a spiritual Jedi master to move in us, do things with us, or love us. Our faith is not a quantitative outcome, but a journey without specific roadmaps. Faith as a mustard seed, how small and insignificant.

It was a Roman condiment and an invasive weed, considered an insulting example to the Jewish people. Small in seed but fully grown, can be tall and wide with great branches!

And while expecting a mulberry tree with very long deep roots to pick up and go into the sea (which in that region would be salt water) is such a far-fetched illustration of how minute faith can do ANYTHING. With faith, size does not matter. But there are times when we all think our faith, big or small, is lacking.

If I just had more faith I wouldn't have so many questions or doubts.

If I just had more faith God would answer my prayers.

If I just had more faith my loved one wouldn't have died.

If I just had more faith I would be a better person, a better parent, a better spouse.

If I just had more faith I would know what to do,

I would handle things better. If I just had more faith life would be different.

It is an approach to faith at least as old as the disciples' own faith. In fact the Jewish faith at the time believed in levels and strengths of faith, big and small, weak and powerful. Those in high privileged religious standings of course had A LOT of faith; those of lower standing or no standing had little or no faith. Jesus just warned them prior not to become stumbling blocks for others and wished them to forgive as often as an offender repents even if it's seven times seventy in one day. That will be difficult. It will be a challenge to live that way. "Increase our faith," is their response. It seems like a reasonable request. If a little is good then a lot must be better. Faith is not given to us in an envelope to be spent as currency in our dealings with God. Faith is not measured out according to how difficult the task or work before us. Faith is not a thing we can acquire or control. Faith is a gift which comes wrapped in relationship of trust and love. It means opening ourselves to receive Christ's life and giving that life-gift-offering to another. That faith-relationship is who we are as believers and is shown in how we live out that relationship. Faith is trust.

Believing and understanding that Jesus' Words and Actions are good and meaningful for us to take to heart. Think of a married couple's faithfulness. It doesn't mean they believe or agree with each other's ideas or even a particular understanding of marriage all the time. They're faithful because they've committed themselves to each other in love and trust. They're faithful because they continually give their life to the other and receive the other's life as their own. They're faithful because they carry with them that one relationship wherever they go, in all that they are and all that they do. So it is in our faith-relationship with Jesus. Faith will not, however, change the circumstances of our lives. Instead, faith changes us. Living in faith does not shield us from the pain and difficulties of life, it does not undo the past, and it will not guarantee a bright future. Rather, faith is the life-condition given by God in Christ with which we face and deal with the circumstances of life – the difficulties and losses, the joys and successes, the opportunities and possibilities. Faith is hard when the believing gets tough because it's not seen or measurable. We can't point to it or turn it on when need arises. It's always there, like the ground beneath our feet. We take it for granted. We think it's gone but in reality it's inside of us, deeply rooted and sustaining. And even if you feel you've lost it doesn't go away. It's there, helping you live under God's grace when sins rear their ugly head. Faith doesn't get us a pat on the back, a reward, or a promotion in God's eyes. It is simply the way in which we live as His people. In openness to, trust in, and love for Christ. Allowing Him to guide our decisions, our words, and our actions. We've received His forgiveness even when we didn't think we needed it or did anything wrong. We've been totally and completely supported by Him in both life and death. In His life and into His death. In His cross, His suffering, His Bleeding, His dying, and in that sacrifice we are transformed. For you and I serve One who came not to be served but to serve and to lay His life down for all. He's the Suffering Servant who bears the sins of the people. He is the Master who calls His servants from the field at the end of the day and doesn't interrogate them over what they've done or haven't done. He doesn't make them wait on Him, He serves them. He invites you to His Holy Meal. He prepares you, washing your feet, cleaning up your life. He feeds you with His food and drink. While you're feeling unworthy, He's saying to you, "Well done, good and faithful servant." It's all by grace, free gift, unearned, undeserved. Grasped by FAITH! Faith is how we live; the lens through which we see ourselves, others, and the world; the criterion by which we act and speak. No matter where we go, no matter what we face we do so in relationship with the One who created, loves, sustains, and redeems us. We truly grow and remain stable in our daily walk because we are people of faith; We have enough faith, even mustard seed sized faith. Jesus believes that is plenty. Jesus gives that. That's good enough for us. It may not always answer every concern, but it shows us the ONE Who's deep concern for us has been answered by a cross and open tomb. And that same faith will tell us that dying and rising in Jesus is our way, too. This changes us in our relationship to our Lord and in the lives of others. We respond in faith, in our words and actions, and listen for the good word of our Lord, "well done, good and faithful servants" for living in that deeply seated mustard seed faith. Amen.
