



God save our Gracious King, long live our noble King, God save the King. Send him victorious, happy and glorious, Long to reign over us –God save the King.



REV. TODD HOEFFS All Saints' Day Scripture: 1 John 3 & Revelations November 6, 2022

At the atheist coffee group I attended for 7 out of 8 years in WPG, one of the more senior members of the group had been hospitalized... which spawned a discussion on funerals. "What happens when we die...?" one of them asked. Well, the dead body goes into the ground (or cremated) and the soul goes to be with God in Heaven.....or ...goes to the devil's place....One of them piped up, "so, I'd be bound to the eternal fire-place wouldn't I....???!!! © Not necessarily I said...a short pause...and then I asked -- "you believe in Jesus?!?....well...yes...he admitted, but not in a going to church kinda way..." Which made me ask, "well...do you have to go?" Another pause....the guy thought.... and responded..."I suppose I should want to go..."....well...our door is always open.... We never DO know where we will find faith... It's always a pleasant amazing surprise. Faith fuels our lives, moves us forward, out there into the space where everyday people dwell. This grows hope for the life in Heaven waiting for us, hidden away, safely guarded. Ist wonderful to see that faith in Christ does exist in so many different ways and in unexpected places and in so many faces!!! Economic troubles, war, hospitalization, illness, death, makes all people wonder. But without faith that wondering either continues seeking or ignores it and gets buried in the mind or with the Holy Spirit, the wondering rests confidently in Jesus. In an episode of the old 70s' All in the Family show regarding death, Archie commented -- "hey, we all fear death until the day it happens...then...ya never give it another thought..." © Apostle John, close to his own death, exiled on the Isle of Patmos, is given a heavenly vision by God (Revelation 1:9-11) Imagine the sight!

Angels, Jesus, light, maybe even his fellow brother apostles, who died for the faith. How comforting seeing his friends now safe. To see their suffering turned into joy. To see Jesus, the Lamb upon His throne. All His promises made, fulfilled, complete. And so for us, too. A large multitude no one could count. Family, friends, neighbours, strangers, famous people, Hollywood stars, singers, homeless, wealthy, politicians, queens, children, babies, aged, not to mention the number of faithful men and women from the Scriptures dating back to Adam and Eve. Even people we'd think are in hell are rather in Heaven, with the multitude. These *coming out of the great tribulation*.

That word tribulation means pressure, like when wheat is ground under a milestone, from a seed to fine powder. Sometimes life feels like that kind of heavy, relentless pressure. For life in this world is seldom easy.

There's hunger, thirst and tears. There's trouble, trials, and temptations. There's weakness, fear, and death. And we're a small remnant church across the globe, hunted and hounded by devilish

elements, harassed by people, cares, concerns, even by our own inner turmoil.

And we often fail. We often fall. We are often overcome. And we look at our lives we don't see peace or joy or blessing. We see trouble, difficulty, and decay. Yet, we live in hope.

Hope continues. Hope is outside of us yet penetrates our hearts where it does a lot of good.

There is much more than what our eyes see. Which is why John writes in his 1st letter,

that we are God's children now, so what we will be has not yet been fully revealed. Who we are and what we will be is hidden now in this world. Our identity in Christ is not always visible. Only God sees the cross of His Son on our foreheads and hearts. Our earthly resumes mean little in Heaven. When Jesus comes again, John's vision will be our reality. All God's promises, fulfilled, complete. That's why we as saints (all who believe and have life in Jesus) don't often look like saints on earth. The blessed don't often look blessed. In fact, they may look exactly the opposite. Those suffering don't look blessed. Those crying or hungering don't look blessed. The humble meek don't look blessed. The poor in spirit and all who thirst for righteousness don't look blessed. The merciful are often taken advantage of. The peacemakers, too. The pure in heart are mocked, and those who dare to speak of a unique Christ-centered way to live in this world, they can expect persecution. TRUTH & HONESTY is a much needed commodity today. With much upheaval here and in various nations. Yet, Jesus calls us all **blessed**. Over and over He says it. BLESSED --- is a poetic Bible term. Its any one whom God looks upon with the eyes of divine favour

and love. The Blessed are you and all whom God sees through His Son Jesus.

That sounds weird, maybe too overly positive. Isn't blessed to mean all my prayers are answered and God makes life easy? Isn't blessed when you win the \$65 million dollar lottery?

Isn't blessed supposed to look happy and have all you want. Blessed shouldn't suffer but be full and satisfied. Blessed is to have a great life, to be well-liked, *to have all your dreams come true*.

Blessed never means having an easy, stress free life or being popular or liked by all. Maybe it's time to realize that we don't know what blessed is, and need to learn from Jesus.

The blessed ones are ALL who believe in Christ, who trust His way, who are shaped by the cross and have life in His name. God's dear children. Blessed are those tortured, mocked, whipped, beaten, hand-cuffed and imprisoned faithful men and women and children.

The persecuted. How could they do what they did? How could they stand firm?

They dreamed bigger. They hoped, they trusted, for more than just his life, they had Christ...just as you do. North American persecution is far different – we face DISINTEREST, APATHY & INDIFFERENCE...there's just way too many forms of gods in our world to choose form... to take precedence over the One True God....which need not make us afraid, but MAKE US MOVE OUT IN FAITH AND ENGAGE THE PEOPLE WE MEET-- for there is a better, blessed way.

And this helps us stay focused that the church's mission, the purpose of our faith – which is -witnessing to the blessed life we have in Christ which helps us look forward in faith to a blessed death also in Christ. John's vision and the saints who have gone before us testify to that. The blood of the Lamb, the blood of Jesus, gives us the power to die a blessed death every day to our own sinful ways. It's also the blood of the Lamb, the blood of Jesus, that causes tribulation in this life. For the cross will always reveal a way of suffering before glory. That makes this life seem, at times, anything but blessed. But *blessed* are you, Jesus says. Even if you don't feel like it. Jesus didn't always look blessed either. Born with animals and laid in their feeding trough. Forced to flee a king who wanted to kill Him. Growing up in poverty. Second-guessed and harassed every step of the way. Arrested as a threat. Mocked, beaten, whipped, crucified. Jesus makes you blessed by dying as a cursed criminal. He died for all of us and then rose up from the dead to make sure you and I could die a blessed death and rise to blessed life. With Him. In Him. Made new and whole again. That is how got washed in the blood of the Lamb A complete makeover, sincleansed by Jesus' blood that flowed from His pierced side. A forgiving Blood. A life-giving Baptismal Blood. Life that is your life now. And you're washed anew when you're forgiven or hear the Gospel or confess your faith. Jesus Himself gives you His life when you eat His Body and drink His Blood. All of that makes you blessed. It's a way of living, not a marker to prove you believe. Here and now and for forever. Because living in Jesus, all that's His is yours. Even if it is hidden under suffering, tribulation, and death. But that doesn't make it not real. For hidden means it's here and real, now, today as it was then; you just can't see it. Apostle John saw it. And we believe it. For we, see it . . . by faith. Blessed is hidden in Jesus. And blessed is hidden in you, for He is in you. And when He appears, John says, we will be like Him. And this HOPE PURIFIES – because its from our LORD, beyond our knowing or ability, WHO sets us free and refocuses our eyes on JESUS Who has achieved our freedom, our blessedness. With this gift comes the joyful welcome of an entire gathering of the family of faith, on earth and in Heaven. In fact Heaven and earth meet right here in the church. At this altar. We worship with all the blessed dead who lived and died in the Lord and now rest in Heaven – hidden on the other side of this altar whom we see with eyes of faith and the loving memory. And when we dine upon Jesus' Holy Communion feast we dine with our loved one and all the great multitude of Saints no one can count. They join us every week. We are never alone.

They rest, we struggle. So on All Saints day we remember this. As with Remembrance Day in view the same saints who gave their last full measure In fighting wars to end suffering and terror and oppressive governments. We give thanks for this.

This is a blessed hope. As we are the blessed still. Amen.
