


THE SCRIPTURES

REV. TODD HOEFFS Christ the King Sunday (series C) Scripture: Luke 23 Unforgettable, that's what WE are November 20, 2022

In 1925, Christ the King Sunday 1st appeared on the Christian calendar. After the death and destruction of WW 1 and the growing disenchantment with faith and God, this festival was chosen to exemplify Jesus' Lordship over death and life. Even after soldiers from every country in Europe and North America killed each other on a scale never seen before, Jesus is still in control, showing His power and glory in suffering and dying on behalf of this bomb-cratered, entrenched, obliterated world. In His dying, He remembers all and gathers all into His embrace, as a King holding His subjects in the palms of His nail-scarred hands. One of the greatest human fears is being forgotten. "Jesus, remember me". That haunting plea from a thief on the cross that day near Jesus echoes a cry that arises deep within each one of us. We all know how important it is to be remembered. Thoughtfulness is a sign of love, respecting someone enough to hold them in your memory. The social media and Facebook/Twitter life style now is built around the need to be heard and remembered. Pictures and statements can be put out there, and unless the selected audience "likes" it immediately or offers a smiley face, that person feels unwanted and forgotten. Social media recognition must be immediate and can stay there for undocumented lengths of time. Its great communication and at the same time can give a false sense of reality. Remembering is an important part of our lives. Like your birthday, or a phone call, a letter, an email, text or visit. We all want to be remembered. It means that we matter, we belong, we exist, and our life is real. When we're remembered someone else bears witness to all those things. As people age remembering becomes more difficult. One of the main reasons senior adults do not want to move out of their home is because they're afraid they'll forget about life. The familiarity of a home changes when placed into an apartment or nursing home or hospital. It chips away at the memory until little is even remembered. It feels alive just being remembered. In being remembered, we are being made whole. Compare that with being forgotten. Forgotten is lonely, rejected, uncertain, afraid, maybe even angry. Questions and doubts arise. We're no longer sure of our place and whether we even belong. There was a time in the paradise of Eden when our first parents hoped that God would, in fact, not remember, but forget, as they hid themselves from the presence of the Lord after eating the forbidden fruit. Their sin and rebellion had broken the wonderful relationship with God, and now they live in fear. Sin makes them afraid to have God with them, They don't want Him to know what they've done. But isn't it far worse not to have God with us? To be alone? To be lost and abandoned? To be without God is to be without hope. Ever since Adam and Eve's sin, like them, we, too, have been outside the

gates of paradise, longing to return. And this is what Jesus assures the penitent thief on the cross. At the place of the Skull Jesus binds together His people.

"When I am lifted up from the earth", Jesus says, "I will draw all people to Myself". Crucifixion. Brutal execution by stripping naked, whipping, and nailing to a cross through the hands and feet was carefully crafted by the Romans to inflict the maximum amount of pain and degradation.

They wanted to kill not only the individual but also any followers. That is to say, by demonstrating their iron-fisted authority over Jesus, the Romans hoped to kill any aspirations in any of his followers to "take up their cross and follow." In the midst of the death and brutality, in a turn-around moment in time, all orchestrated by the same Jesus hanging there helplessly, a thief asks to be remembered. And that is faith; simple, child-like, trusting faith. In response, Jesus assures him of a homecoming. He assures him that he will not be alone or abandoned: Today you will be with me in paradise! What Adam and Eve had lost, Jesus has regained, and he freely shares what he has gained, first with the penitent thief and then with all who cry out in faith and trust to Jesus: "Remember me when you come into your kingdom." The thief wants to be remembered.

He's not asking to simply be thought about. What good does that do him? " Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." That thief seems to understand an awful lot about a man He barely knows. Who knows what he believes or has heard or saw of Jesus beforehand.

He heard Jesus forgive THEM for they knew not what they were doing as they pounded the nails into Jesus and lifted Him up on the cross. Maybe this thief takes a chance that he is a part of THEM who get forgiven?! He's a dis-membered child of God wishing to be made whole.

Jesus is going to that Paradise and so is that thief. The Son of Man restores a son of man, makes complete what Adam and Eve broke. We also want to be remembered, to have the many pieces of our life put back together. Our cry to be re-membered is also a recognition and confession of our dismemberment. Sometimes it happens through the circumstances of life; loss and grief, shattered dreams, disappointment, regret, failures, the death of family and friends. Other times it comes about through our actions, our words, even our thoughts. Our life becomes fragmented and broken. When that happens, we can easily become thieves. We take what is not ours.

We dis-member others' lives to put our own back together. It happens in all sorts of ordinary ways: anger and resentment, criticism, judgment, envy, comparison and competition, gossip, bad mouthing another, perfectionism, the need to be right or in control, busyness, excessive productivity and efficiency. Look at your relationships. Wherever there is strain, hurt, brokenness,

chances are that you or another are being dis-membered, forgotten, torn apart. That's not the life God gave us. That's not His wonderful dream or hope for us. A world created good.

A people made in His good image. The cross is the ultimate sacrificial, perfectly good act,

God's glory in remembering His people, His "good" world: God in Christ joining and aligning the world to Himself; coming right up next to us in the pain and suffering of this life. Dying that we might have life in our dying. Remembering all who forget Him time after time. Remembering is always an act of love. God remembers us in Baptism. We are washed into Jesus' Blood bathed resurrected Body, We live in that bond whenever we worship and remember our baptismal identity.

We remember Christ when we eat His Bread and drink His Cup, the Holy Communion, participating in His cross. A sinful part of our very self dies and our new life in Christ stands up new, alive, put back together. Every time we participate in the life of Christ we're living-out mercy,

compassion and forgiveness. Every time we speak a word of hope and encouragement; every time we love without condition, expectation, or payment – we participate in Christ's remembering of our own lives, the lives of each other, and the life of the world. We "do this in remembrance of [Jesus]." Paradise is a promise of opening the door for all who are remembered by God through Christ on the cross. Remembering is neither about the past nor the future; it's about today. Being truly present in the presence of Jesus. In whatever our life circumstances might be. We are forever and always re-membered.

Made whole by Jesus' Blood, Life and Spirit.

Even though death will one day separate our body from our soul, Our ashen remains will be re-knitted back with our soul in Paradise when the new heavens and new earth come to be when the time is right with God.

When the unknown day and hour of the end comes to completion.

Paradise anew.

All welcomed into God's Kingdom.

Remembering all of His unforgettable children.
