

INTRODUCTION:

The word "Chrismon" is a trademark, a combination of the first letters of "Christ" and "monogram". Chrismons were first made by Mrs. Harry Spencer of Danville, Virginia in 1957. Chrismons have great education value in the church, especially for the young. As we learn about what each Chrismon means they move us to worship the Lord, whom the shymbolds represent. There are many different chrismons on our Chrismon tree. In our worship service today we will learn about 12 different kinds of chrismons.

Scripture 1: Isaiah 9: 2-7

The people in walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned. You have enlarged the nation and increased their joy; they rejoice before you as people rejoice when diving the plunder. For as in the day of Midian's defect, you have shattered the yoke that burden them, the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor. Every warrior's boot used in battle and every garment rolled in blood will be destined for burning, will be fuel for the fire. For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The zeal of the LORD Almighty will accomplish this.

NATIVITY SYMBOLS – remind us that God very often starts at the bottom. His first point of contact with humanity is generally the insignificant and powerless: the poor, the uneducated, the children. That should give pause to those who are totally bent on getting wealth, power and fame, shouldn't it? At the manger, the rich and powerful came to humble themselves before a poor, helpless unknown child. God, as He so often does, messes with our minds and turns our world of ideas upside down.

MANGER

The manger reminds us of Jesus' humble beginning. Jesus was born during a Roman census and everyone had to go to their own hometown to register. Joseph' hometown was Bethlehem. Jesus' mother Mary gave birth in Bethlehem and placed Jesus in a manger because there was no room available in the inn.

Scripture 2: Luke 2:1-7

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to their own town to register. Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.

ANGEL:

Angels are servants of God who carry out His will. Angels often deliver messages from God to God's people. The Chrismon angel reminds us of the angel Gabriel who told Zechariah and Elizabeth that they would be the parents of John the Baptizer, and who also announced to Mary that she would become the mother of Jesus the Saviour. A choir of angels announced the birth of Jesus to the shepherds around Bethlehem.

Scripture 3: *Luke 2: 8-14*

And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

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EPIPHANY STAR

The 5-pointed epiphany star is sometimes called the Christmas star. It reminds us of the star that God used to guide the wise men from the east to come to Jerusalem and look for Jesus whom they called the king of the Jews. The star went ahead of the wise men until it stopped over the place where the baby Jesus was in Bethlehem.

Scripture 4: Matthew 2: 1-2; Revelation 22: 16b

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him.

And Jesus says, "I am the Root and the Offspring of David, and the bright Morning Star.

PASSION SYMBOLS

Nobody in their right mind likes suffering. Yet we all have to face it in this life. That's the result of the first sin in the Garden of Eden and all the sins that have followed it. Life is filled with sickness, turbulence, violence and death. Why did Jesus go the hard way, choosing the troublesome route, fighting against all that harms us only to drink from the bitter cup of suffering? As we ponder this, we will realize that we not only need help when times seem favourable, but even more so when we struggler through the dame forms of trial and hurt. Jesus is the Suffering Servant, the Ransom Offering, the great physician Who can heal us from the toxic effects of sin and darkness.

THE SACRIFICIAL LAMB

When God delivered His people out of slavery in Egypt He punished the Egyptians. The last and greatest plague God sent on Egypt was the plague on the firstborn sons of the Egyptians. God did this to prove to Pharaoh who was testing Him that He alone was God. God commanded His people to sacrifice a Passover Lamb and to paint its blood on their door frames. In that way the destroying angel would see the blood of the Passover Lamb and pass over the houses of the Israelites and spare them. Jesus is our Passover Lamb. By faith in Jesus' death for us, God spares us His punishment. For Jesus Himself bore our punishment for our sins on the cross.

Scripture 7: *Isaiah 53: 4-6; John 1: 29*

Surely He took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, yet we considered Him stricken by God, smitten by Him, and afflicted. But He was pierced for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by His wounds we are healed. We all, like sheep have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all....And the next day John [the baptizer] saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!"

CHOIR ANTHEM:

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CHALICE

The chalice or common cup reveals why Jesus was born. Jesus was born to fulfill prophesy, pour out His life and die for the sins of the world. At the Last Supper Jesus began with the Passover Meal and shared the New Passover for His Holy Supper. Jesus shared the wine in the cup with His disciples and said that it is His blood for them and for all to drink for the forgiveness of their sins.

Scripture 5: *Matthew 26: 26-28*

While they were eating, Jesus took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to His disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is My body." Then He took the cup, gave thanks and offered it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you. This is My blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins."

LATIN CROSS

The cross is the most recognized and ancient of all Christian symbols. It reminds us of Good Friday. The cross of two wooden beams the Romans used to crucify Jesus and put Him to death. Jesus died on the cross to bring salvation, forgiveness and peace to the entire world. By His suffering we are healed and made right with God.

Scripture 6: *John 19: 16-18*

Finally, Pilate handed Jesus over to them to be crucified. So the soldiers took charge of Jesus. Carrying His own cross, He went out to the place of the Skull (which in Aramaic is called Golgatha). Here they crucified Him, and with Him two others --- one on each side and Jesus in the middle.

BUTTERFLY

Jesus died on the cross, laid in a borrowed tomb and rose to new life on the third day. Jesus rose from the dead with a glorious resurrected body. The caterpillar wonderfully represents this process of a coldness of death and then a warm, transformational life. The caterpillar begins by spending time in its tomb-like cocoon as if dead, only to emerge from the cocoon a glorious butterfly.

Scripture 8: *Luke 24: 36-44*


While the disciples were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost. He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds? Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and feet. And while they still did not believe it because of joy and amazement, he asked them, "Do you have anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate it in their presence. He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms."

DOVE AND SHELL

The dove and shell represent Holy Baptism. The dove represents the Holy Spirit who appeared at Jesus' baptism and descends upon all people when they are baptized. Shells appear near the water, the essential element needed for Holy Baptism.

Scripture 8: *Matthew 28: 19-20*

Jesus said, "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to keep everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

VICTORY SYMBOLS

We all like to win. We all like to think of ourselves as winners. The victory symbols remind us that we are – all of us. Christ gained the victory over sin, death and the devil; those things have no power over us anymore. Jesus gained the win and gives that triumph to us. With faith in our Lord, we are invincible; there is no way to lose in this world, or more importantly, in the next.

SHEPHERD'S STAFF

The staff is spoken of many times in the Old Testament. A shepherd used their staff to guide the sheep and to pick them up by the crook [curved portion] if needed. But the staff could also be used as a weapon by the shepherd to protect the sheep against wolves or other predators. Truly this is an ancient and comforting image.

The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want.

He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters.

He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me.

Thou 12repares a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over.

Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the LORD for ever.

Scripture 9: *John 10: 11-15*

Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep. So when he sees the wolf coming, he abandons the sheep and runs away. Then the wolf attacks the flock and scatters it. The man runs away because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep. "I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me— just as the Father knows me and I know the Father—and I lay down my life for the sheep.

FISH

Along with the cross and staff, the fish is one of the oldest symbols of the Church. The word for fish in Greek is spelled lota, Chi, Theta, Upsilon, Sigma and can be used as an acrostic. When using each of these five letters as the first letter of a word, they can form the sentence: Jesus Christ, Son, of God, Saviour. Early Christians under persecution used the sign of the fish to recognize one another. Scripture 10 Matthew 4:18-20

As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. "Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will send you out to fish for people." At once they left their nets and followed him

CROSS AND ORB

In this symbol the circle, or orb represents the world, and the cross represents the Kingdom of God. By placing the cross on top of the orb, this symbol shows the present and future reality of life on earth: through the Spirit and Jesus Christ the Church witnesses to the world, grows in faith, in works of love, and creates a way to receive peace. Even if it doesn't always look like it, Christ has overcome the world.

Scripture 11: *John 3: 16; 1 John 4: 9-10*

For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him might not perish but have eternal life. -----This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins

CIRCLE WITH I

In Greek the letters I (iota, theta, sigma) can be used as another acrostic. These three letters, can be explained as the first letters of Greek words spelling: Jesus, Christ, Saviour. Jesus Christ is the victorious Saviour for all.

Scripture 13: Matthew 1: 21; Hebrews 13: 8

She will give birth to a son, and you are to give Him the name Jesus, because He will save His people from their sins. ----Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.

CROWN
