

What does Cheez Whiz have to do with downtown's St. George's Anglican Church?

Cheez Whiz sandwiches are just one of the breakfast options that are being served at St. George's every day, <u>365 days a</u> <u>year</u>, for over 25 years. Each morning a team of 6-8 volunteers arrives at 6:30 a.m. to make porridge, coffee, sandwiches and cereal for the many in our community who are unable to provide themselves with a nutritious breakfast.

These volunteers are not just members of St. George's. They manage the program but depend on many others from the community to help with the day-to-day preparation, as well as donations from many in order to feed the hungry. Christ Lutheran Church has agreed to help by making February "Cheez Whiz" month. We will be collecting donations of jars of CheezWhiz (LARGE SIZE PLEASE, +900g.) to contribute to the pantry there. There will be a box in the narthex, starting next week, where you can place your donation.

If you prefer to donate \$20 or more and receive a tax receipt, place a cheque made out to St. George's Anglican Church in a separate envelope, and label it "for Breakfast Program", and put it in the offering plate. Make sure your name and address are included in order to get a tax receipt. The cheques will be taken to St. George's when the jars of CheezWhiz are delivered. You can also donate directly on their website: **stgeorgesanglican.ca** Click on "Contact" at top right and then go to bottom of screen where it says "Donate Now". Click on "Breakfast Program" where it says FUND and mention you are from Christ Lutheran Church in the message box.

Perhaps you want to help make and serve breakfast too. With as little a commitment as one morning a month to serving as a mentor once a week, there is a place for more help. If you might be interested in volunteering, speak to Wendy Kuenzel (289-990-4236) to get contact info.



GOD SPEAKS TO US

The Old Testament: Exodus 24: 8-18

Moses took the blood and threw it on the people and said, "Behold the blood of the covenant that the LORD has made with you in accordance with all these words." Then Moses and Aaron, Nadab, and

Abihu, and seventy of the elders of Israel went up, and they saw the God of Israel. There was under his feet as it were a pavement of sapphire stone, like the very heaven for clearness. And he did not lay his hand on the chief men of the people of Israel; they beheld God, and ate and drank. The LORD said to Moses, "Come up to me on the mountain and wait there, that I may give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction." So Moses rose with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up into the mountain of God. And he said to the elders, "Wait here for us until we return to you. And behold, Aaron and Hur are with you. Whoever has a dispute, let him go to them." Then Moses went up on the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. The glory of the LORD dwelt on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it six days. And on the seventh day he called to Moses out of the midst of the cloud. Now the appearance of the glory of the LORD was like a devouring fire on the top of the mountain in the sight of the people of Israel. Moses entered the cloud and went up on the mountain. And Moses was on the mountain forty days and forty nights.

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

The Epistle: 2 Peter 1:16-21

For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. For when he received honor and glory from God the Father, and the voice was borne to him by the Majestic Glory, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased," we ourselves heard this very voice borne from heaven, for we were with him on the holy mountain. And we have the prophetic word more fully confirmed, to which you will do well to pay attention as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts, knowing this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture comes from someone's own interpretation. For no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man,

but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Gospel: St. Matthew 17: 1-9

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Matthew, the 17th chapter: Glory to You, O Lord.





Transfiguration Sunday (Series A)
Scripture: St. Matthew 17 & 2 Peter
February 19, 2023
"Renewal always outshines regret"

Change can be scary, but you know what's scarier?
Allowing fear to stop you from growing, evolving, and progressing.

There's a saying: People don't change. Circumstances change people. As if to say, people don't want to or can't change – on their own. A life change, changes them. [My MOM! Personal example here.] And you never get a 2nd chance to make a 1st impression. If you see what they're like in your 1st encounter, believe it. This is all a bit of cultural wisdom. What's kinda missing is the WAY a circumstance can change us. The way we CAN make better impressions on people. Circumstances DO play a big roll in affecting how we react. A physical move; A marriage [a divorce] A health crisis Your child in trouble. Your best friend dies.

Change in life's circumstances can only be navigated by Jesus. HE is the WAY we change and transform through the circumstances. Change in life can be scary; but what's even scarier? REGRET. So many people's minds are filled with thoughts of "what IF I would've done that..." or "I wish I would have chosen this..." Fewer events in life bring unhappiness than regret. As Christian people, we're not meant to live in regret. We can be reflective. We can take stock of our life. We can weigh our decisions. We can take accountability and accept responsibility.

But we can't live in regret. Regret worries about what might have been or what will be.

We have today. And for that, we live in HOPE. We are a people of Hope, as followers of Jesus.

Hope does not disappoint us. Hope strengthens our daily walk. Hope is born out of God being good to His Word. Which is bringing each of you through tough times Because Jesus has paved the way.

The circumstance of change on the mountain with Jesus Has forever brightened our walk in this life. Jesus' transfiguration. In Greek its metamorphosis – the inner DIVINE GOD LIFE Is shining through His human flesh and bone and person. Change in His appearance, Which changed Peter, James and John. Little did they know what they'd see and hear and experience with their rabbi. They are transfigured, too. Their understanding of Who Jesus is changed. It didn't make sense, but would all come into clear faith later on the day of Pentecost with the sending of the Holy Spirit.

Peter later puts pen to paper to write his letter -- As an EYEWITNESS TO JESUS' GLORY.

You are eyewitnesses of His glory. Week after week you hear and sing of the Lord's glorious work among His people. Today, Transfiguration Sunday marks the climactic end of our Epiphany season in the church. The Glory of God come down to earth is seen by 3 disciples, now they see Him ifferently. New. Bright. Caught up in something out of this world! Looking like God. Hearing that booming voice from up above the Heavens. More than Peter, James and John expected. There are times we look at our life, our circumstances, and we want more. We want our lives new.

We want to forget our regret. There's a restlessness, a searching, and longing for something else. We're tired of listening to the same old news. We want a new job, a new car, a new relationship. Maybe we take up a new hobby, go on a trip, or work extra hours. But not much changes. It's less about the stuff around us, it's about us. The desire for something more generally means that we've been living life at the shallow end of the pool. Life and relationships may have grown superficial. In some ways life at the surface is easier, more efficient, encouraged and rewarded by much of the world today. It fails, however, to see and experience that we and the world have already been transfigured and look forward to the fulfillment when Jesus returns on the Last Day. Life on the surface keeps us judging the circumstances. If it's pretty, pleasing, and shows us what we want to see then God is good and life is as it should be. When we don't see what we want then we often look for a new picture. Peter liked what He saw on the mountain, and yet he didn't fully grasp it. Jesus, Elijah, Moses, a cloud, a voice, glowing clothing, bright light, must've looked incredible. Peter didn't have Hollywood movies to spoil his expectations. It would've made him speechless. And afraid. Everyone wanted to see a heavenly vision, few got the chance. If Peter can only build a tent for it, to save it, imagine what everyone else would think of this, of him?! We do not need to see new things. We need to see the same old things with new eyes. We do not need to hear a different voice or a different Word. We need to hear the same old voice and the same old story with different ears. We do not need to escape the circumstances of our life. We need to be more fully present in those circumstances. When this happens life is no longer lived at the surface. These are the transfigured moments, moments when the picture of our life has become a window into a new world and we come face to face with the glory of God at work in us. With Jesus we discover the God who is beyond circumstances. The Mount of Transfiguration becomes a new way of seeing, a new way of hearing, and new way of being. Jesus did not suddenly light up and become something he was not. Jesus' light opened up Peter, James and John's eyes to really SEE. See Him as He's always been. The voice in the cloud was not new. Their ears were opened and they heard the voice that has never ceased speaking from the beginning. The transfiguration is as much about them as it is Jesus. Circumstances haven't changed. We have changed and that seems to change everything. Maybe it was the day you revealed to another person the secret you had carried for years. In telling the secret the picture of your life as one of guilt and shame became an open window through which you stepped. The darkness gave way to light, the chains fell off, and forgiveness overcame sin. We often want to go back to those transfigured moments. Our sinfulness makes us want a romanticized, head in the clouds recollection of that life should be like for us now. The present isn't good enough and the future is somewhat unknown and unpredictable. The past we know, we lived it, but our memories are faulty. We, too, are tempted to build tents for those moments. Tents will only keep us in the past. Clinging to the past we only close ourselves off to the future God offers.

Jesus, Peter, James, and John come back down the mountain.

They could not stay there but neither did they leave the mountain. They took it with them.

It is what carries them through the shocking horrors of Jesus' passion and crucifixion.

When the once booming voice grows silent As the earth groans under the cleansing ransom of Jesus' shed Blood. On the mountain of Calvary is our transfiguration From a sinner to a saved person in Him. TO this, God says, LISTEN TO HIM. Listen to Jesus. No more nonsense of preserving the glory under temporary tents. That's' already happened. We all need to see Jesus as the true tent, the great and holy temple, up there on the mount with light and smoke. Embrace the change that Jesus' transfiguration brings. A new way, a changed life, a fresh start, a life lived in Jesus. Our regret and worry is melted in the light of Christ, Glowing from the baptismal waters, In laser beam precision burning away the old. Regardless of the circumstances we face. These show us who we are. A transfigured people of God. He's opened your eyes and ears to His transfiguring voice. A voice calling you back into His presence to transform and forgive and bless. After the gift of the Holy Spirit, Peter preaches as an eyewitness. Jesus chose Peter, James and John as eyewitnesses. Baptism into Jesus chooses us as eyewitnesses of the very same glory. God's holy mount now is at the altar. When we share the Bread and Wine, Jesus is transfigured And we in Him. Heaven comes down to earth. Jesus is present in flesh and blood reality for you to eat and drink. You are eyewitnesses of Jesus in the world. You are transfigured images of Jesus in the world. Repenting after your renewal. Speaking the Word of truth, helping those in need, listening and encouraging. You have the same faith Peter writes about to the Church awaiting death. Purely by God's gift of grace through faith! This experience, along with the gift of faith, makes Peter a suitable writer comforting Christians so far away. Peter writes in Rome, during Emperor Nero's era persecution. Now, toward the end of his ministry, Peter has a rock-solid handle on the Gospel of Jesus Christ, even as he soon would die nailed to a cross up-side-down. Our circumstances may not change, but we will be changed.

In an episode of the old MASH TV Show, Col. Potter makes a mistake in surgery.

He worries if at age 61 he's losing his skill. Psychiatrist Sydney talks to him, revealing this fear. "Whether you lose that skill today or some other day, it will happen. But you mustn't let the fear make the decision for you." Good wisdom. Forgiven & transformed followers of Christ as we are have nothing to fear.

You grow.

You trust.

No more regretting, only faith-filled transformed hearts of hope.
