

GOD SPEAKS TO US

The New Testament Reading: Acts of the Apostles 2: 14, 22-32

[So] Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Fellow Jews and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say.... Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with deeds of power, wonders, and signs that God did through him among you, as you yourselves know— this man, handed over to you according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of those outside the law. But God raised him up, having released him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for him to be held in its power. For David says concerning him, 'I saw the Lord always before me, for he is at my right hand so that I will not be shaken; therefore, my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced; moreover, my flesh will live in hope. For you will not abandon my soul to Hades or let your Holy One experience corruption. You have made known to me the ways of life; you will make me full of gladness with your presence.' "Fellow Israelites, I may say to you confidently of our ancestor David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. Since he was a prophet, he knew that God had sworn with an oath to him that he would put one of his descendants on his throne. Foreseeing this, David spoke of the resurrection of the Messiah, saying, 'He was not abandoned to Hades, nor did his flesh experience corruption.' "This Jesus God raised up, and of that all of us are witnesses.

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

The Epistle: 1 Peter 1:3-9

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead and into an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, who are being protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. In this you rejoice, even if now for a little while you have had to suffer various trials, so that the genuineness of your faith—being more precious than gold that, though perishable, is tested by fire—may be found to result in praise and glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed. Although you have not seen him, you love him, and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy, for you are receiving the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls.

The Holy Gospel: St. John 20: 19-31

The Holy Gospel, according to St. John, the 20th chapter:

Glory to You, O Lord.

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.' But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.' A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your

finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.' Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.' Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name. This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to You, O Christ.**

THE APOSTLES' CREED:



Scripture: John 20:19-31

Read My Hands April 16, 2023

Every year as a kid, the same routine happened for the family vacation.

Up at 4 AM [crack of dawn] The car trunk and space between my sister and I packed to the hilt. Triple A [CAA] maps by the thermos of coffee.

We are road trip ready. Where's mom? Running around the house – checking and rechecking the locked doors leaving the house! Just in case – for fear one isn't locked properly!

Dad would say something – he shouldn't have – They argued the 1st 2 miles.

Over checking locked doors too much! Jesus' disciples in the Gospel really have locked doors. Sitting like prisoners. Jesus' tomb is empty, but their upper room is crowded.

The stone has been rolled back from the grave, but the doors of the disciples' lives are closed and locked. They're afraid of what's on the other side of those doors. The real locked door though is the one closing the house of the heart. The house of imagination and creativity and faithful recollection. The heart of trust is shut tight. We often think the opposite of faith is doubt, but it's not. It's certainty. Because certainty is linked to guarantee, what can be measured, seen, secured. That is always about controlling the trajectory of our life, which is based in fear. The disciples are certain Jesus is dead. They are afraid those who crucified Him with do the same to them. Their certainty is wrapped up in fear, The women visited them with Good News from an angel. They preached the Gospel. And yet their word means nothing. It's just a word, not a physical experience. If He's alive, where is He?

But then He comes. [iPhone] On Easter evening. Jesus brings them peace after passing through locked doors. Nothing can keep Jesus away. Peace coming from His Word and His wounds. This is what makes Christianity so remarkable. Jesus doesn't remove us out of our humanity; Jesus doesn't cover up the cost of rescuing us; Nail holes and spear stab marks don't vanish. Jesus IS humanity, Jesus IS new life, Everything He experiences in death He displays in life. And that life He pours into us so in our death we pass over into Heaven.

Jesus' wounds show God's love and compassion for each one of us.

Those wounds show God's identification with and empathy for every one of us.

Those wounds show God's intense thirst for justice, peace, forgiveness, acceptance, and mercy . . . because His wounds are our wounds! By His wounds we are healed.

By our wounds we help others heal. But Thomas doesn't see these healing wounds.

He only hears about it. Thomas wants to see the Jesus he's been following all these years.

He has to see Him and touch Him to know its real. He's labeled doubting Thomas, but Scripture doesn't really have words for doubt. Hebrew and Greek/Roman people viewed it as having faith or being against faith. Not in an atheist kind of way but needing certainties.

That's the heart of the problem. Needing certainty. As imperfect humans, we are both filled with faith and against faith. We find it easy to believe and difficult to believe.

Often people can be driven to be atheistic because they get stuck in the trauma. If we expect God to be a superhero coming to our aid whisking us to instant safety, Then we will be very, very disillusioned with our life and God will be the enemy. But if we expect God to keep His promises, to be with us and living in us, To keep us in peace amid life's tornadoes and trials, Then we will be grateful, humble, forgiving people. As long as we remain behind the locked doors of our houses nothing changes. We all have doubts. That's fear. And the more we worry about our doubts the worse it becomes. Certainty works against faith. Christians have long been pre-occupied with certainty. We identify our *faith in God* with our *thoughts about God*, and so, of course, we always think correctly. Certainty becomes harmful as without too much concern we start turning away from God's relationship of trust and instead grab onto certainty.

We'd rather have a fleeting guarantee that a long-haul life of trust. We see guarantees like money in the bank, [safe but not] And we see faith as a cross your fingers hope that never happens...It's not. Hope is the assurance of things NOT SEEN.

Because it's centred in GOD not us. Only He could be what we couldn't be.

Faithful

Trusting

Willing

Welcoming

Loving

Sacrificial

Dying AND rising!

Because of Easter, all of this is part of who we become.

We are brought into a relationship by grace to trust in *God*—to have a faith "not so much defined by *what* we believe but in *whom* we trust." Being a follower of Christ isn't about the content of our thinking, But the integrity of our loyal trusting in HIM. Faith isn't about having all the right answers. Faith is about willing to ask questions, willing to wonder why God takes so long to help sometimes. Willing to cast every care onto Him because He cares so deeply.

Easter is Jesus inviting, asking, calling, insisting, and accompanying us into more life and more peace and more dependence on Him. The impossible is possible. The never before imagined doesn't sound so strange. Easter is Jesus' promise that there's a future on the other side of our locked doors. He wastes no time in trying to unlock them, He just passes right on through. As He passes through our water, making it a Baptismal shower of renewal;

He passes through the Scriptures, the hymns, the prayers, even rests in the bread and wine making our communion meal a physical feeding to enrich the times we struggle with faith and trust. We may not get to run our hands over Jesus' wounds like Thomas, But because He was given that gift, The gift we have of His Flesh and Blood, wounds and all, in our lives is

priceless. Blessed are we. We believe and do not see Other than the face of our Lord among the least and lost and needy around us In all ages, stages and walks of life.

Faith is nurtured, deepened and strengthened, in the suffering, risks and uncertainties of this world – other people's suffering as well as our own, that we draw closest to our risen Lord; in the deprivations of the poor and the hungry; in the powerlessness of the oppressed; in the crippling debts that economically enslave many, in the desperation of the refugee seeking political asylum; in the sorrow of the sinner, the degradation of the prisoner, the fear of the hospital patient, the tears in a broken relationship. We are given comfort by the wounded hands and side of Jesus – And in the end, the strength of our faith, the depth of our belief, will not be measured by our ability to explain perfectly what we believe but how we show what we believe in serving Christ when we serve all who call for help. Faith is evidenced in our responses to daily life in Jesus - whether we walk away from sharing the faith, whether we just let faith be ours and no one else's--or whether, in the face of it all, we proclaim by our worship and our lives, 'My Lord and my God!' And by grace in faith, filled with trust, not knowing where we going But only that His presence is leading and healing, we must reach out and help soothe the wounds of others and see in them My Lord and my God! Amen.
