The New Testament Letter: Romans 6: 1b-11

[St. Paul writes:] Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. REV. TODD HOEFFS PENTECOST 4 [9 AM PICNIC SUNDAY] Matthew 9 "I've Lost It!" June 25, 2023 [9 AM]

If someone seems mentally unstable, we say "he's lost it". If we show anger, we may be "losing our cool". If you're like me, you put something away that's been out for a while And when you can't recall where you stored it, it's lost. We don't normally lose things on purpose. Reminders help. Calendars. iPhone calendars that beep or ring to remind us of appointments. It's scary being lost. It's worrisome losing your memory. The other day I was looking through some of the boxes I hadn't unpacked & rejoiced over an item I found which I had no seen or thought of for many years! Lost and found means a lot to people in ancient days. Precious items can't be easily reproduced Open, honest interaction is highly valued among the peasant world of Jesus' followers. Any attempt at secrecy brings on suspicion and distrust. Unlike the scribes and Pharisees who are plotting behind Jesus' back; Jesus urges his followers to be open and public. Today's Gospel has the continuation from Jesus' house on the rock lesson. He's preparing to send out the disciples. Whatever has been hidden, Such as the arrival of the Messiah, Will be revealed in this rabbi Jesus. This whispered are known shouted out. Here is the One Who comes to rearrange life, Overthrow Satan's agenda and heal humanities' rebellious sin. So Jesus' disciples will proclaim, in words and actions, this Kingdom of God that's here. Jesus warns them that the message they take out, the good news of Jesus' ministry, will be opposed. As a result, division will occur. When people hear the news of God's kingdom, they hear 2 things: They are for Jesus or against Jesus. Followers of Jesus MUST prepare for fierce opposition. There is a cost for discipleship. "You would have thought Jesus would have enticed people into discipleship. You would have thought he would have made it easy; that he would have put the bar of discipleship very low. You would have thought Jesus would have said, 'It is easy being a disciple. Love your wife. Love your kids. Show up to work on time. Be nice to the neighbor next door. Go to synagogue. It is easy to be my disciple.' German pastor and martyr Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote a book I found like changing. "The Cost of Discipleship". My pastor gave it to me to read before I went into the Seminary. "When Jesus calls us [as pastors and people], He bids us to come and die". In Matthew's time, these followers of Jesus were being shunned by the Jewish synagogue. Rigid ritual of rules LOOKS costly but it's easy - transactional - easy to understand in a worldly way. The world is transactional - God is not. Personal Public Piety means little if Christ is not treasured in the heart. Just as in Matthew's time, so it was in Jesus' time and it is in our own time. Christian churches have all too often succumb to being rule and moral police. The world is viewed as a nasty, evil place - so I will fortress myself in And make myself believe I'm a good Christian because I feel like I view the Bible rightly and try really hard not to be like others. That's the Christianity non-churched people see, right or wrong. So if Jesus is not welcomed in culture, Maybe it's because the Jesus they have seen in the Christian behaviour Is not all that Christlike. We're called to proclaim that Jesus calls the world to change. To live by wide welcoming love, to forgive one another, to seek justice for those stepped on, to be agents of reconciliation and peace. To give up the stuff of this world and give ourselves to it's people. To seek out the unfriended and offer them a place at our table. To avoid the charms of life and seek the challenges. To look hard into the face of temptation and stare it down because Jesus is in us.

To fight for the one whose arm is weak; to say no to self and yes to sacrifice.

To believe in Jesus who comes from God, who is God, and who will never settle for a world that is offering a different message than His Gospel of love for the entire universe.

This is our call to discipleship from Jesus. We carry the cross and follow.

This means letting yourself suffer for the faith you've been given.

This means struggling with the hurt that you have people in your life Who don't value faith as you do. This means letting Jesus remain your focus even if no one else does.

Bearing the cross isn't about suffering through illnesses or difficult family members or the troubles your kids get into or financial difficulties. Those are hard and debilitating But they are all just part of living in an imperfect world with imperfect people.

Everyone gets sick. How believers trust in Jesus through it all is the defining factor.

Bearing the cross of Jesus is HOW we shoulder the faith trials and troubles of life.

This moves us to lose our lives And in losing them, find them. That really goes against the grain. Our lives are precious. Why lose em? One approach in our NA culture says to save your life: hoard it, clutch it, cling to it, grasp it, try to get hold of it for yourself,

take care of yourself, trust yourself, see that in every situation your first and major concern is, "What's in it for me?" Life is about you and your happiness. Save your life from any pain, discomfort, or suffering. Jesus approach is: lose your life: give your life away,

Freely invest in something bigger than you, and move out in dependence upon God. It's very easy to lose ourselves and become hidden. The trick is to figure out how to lose one's life so that it will be found. Losing our life for Jesus' sake becomes a life that is found and saved. We lose ourselves by diving into the needs around us.

In Jesus' context, losing one's life means losing one's social status – becoming disgraced in the eyes of others – because one chooses to associate with those outside of one's social circle. Hanging out with the lowest and the least, enemies, or maybe even one's actual neighbours. By losing life, it is found. It is found because Jesus is found in the least and lost in His Kingdom. The ill, the lame, the humble, the abused, the neglected. In their ranks we are found. In the likes of those in need of the Gospel, we find ourselves

and what our faith is rally made of. It's not about me, it's about Jesus. ALL ABOUT JESUS. You see, when we think only of ourselves, we reveal our separation from God.

This is how Jesus comes not to bring peace but a sword. Jesus' sword cuts away the barriers we've made that keeps God and others out. Jesus' sword destroys the sin that separates us. The sword cut His life to pieces, and this makes His grace and forgiveness

Accessible to all. Like when Jesus dies and the temple curtain separating people from God Is torn from top to bottom. We are loved by Jesus. And God accepts us into His Kingdom because of Jesus. And we gratefully express this truth of who Jesus is, The truth of who we are now are as his baptized disciples. We have a new life in our identity in Christ.

We are not saved to become new RULE MONGERS or control freaks But followers of Christ Who embody His Gospel message. We become loyal to Christ and live within his priorities of love and service to others, all who are in need. No matter what the need.

Jesus also assures us of God's love that will never leave us. As we commit ourselves to proclaim God's kingdom coming near through our words and actions, God's love enfolds us. A love so all encompassing, that it is a love that marks the fall of each sparrow and counts every hair on our head! Wow! This is a love that fills our souls. This is a love making us sons and fathers, mothers and daughters, members of one another in a new family household, the church.

As members of the body of Christ and humble receivers of God's love, we are moved by the Spirit to witness the good news of God's Heavenly kingdom. WE NEED NOT FEAR ANY OF THIS! Since our lives are lost and found in Jesus. We will not love our families more than we love Him. Doesn't mean we're not to care for family with deep affections for our closest earthly kin, but Jesus is saying we must love even them less than we do him as believers trusting in Him. I will love my family and friends well flowing from the depth of my love for Jesus Because He has first loved us by embracing the suffering of His Cross. Jesus is not demanding that you literally hate your family. There is a cost of following Him. BY faith and grace, we are glad to lose ourselves in Him, to love him unreservedly-to trust Him and go where He leads. By loving Jesus this way, we're going to love our family more. He's showing HOW we love them even more. And that begins with love for Christ as He has for us. My former brother-in-law came from a Lutheran family we all knew and loved very well in our home church. After he graduated high school, he joined the US Navy, serving a number of years. During those years, his father was diagnosed with cancer. After surgery and chemo, he pulled through and had a good year. Well, after that, the cancer grew and his health worsened at a rapid rate. During this time, they never told their son in the Navy how serious his dad's health became. When they finally consented to tell him, his dad died before he saw him, and the secretiveness created such a vile wedge between him and his family that to this day,

hasn't fully healed. In trying to protect their son, the secret caused anger and guilt

and lost time and drove him to finish the Navy and return to a life of poor life choices....one of them alcoholism. He has been a recovering alcoholic –

but after 12 years of married life and 2 grown children, they are divorced.

Wounds are still there with layers of damage that will be there for time to come. Secrets can hurt. Hidden agendas can hurt.

Trying to save a part of ourselves only hurts us in being totally found in Jesus.

Jesus leads. We follow. We trust His cross.

Because an empty grave is the end of the story.

Trusting Jesus is how we live. He has proven Himself trustworthy over and over.

We have no guarantee other than the blood of Jesus washing away the harm and hurt. A life lost is a life found. In Jesus.
