

THE SCRIPTURES

Old Testament: *Jeremiah 20:7-13*

Lord, you tricked me, and I was fooled. You are stronger than I am. So you won. I have become a joke. Everyone makes fun of me all day long. Every time I speak, I shout. I am always shouting about violence and destruction. I tell the people about the message I received from the Lord. But this only brings me insults. The people make fun of me all day long. Sometimes I say to myself, "I will forget about the Lord. I will not speak anymore in his name." But then the Lord's message becomes like a burning fire inside me. It feels like it burns deep within my bones. I get tired of trying to hold the Lord's message inside of me. And finally, I cannot hold it in. I hear many people whispering about me: "Terror on every side! Let's tell the rulers about him." My friends are all just waiting for me to make some mistake. They are saying, "Maybe we can trick Jeremiah. Then we can defeat him. Then we can pay him back." But the Lord is with me like a

strong warrior. So those who are chasing me will trip and fall. They will not defeat me. They will be very disappointed and ashamed. Their shame will never be forgotten. Lord of heaven's armies, you test good people. You look deeply into the heart and mind of a person. I have told you my arguments against these people. So let me see you give them the punishment they deserve. Sing to the Lord! Praise the Lord. He saves the life of the poor. He saves them from the power of wicked people. This is the Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

The Epistle: Romans 6:12-23

[St. Paul writes]: Therefore, do not let sin exercise dominion in your mortal bodies, to make you obey their passions. No longer present your members to sin as instruments of wickedness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and present your members to God as instruments of righteousness. For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace. What then? Should we sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? But thanks be to God that you, having once been slaves of sin, have become obedient from the heart to the form of teaching to which you were entrusted, and that you, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness. I am speaking in human terms because of your natural limitations. For just as you once presented your members as slaves to impurity and to greater and greater iniquity, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness for sanctification. When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. So what advantage did you then get from the things of which you now are ashamed? The end of those things is death. But now that you have been freed from sin and enslaved to God, the advantage you get is sanctification. The end is eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

This is the Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

REV. TODD HOEFFS Pentecost 5 (series A)

Scripture: St. Matthew 10: 40-42 "What You See Is What You Get"

July 2, 2023

Welcome. A very common, quickly spoken word. It's stamped on doormats outside many entryways. Greeters at the door of Walmart offer a word of "welcome". Disneyworld offers a huge welcome when the park opens with greetings by Mickey Mouse and rousing Disney music! When we begin our worship, I welcome you with: "The Lord be with you" and you respond back: "and also with you." This is the Christian version of the Old Testament greeting of Shalom Alechum. Peace be with you. The LORD be with you gives us the Peacemaker Himself, Jesus. He unites us together as ONE BODY OF BELIEVERS. Our time is marked by His presence creating an inviting, spirit-rich welcome. Welcoming in St. Matthew's Gospel means receiving someone. In Biblical culture, this involved hands on -- hand-holding. Offering a stranger your hand leading them into a new situation or an unfamiliar home or into a strange city. [IMPORTANT in African American music and freedom! Or Russian Germans, Lord take my hand & lead me so nimm denn meine Hande] Originating in the heart of the old covenant promise. Where God took His people by the hand and led them through trial and tragedy to the beauty of the promised-land. As we who are the LIVING hands of feet of the Lord God. are sent out to make all strangers welcome Taking their hand and leading them. This way, we all get welcomed into the Lord's promise of freedom. Personal welcomes embrace the whole person. You receive their words, their fears, their feelings, their thoughts, their whole being--and lead them to a life of worshiping the ONE TRUE GOD. That had been the purpose of the Temple, and today, the church's manner of mission. Over time, Israel's religious leaders changed the meaning of God's grace Out of fear to exclude those of differing stature and calling, especially unclean sinners and Gentiles. But God in His love wishes all to come to the knowledge of His Son and salvation. By the time Jesus explains this hand-holding welcome to the disciples and to the other gathered believers. this is a new and confusing concept. Welcoming each other is tough enough to understand, but welcoming and receive the Father? GOD. YAHWEH! How? The most direct access to God's holiness for them is through a prophet. They understood the teaching of shaliah, which is a King's special ambassador or prophetic holy man representing the King Himself. They lead the way for the King by speaking to the people of a certain community. So if the community receives the ambassador's word. they will welcome the King's own word and follow his rule. Such is the role of prophets. Even though St. John the Baptizer had been called as the last prophet and lost his life, he made straight the crooked way when Christ, the King of all nations, entered the world. This is why Jesus says you receive the Father by receiving His Son. The Son is Himself, the living, breathing Word speaking. And further...receive the Son by receiving those who embody the Son. WOW! This is new! No more shaliah, no more prophets, just Jesus! And all who believe in Him. People feared even saying the name GOD too loud, for fear of harm, NOW --all we do is receive a person in Jesus' name and you not only do you get to have Jesus but the Father Who sent Him! That's a big change! The temple curtain of secrecy hiding God's power and glory is already being torn open here! God is coming down and making His Home with those He loves. THE TRINITY IS WALKING ON EARTH TO HELP HIS PEOPLE. This can be scary, even to Christians (even to Lutherans). We like to forget how well God knows us and that He actually resides

in our hearts. Especially if it doesn't create a warm, easy, fun feeling. We'd all rather be unknown and illusive and only bring to light to what we're comfortable letting others see. It's even scarier feeling that other people can know us so well. Only 10 percent of communication is verbal. The rest is body language. We let people in so far. But eventually the masks must come down. God sees right in. No

reason to hide. Churches as places of un-welcome is a very common complaint. It takes time, awareness, interest and time. If welcome means listening, leading, showing, reminding, embracing

the good, the bad and the ugly of every person, no thanks, right? We all have a full plate. We have jobs and homes and families and other activities and friends and various obligations. Welcome? I say hi, isn't that enough? No. It isn't. A Church cartoon by a retired Lutheran pastor depicts after service coffee time. At the corners of the cartoon are people in pairs and small groups happily chatting away while drinking coffee. In the middle of the cartoon is a vast circular space and in the direct center of that space is a singular, solitary person all alone looking scared shakingly drinking coffee....alone. That's the way many feel among congregations when it comes to fellowship and welcoming. Welcoming is assumed, rarely initiated. And it's not the job of just a pastor or staff or a committee, but best from everyone. I remember the times I visited my grandparents as a little child. Since they lived a few blocks away. I went there all the time. I can never remember a time when I wasn't supposed to get my own drinks out of the fridge or grab a knife and cut my own huge piece of cherry pie (as long as I brought grandma and grandpa a piece and they were diabetics and weren't supposed to have any but I had to keep that a secret, too). Hospitality to them meant getting your own stuff by yourself. Their home was yours. This is no doubt a concept embraced by all in North America, even without thinking of it. But what does welcome have in common with self-service, with household independence? What quest helps themselves in another's home? My other grandparents from my dad's side never allowed that kind of self-service. You were always treated as guest whether you visited them once every few years or every week. You visited and they served. They set the table, they served the food, they got whatever you needed. The church as a cross Canada structure has totally lost sight of welcome and have very little if any ministry of hospitality. Welcoming and receiving another person, as we receive Christ and the Father, is not a one-time deal. I say "the Lord be with you" every week. We begin in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit every Sunday. Not one worship hour has gone by without the Lord's Prayer. Welcome and receiving and serving isn't one time per new comer but the happy habit of the whole church. Because Jesus' welcome remains until the end of the age. He never stops embracing us. He rolls out the red carpet, regardless of where we've been, what we've done, no matter how many sins we've committed. His arms outstretched in suffering on the cross gathers every person into a close relationship with Him. And when that happens, all sins are washed away in His Blood. Over and over this grace miracles happens. His Blood not only cleanses you but protects you as you travel the byways and begin welcoming others in His name. That's why you are called to welcome others for Jesus has welcomed you. As the disciples are sent-ones, the Church is an entire body of sent-ones, pastors and people. By expecting people to come in, help themselves, find their own way, connect with people somehow, someway, is not receiving people into the Body of Christ.

It's just easier. [It wasn't that long ago I stepped into a Lutheran church and among a group of 30 or so people, 2 said hello after I approached them. That's sad.] Welcoming takes time, patience and prayerful thought. It means caring enough of others to check in on them and simply to listen. But worshippers won't remain as guests, either. We are all instantly included as members of Jesus' Body. Each one is given talents and gifts worthy to share. All members contribute and share the joyful responsibility of caring for the Lord's church and ministry. All of this costs, for sure. It's a part of crossbearing, which all of us carry as baptized believers in Jesus. We love and care and help and serve. It takes up our time, our energy, our resources, our prayers, our emotional and spiritual welfare. But if Christ and the Father live in us through the gift of the Holy Spirit, then it's His strength being used up. And that's OK. We lose ourselves into these ways of living. And find our real lives Jesus keeps refreshing and blessing. That's as it should be. We can't run on our own energy for long. As branches of the Vine, apart from Jesus you can do nothing. This is why when we feel spiritually or even physically burned out, it's time for a shot of support. A word of encouragement. A visit over coffee. One voice to say "I care. I'm here to help." And we all need that. No matter the age. [This is why we have young people involved too.] When we include, we lift up, and we share the load and won't always feel so tired. Faith will deepen and the Lord's help will be poured into our tired bodies. Like a cup of cool water given to the parched lips of a little one It is worthy of a righteous reward! And "little ones" (*mikros*) could mean children, but usually means anyone who is vulnerable, least,

undesirable, needy and insignificant in the eyes of the world. Little ones covers everyone you encounter in your life. Even our own selves. And no matter how large or small the help you can offer, it is viewed by the Lord as wonderful and worthy of praise. This is to ensure we believe that Heaven is our unearned, undeserved priceless, never-ending gift. It's a promise we trust in by faith. I asked my colleague Lutheran pastors at our last circuit meeting. "Since people aren't just coming in droves into your church doors, How are you reaching them to make sure they sit through your divine service?" They aren't. "It takes 21st century post-pandemic street credibility" to help encourage people in. Like a restaurant. The online menu, the pictures, the reviews help; but there's a reason why our family keeps going back to Paesano's Pizza on Carlton. They know me. They remember my order by my voice on the phone. They have consistently good pizza and wings. It's a family run business, mama still stirs the homemade sauces. They treat me as a long lost relative. "Todd buddy." Now, if a little family run pizza place can do that,

It will be God-pleasingly easy pouring a cup of cool water from our huge global BODY OF CHRIST! A wide wonderful welcome. Amen.
