THE WORD

The Old Testament: Job 38:4-18

"Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding. Who determined its measurements—surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it? On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone, when the morning stars sang together and all the sons of God shouted for joy? "Or who shut in the sea with doors when it burst out from the womb, when I made clouds its garment and thick darkness its swaddling band, and prescribed limits for it and set bars and doors, and said, 'Thus far shall you come, and no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stayed? "Have you commanded the morning since your days began, and caused the dawn to know its place, that it might take hold of the skirts of the earth, and the wicked be shaken out of it? It is changed like clay under the seal, and its features stand out like a garment. From the wicked their light is withheld, and their uplifted arm is broken. "Have you entered into the springs of the sea, or walked in the recesses of the deep? Have the gates of death been revealed to you, or have you seen the gates of deep darkness? Have you comprehended the expanse of the earth? Declare, if you know all this. This is the Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

The Epistle: Romans 10: 5-17

[St. Paul writes:] For Moses writes about the righteousness that is based on the law, that the person who does the commandments shall live by them. But the righteousness based on faith says, "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?'" (that is, to bring Christ down) "or 'Who will descend into the abyss?'" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved. For the Scripture says, "Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame." For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing his riches on all who call on him. For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." How then will they call on him in whom they have not believe? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!" But they have not all obeyed the gospel. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed what he has heard from us?" So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.

This is the Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**



The Holy Gospel: St. Matthew 14:22-33

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Matthew, the 14th chapter:

Glory to You, O Lord.

Immediately [Jesus] made the disciples get into the boat and go before him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, but the boat by this time was a long way from the land, beaten by the waves, for the wind was against them. And in the fourth watch of the night he came to them, walking on the sea. But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, and said, "It is a ghost!" and they cried out in fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, "Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid." And Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." He said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water and came to Jesus. But when he saw the wind, he was afraid, and beginning to sink he cried out, "Lord, save me." Jesus immediately reached out his hand and took hold of him, saying to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased. And those in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God." This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to You, O Christ.**

THE NICENE CREED: I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of Heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. And in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of the Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, Very God of Very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father; by Whom all things were made. Who for us men and for our salvation came down from Heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary and was made man. And was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate; He suffered and was buried. And the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures and ascended into Heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father. And He will come again with glory to judge both the living and the dead, Whose kingdom will have no end. And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of life, Who proceeds from the Father and the Son, Who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified, Who spoke by the prophets. And I believe in one holy Christian and apostolic church. I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins, and I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life + of the world to come. Amen.

REV. TODD HOEFFS PENTECOST 11 Scripture: St. Matthew 14:22-33 "Jesus Asleep At The Wheel!" August 13, 2023

In the name of the Father and of the Son + and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. Sink or swim. My dad said that a lot. Growing up on a Wisconsin farm, manys the time his siblings or friends jumped into a pond or creek learning to swim, or sink. Some guys he served with in the army got thrown into swimming pools Forcing them to sink---or swim. Very familiar to fisherman Peter's heart. Water is his whole life. Navigating boats, mending nets, catching and selling fish. It's been a busy time. He goes from a miraculous feast to mind-numbing fear. Peter just passed out bread and fish multiplied by Christ to over 5,000 people in a desolate place. No time to sit and savor. Jesus hurriedly rushes Peter and the others into a boat and literally pushes them out into the Galilean Sea. They reluctantly go. Can you blame them? Can't get far on dark waters. The Hebrew name for this sea means ROAR. Like a lion. For a small body of water, it kicks up terrible weather. They know the sea. I'm sure they feel the storm coming. We forget how most ancient people viewed sea as a cosmic threat. As the winds kick up and the waves wash over their little boat, Jesus' disciples are not thinking Biblically here. It's also late.

The 4th watch of the night is between 2:30 and 6 AM. They are headed for danger, Jesus is alone, praying. Unaware, the inner circle of disciples will be fast asleep at the 4th watch when Jesus prays that the cup of suffering pass by in Gethsemane's garden.

Jesus will also vacate the garden tomb at the end of the 4th watch on Easter morning Sharing His presence with women and disciples. This is preparing them for all that is to come. But the last reason they're disinterested in sailing Is the OTHER side is Gentile country. Romans. "Public sinners". Outcasts. Night brings so much unknown.

"The wind is against them." No matter how hard they try, They can't reach shore.

No doubt they're exhausted. This is more than just a story of fear and rescue.

He's teaching them about what really matters. There aren't enough supports in the world to keep a boat afloat On rough waters apart from trusting in God. The darkness and turbulence and the night time emphasize the demonic world at work to inhibit and be an obstacle before Saviour's work. Jesus goes where no fisherman ever expected anyone to go, He walks on top of the water. He looks like a ghost to them.

Makes me wonder if they mistake Jesus for a ghost Because His Body is showing a little bit of divinity, some light, glowing, as in a beacon sharing light for them to see?

Like a formidable Maritimes lighthouse? Almost like the glory radiating from His garments like lightning when He stood on the Mount of Transfiguration. Jesus comes to us in both divine ways and human ways. Sometimes we need a more divine jolt;

other times a gentler touch with human help. It's still Jesus rescuing us.

He is the focus. And yet fear is their 1st reaction. We are so used to the predictable. When things happen apart from what's expected All of us get afraid and anxious and worry. It's hard to pivot and change course. Peter boldly asks "command me to come, Lord." He expects in this moment That one word from Jesus and His life power is transferable to him. Considering all of the fear, That is a huge image of faith in a storm. Jesus' Word back to Peter is NOT a command. It's a gentle loving invitation, COME the kind of invite where the sender knows the person will come before He asks.

Just on that one word Peter gets out of the boat. A career fisherman trusting Jesus' word COME. If Jesus can walk on the surface of the water, So can Peter.

This means, if Peter can walk on the water, So can we. Eyes are on Jesus.

He is the focus. He is our purpose. He is the person from Whom we draw our identity as God's Children. Peter walks on the water as He looks at Jesus. I know we often use the phrase "walking on water" in a negative way, When we expect too much from another person. Or if someone is so arrogant they feel they're perfect.

That's not this. When we are focused on Jesus, When our life is wrapped up tightly in His, We walk on water. We overcome a problem. We manage pain. We pray more often. We trust more. We walk away with medical tests whatever the result with peace.

When does Peter stop walking on water and immediately sinks? As he looks down. He remembers his fear. Oh my!? Doesn't that hit so close to our hearts too?!

When we look at ourselves, when we ask why me, or poor me, why am I not good enough or strong enough or perfect enough? When we think we can or have to do like all alone We sink. We lose faith. Fear is easy to remember. But Peter also remembers courage. SAVE ME LORD. Save us Lord. Jesus is our focus. He always leads us to the edge of our own resources or we never transfer into the Absolute Source, Who is Jesus. He dismantles our need thinking somehow maybe we can generate the energy needed to face each day. That we have the power or know-how or muscle for this.

Jesus is the source Jesus is the focus. Jesus is the way our eyes see and our hearts connect. It is a life of trust. Doubt isn't the opposite of faith. Certainty is the opposite of faith. Wanting a guarantee all will end happily ever after is not faith.

Faith isn't a divine warranty. Faith is a relationship, a bond of trust,

A life washed in water and sealed in Blood. Baptismal water and Jesus' Blood.

This is why we are not filled with certainty but confidence. Confidence is courage in whatever comes your way Because Jesus is your source, your light, your life, your future. Little faith isn't no faith either. Little faith sometimes trusts in the louder voices out there [or ones that play in our minds] Or the boom of troubles – Rather than trusting in the still small voice Or the support which feels non-existent. We have small and great faith. We have trust issues and yet believe with our whole hearts.

That's faith life of any human in this world. Because Jesus lived the good and the bad,

And as both divine and human got hit with the most Horrific storm on the cross.

The rush of evil, the waves of human sin, generations of waywardness and rebellion past, present and future. All washing over His Body, beating Him, stripping Him of flesh, blood and dignity. And while this storm killed Him,

At the end At the last watch, He rose back to life. He has gone back to His throne in Heaven, But He is also within each of you.

He is the way you view the world around you.

He is the way you live.

It's not about sink or swim,

It's about walking on all waters

With eyes anchored to Jesus Christ.

Amen.
