

Just as you were once disobedient to God but have now received mercy because of their disobedience, so they have now been disobedient in order that, by the mercy shown to you, they too may now receive mercy. The Holy Gospel: St. Matthew 15: 10-28

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Matthew, the 15th chapter:

Glory to You, O Lord.

Then [Jesus] called the crowd to him and said to them, 'Listen and understand: it is not what goes into the mouth that defiles a person, but it is what comes out of the mouth that defiles.' Then the disciples approached and said to him, 'Do you know that the Pharisees took offence when they heard what you said?' He answered, 'Every plant that my heavenly Father has not planted will be uprooted. Let them alone; they are blind guides of the blind. And if one blind person guides another, both will fall into a pit.' But Peter said to him, 'Explain this parable to us.' Then he said, 'Are you also still without understanding? Do you not see that whatever goes into the mouth enters the stomach, and goes out into the sewer? But what comes out of the mouth proceeds from

the heart, and this is what defiles. For out of the heart come evil intentions, murder, adultery, fornication, theft, false witness, slander. These are what defile a person, but to eat with unwashed hands does not defile. Jesus left that place and went away to the district of Tyre and Sidon. Just then a Canaanite woman from that region came out and started shouting, 'Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David; my daughter is tormented by a demon.' But he did not answer her at all. And his disciples came and urged him, saying, 'Send her away, for she keeps shouting after us.' He answered, 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.' But she came and knelt before him, saying, 'Lord, help me.' He answered, 'It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs.' She said, 'Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters' table.' Then Jesus answered her, 'Woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish.' And her daughter was healed instantly. This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to You, O Christ.

THE APOSTLES' CREED:

God has made us His people through our Baptism into Christ. Living together in trust and hope, we confess the faith.

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of Heaven and earth. REV. TODD HOEFFS
Pentecost 12
Matthew 15:10-28
"Faith Is Great When It's Gone To The Dogs"
August 20, 2023

Overeating was encouraged in my house growing up, almost a rule. "Todd, you don't finish your potatoes you don't get cherry pie?!" said Mom. And of course, I wanted the cherry pie. Dad's rule was always having clean hands before eating. Then my pastor would joke that the one good thing about our Lutheran faith is that we can do everything – in moderation. LOL Overeating and washing hands are all about what Jesus is saying ISN'T important? Right? Well, yes and no. Washing hands doesn't prove there's a clean soul any more than overeating proves the food is good. It's not what goes into the body that's the problem. The heart, the attitude, the human nature, the seat of who we are, where all thoughts and ideals and emotions whirl around, That is the problem place.

In the Hebrew sense, If the heart wasn't right, the mind will not be right.

It's not the fault of cherry pies or 35 buffalo chicken wings I ate in one sitting [true] or the tasty apple fritter Tim Horton's donut's fault either -- not the fault of the food that I carry too much around the middle. Food consumption and hand washing are constant concerns in our culture still. In the religious leaders' eyes these topics sealed your fate in Heaven or in Hell. God ordained such common-sense health procedures not only for preparation for worship But to keep them alive from bacteria and sickness. Those had never been meant to keep people away from God. Nor a standard for real faith.

Our English Bibles call this "defiled hands" but Matthew's choice in the Greek really means ordinary or plain hands. Not dirty hands, just hands which may have been quickly wiped or rinsed. Like jeans verses tuxedo pants. These unimportant matters must never be standards. What benefit is there Is holding these kind of rules? No one should be so afraid of offending God that we keep people away from His presence! God knows the heart. We can't know who's in with God and who's out. The Temple pecking order worked like this: Men from the House of Israel with wealth and reputation sat at the top. Then the young boys 13 and older of those households. Then other young boys of Israel. Then married women of the wealthy men. Then the regular women. Then single or widowed and young girls. Then the OTHERS. Gentiles. Anyone not of the House of David--So Imagine how low a Canaanite woman was on the ladder? The title Canaan means "low", as in humble, and people of low-lands. On the other side of the Jordan River near Palestine. Their ethnicity is a wide mix of Jew, Arab, Syrian and Greek. Talk about an enemy ethnicity! It's easy hating. Loving and friendship, that's harder and more time consuming. God is so much more than just good behaviour and proper etiquette. Living differently or not having perfectly washed hands isn't a failure in God's eyes. Rather, it's that selfish pride, welling up from every sinner's heart, to put the self first; to ignore or dislike or treat as non persons our neighbours instead of loving them, accepting them, helping them.

At its worst our selfishness gives rise to all those ugly things Jesus mentions: murder, unhealthy lusting, stealing and speaking unkindly of others. God sees what lies concealed inside us, He has all our DNA at His fingertips, Also our history, culture and what our hearts get attached to. We might fool each other, but we can't fool God. Imperfection is the great leveler for every person of the world. This Canaanite woman is many things, but not naïve. Everyone knows the children of Israel focus on the Great Messianic afterlife feast at the wedding banguet of the Saviour. Primarily, for them and no one else. Grudgingly, the children of God know the Gentiles get into Heaven somehow too. [Isaiah mentions it a few times] This Canaanite woman knows she's also invited to God's Table. Otherwise she wouldn't go to such public lengths to get her share. She speaks correctly – "Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David!" That's formal Temple language. Lord. She sees him as the heir of King David. She begs for mercy. She is persistent. She shouts, she raises her voice, she refuses to give in. What mother, what parent, wouldn't do the same? If you know someone could save your child, would you ever quiet down? Because women in ancient times just did not do that. And not an outcast outsider. No woman at that time yelled out loud or approached a man. Parents never stop advocating for their children. A parent is the voice for their voiceless babies. Especially one troubled by demons. Just imagine the condemning looks about that situation. What did THEY do wrong to cause a demon to attack a little girl? Demons had been as misunderstood then as now. Superstitiously and with great fear. Satan knows Jesus Is making His rounds to crush the serpents' nasty and vile head. Contrast this to the woman's great need and her great faith. Great faith grows from great need. There are lots of people who know that they need something. But they don't know exactly what they need. Some goes for you and me, too. Try this, try that, like haphazard cooking, but nothing seems to satisfy. Most attention is just focused on what can fill some kind of need. But the truth is that there's a hole in the heart of our world only be filled by Jesus. Yes, great faith thrives from deep within great need. And, yes, our world has a great need. The Canaanite woman has faith, not just because she's desperate for help, but because she trusts Jesus as her ONLY help. Great faith is great because it recognizes our own great need, which comes with the Spirit's inner working. In this great faith we stay close to our Saviour time and time again. In fact it comes through life almost unconsciously, often when we think we're alone. Knowing we have need and trusting in Jesus to bring about what is needed. That's repentance. That's humility. That's great faith. So, why does Jesus seem to brush this Canaanite woman off? Why not welcome her in with open arms? He tells her He's about helping His own people 1st. Then compares her to a dog!? Now, this isn't necessarily a nasty term here. Dogs didn't have the elevated status they do in our world now. But households did have pet dogs who ate the leftovers from the dinner table. Exactly what this woman is asking for! Licking up Crumbs from God's table! Jesus wants this to be said by this outsider in public for His OWN PEOPLE to hear! He welcomes her the best and most valid way by letting HER WORDS display her GREAT FAITH. Jesus loves this unique courageous woman. Her life shows us all that worthiness has nothing to do with faith. She is not worthy. The people around Jesus that day aren't worthy. The disciples aren't worthy. We are not worthy.

And that's the point of NOT trying to live in a selfish style. Worthiness [which is being good enough on your own] doesn't matter. Great faith doesn't require us to be worthy.

Because great faith comes from the ONE who makes us worthy. That's what makes Jesus so amazing! He refuses to honour the discriminations religious people expect.

He refuses to let the outer appearance and behaviour be the pedigree for love and acceptance. Jesus comes from the house of David and yet got scoffed at for coming from Nazareth, He ate with sinners and got called a glutton. He doesn't make His disciples follow the rules And NOW says a Canaanite woman with a demon infested daughter has GREAT FAITH! Nowhere better will Jesus give us GREAT FAITH than on Calvary's cross. While suffering and dying He will fully exposes the wicked twisted hearts of every person of the world. All of the evil is exposed in Jesus' vulnerable crucified body, It is wiped away in His Blood. All of it, gone.

The One Who dies an outcast and a criminal outside the city gates of His own holy city brings all nations together as ONE family in His Body. All people become His people in His shed Blood. Everyone baptized into Him are baptized into His Blood-soaked cross and Receive GREAT FAITH. Great faith keeps us in the one who died and we are worthy to stand before Him. We are worthy to stand in His place as His Body in the world.

We stand there with the Canaanite woman and her daughter healed of demons.

With her we eat the crumbs from the Master's Table.

Every time we dine at the Holy Communion rail.

Every time we share a meal with family, friends or strangers.

Every time we help someone who needs help.

Every time we show the face of Jesus in a hope-filled manner of living.

We are a people of peace and hope and faith – we are inheritors of grace and eternal life.

This gives us the confidence to ask God anything.

Ask Jesus for help every moment of every day.

His help is there anyway, but prayer keeps the conversation going coming from a mouth that reveals our forgiven heart that trusts with great faith.

And nothing we put into our bodies can change that.

Amen.
