

FLOWERS have been placed on the altar this morning to the glory of God by the John & Louise Gondosch & family to celebrate the occasion of John's birthday yesterday.







REV. TODD HOEFFS PENTECOST 14

Scripture: St., Matthew 16: 21-28

September 3, 2023

I love the popular "Footprints in the Sand" poem. It describes a dream. A person is walking on a beach with Jesus. They leave two sets of footprints in the sand behind them. Looking back, the tracks show various stages of this person's life. At some points the two trails change to one, especially at the lowest and most hopeless times. When questioning Jesus, assuming He must have abandoned him during those times, Jesus explains beautifully: 'During your times of trial and suffering, when you see only one set of footprints, it was then that I carried you'. This isn't directly from Scripture, But it does highlight Jesus' amazing bond with us – It's a nice comfort in times of stress and darkness. We all want to believe that we walk through life with Jesus and we're never without Him. Jesus remains not only a part of our life, HE IS OUR LIFE. He isn't remote or watching from around the corner, For the believer, He's inside. United with our bodies. He is our strength and faith and life when ours is gone. Does your daily life sound like the one imagined in the FOOTPRINTS poem? So serene, so peaceful, such a lovely walk along the sandy seashore? Is that a scene you long for but seems so out of reach? Or is that reserved for the other side of the shore in Heaven? In actuality, most of our life is spent making our own marks, following our own ways, tracking our own footprints in life's sand. We like to go it alone and construct life our way to feel like we're in control. And sometimes it does feel like you're against the world, doesn't it? Like the people of old from the Scriptures, they had NEVER been left alone. Whether a pillar of cloud by day as shade from the scorching sun or pillar of fire by night as light for their evening walk or Moses' voice of reason or the tabernacle smoke and wind: the Lord remained with them then as He is with the disciples in the Gospel as He is with you today. With even more – you and I enjoy a deep internal presence by faith and baptism. He's got your very life in the palm of His nail-printed Hands. And when you're tempted to feel alone, You're reassured For Jesus' life-Blood flows in your life-blood So His power is your power. Unfortunately, life in this world brings each and every person, some form of hardship or suffering. We can't escape life without it. MY GREAT AUNT & UNCLE. 13 years apart. No kids. He took care of her. Shielded her from all kinds of suffering and troubles. Until....one morning in the bathroom he collapsed at the age of 86 of a massive heart attack. Died in minutes. Her life was never the same again. 1st time any hardship came her way. She lived another 20 years...but never the same again. Remedy for suffering is found in an actual END to suffering. Not to be confused with a removal of suffering. The END is JESUS. As we live and die and rise anew with Him. His Way for the earthbound journey is a Hope-filled way. As the end of all suffering ends in His suffering. All death ends in His death. Life in Him is renewed in His new life. By having your sins die in His death, you are made clean in His Blood. This is why Jesus strongly tells His disciples He MUST go to Jerusalem, suffer, die and on the 3rd day rise from the grave. Not maybe, not accidental, not the Romans fault...HE MUST. Peter is scared and unsure. Just think of the first words that would come out of your mouth if one of your parents or someone you know and love says: "I'm going to die soon, it's necessary." Well, why? Why

now? No, can't be. Our imperfect human character makes us deny. Wishing a lie might be the truth. We can't always handle the real truth. Our 1st line of defense. If I deny it, it pushes the pain a little bit farther away. It promises relief, but never delivers. That's why we all get easily addicted to pain killers. It can be in so many forms. Pills. Booze. Food. Spending money or hoarding it. Saving, collecting, being busy or not busy; humans are addicts. That's how we cope. Jesus says it's not necessary. Because His death IS necessary. He is literally addicted to saving us. The cross untangles our anxious knots of hurt and pain. You can totally see now why Peter takes Jesus aside, to correct Jesus' terrible future prediction? Surely God will spare His Only Son, the Messiah won't be rejected. God wouldn't let Jesus suffer that kind of shame and humiliation. And He just can't die either—it will ruin everything. Peter's offering his fisherman's brawn as protection for Jesus, like a hit man or body guard. He's too special to die. He's the Saviour, the Chosen, the King?....where's Peter's good old faith, the faith he's heard since childhood? Well, we're the same. Stress over the future, overly simplify and sentimentally churn up the past, ignore the present. If Jesus dies, in Jerusalem, the city of the living God, what will happen to the disciples and to this church on the Rock He's just said hell can't beat? "Get behind me, Satan!" Strong rebuke. No soft sell here. This pushback is over. Peter is Satan in that moment. He forgets HOW the city of peace will get peace. Peter isn't connecting the dots between miracles and calm seas and death on a cross. Peter, the stone placed upon the Rock, is called a stumbling block! In the Greek word choice, its where we get our word SKANDAL. Death on a cross is a skandal. SKANDAL IS stumbling block. A terrible event that causes some to fall, others to grow [stand tall]. Jesus becomes the scandal, the sacrifice, the suffering servant, the One in who we all can have forgiveness. He MUST go to a place where none can follow. From Gethsemane to Golgotha Jesus walks alone and no one walks beside Him and no one follows Him. He walks alone to do what we cannot do. He walks alone for you, for me. His hands are nailed to wood before they hold your hand. His feet are pierced and bleeding before they leave footprints in your life and on your path. Only One set of footprints to the cross and garden grave. Only after His trail leads up into heaven and the Spirit is sent down can all of us believers follow Him. Only then will His Church be strong on the Rock. Only then can suffering be healed with the sharing of the Gospel. Only after dying for sins can sins be forgiven in His name. Only then can all people everywhere access Jesus in the Bread and Wine. Even Peter will one day be led away to a place he doesn't like to go and die in a way that is no longer humiliating but is directly tied to His Lord, His Rabbi, the world's Redeemer. Jesus keeps picking us up and grabbing us away from the ledge of life and keeps remaining in our hearts and lives 24/7. He makes sure you endure suffering as He carries you. Truth be told, there's always only ONE set of footprints. When we walk in the way of Jesus, we place our needs last and carry His cross. All of life is in service to others. By carrying the cross, we see life as He sees life. When we look out our windows through the cross. We see an entire world for which Jesus died in order to save it. Doesn't mean we won't take care of our own needs and those of people in our family, friend and neighbour circles. It means those are attainable because of Christ in you. HE knows what you need better than you. He will place work and people and trials in your path Where His cross will be your only tool. Timely to have this come up at Labour Day week end. Indigenous [walk into the future backwards, to see where you've gone]. And the next time you see that beautiful "Footprints" poem, trust and be peacefully safe journeying through life in the hands of Jesus as the Body of Jesus one footprint at a time.
