

STATUS UPDATE: NOTICE OF VISA APPROVAL

Dear Christ Lutheran Church:

This letter is in regards to the following primary applicant, and his/her accompanying family members, who you have sponsored: Kareem Abadi AL HUMAIDI



A permanent resident visa has now been issued for the above mentioned primary applicant and his accompanying family members. A request has been sent to the International Organization for Migration (IOM) to proceed with the final resettlement arrangements. This includes contacting and enrolling the applicants in the Canadian Orientation Abroad (COA) program as applicable, assisting with any exit procedures, and booking travel.

Kareem was contacted by phone on Wednesday, November 1st, by the International Organization for Migration and the process for them to come to Canada is in the works. They indicated that the family could be here by Christmas. We continue to pray that the final paper work goes smoothly

and quickly. Kareem and Hamida are very excited with the latest news. It will be an exciting time for them and the boys. It will be their first airplane ride. What an adventure!

Ivy Parkhouse continues to gather and record the donations to furnish their home here in Canada. Please contact Ivy if you have things to donate. We have a nice bedroom suite with a double bed so we will need sheets and pillow cases. Also need sheets and pillow cases for the boy's beds. Gloria has made beautiful quilts for Kareem & Hamida, and each of Ameer and Asser's beds, but we will also need some blankets as well for their beds.

Sue Honey will be making a list of food items for to have for when they arrive. Please contact Sue if you are willing to purchase food items for the family.

Unfortunately we also need to be aware, as mentioned back in September, that we will require further donations of money to support the family for their first year here in Canada. Because of the cost of housing and other things the cost of our support has greatly increased. Your Refugee Committee asks you to prayerfully consider whatever donation you may be able to make. Remember, there is no gift that is too small. Consider what the LWML have done with their collection of mites over the years to support many different kinds of outreach.

Please continue to pray that all the final details with immigration be completed smoothly and our Lord's protection over the family as they prepare for their move to Canada from Athens.





The First Reading: St. John's Revelation 7:9-17



And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God, singing, 'Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and might be to our God for ever and ever! Amen.' Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, 'Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?' I said to him, 'Sir, you are the one that knows.' Then he said to me, 'These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. For this reason they are before the throne of



The Holy Gospel: St. Matthew 5:1-12

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Matthew, the 5th chapter:

Glory to You, O Lord.

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying: 'Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 'Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. 'Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely* on my account. 



Rev. Todd Hoeffs ALL SAINTS DAY "How To Get To Heaven From Here" November 5, 2023 10 AM

My instructor for jewelry making in my university art training told us the 1st day of class:

"Everyone starts with an A. It's up to you to keep it." He graded not only technique or skill, how smooth you could set a stone, but also creativity, vision, risk taking, joy, and attitude.

[I actually got an A-plus!] Heaven works like that. Every person of the world is created by God to live with Him forever. We all start with an A. It's the Holy Spirit, living a life of faith in Jesus which keeps us as A – grade disciples. Most people desire Heaven in one way or another.

Few people yearn to spend life after death with the devil or demons. It's hard to picture Heaven. There's an assumption that Heaven is good and happy. That it's fancy, or exciting, or there's pearly gates and Peter at the entry with a checklist. Scriptures never shows the idea of "going to heaven" as the primary goal of the Christian. Scripture clearly teaches that the souls of those who die in the faith are with the Lord. The sleep of death. Reclining in the bosom of Abraham. Paradise with Jesus. Passing over from death to life. The Creed wonderfully expresses Scripture: When we "look for the "resurrection of the body and the life of the world to come." Our real hope is tangible, physical, body and soul -- on the Last Day.

On that day, the New Heavens and the new earth join and all of us will be present there.

All creation is made new through Him. We are a connected creation. Jesus and the Father are One, and we are one with them with the Holy Spirit. The entire known world [cosmos, universe] and all that is beyond our sight is saved by Christ. For Adam and Eve to name animals and have the privilege to care for them, They had to know them. Have a connection to them, a love for them, an understanding them. That goes without saying for getting to know people and have a relationship.

This connectedness with people flowing from Jesus' love for us is at the heart of sainthood.

We are filled with our own selves and nothing more. No believer in Jesus can only be concerned about being saved Or only make sure their family and friends are with God's incrowd. That's a selfish faith. Salvation is always tied to purpose. You are saved with a purpose; Saved for a reason; Bought with the price of Blood. Following Christ doesn't come cheap but it is easy and light.

We don't go to heaven; we live in the reality of heaven now.

If self-salvation is your only concern, it's easy to become isolated;

Soon you think NO ONE is saved but you.

Many a church denomination heritage is built on this lie.

We Lutherans fall into that trap often

Heaven is not about belonging to the right group or following the correct rituals.

It's about having a humble, kind, love-centred Jesus view toward all of life. Having robes washed in the blood of Jesus is about everyday living. Each of you received this the day of your baptism and in God's gift of faith. Rather than giving us a coded blueprint of the future,

John's Revelation gives a visionary insight into the present situation. The story of God's work in history has never been about escaping Earth and going up to heaven.

It has always been about God descending to dwell among us. . . . God isn't a distant, terrifying ogre waiting for vengeance at the end of the universe. Because they may have passed on enjoying Heaven know. Perhaps they've even made a hell on earth. Hell is real. The Devil and his demons are there And any human person who wants to be there. True arrogant honest anti-faith, anti-Jesus people will not be forced into Heaven.

God will not threaten people into love. We either dwell in a loving relationship with God

or one of separation from the source of all life and joy. This moves us to remain thankful, grateful, peaceful and humble. Because it's not our call who God welcomes into His Kingdom.
