REV. TODD HOEFFS Advent 2 Mark 1:1-8 "Digging Up Bones" December 10, 2023

While learning about teaching children in schools. I heard an education term: re-direction. Rather than scold "hey, that's not right", You lead the child with the incorrection into a path of correction. Over time, kids learn critical thinking for choices they have to make and see wrongs not as failures but growing pains to learn differently. I've recently learned hockey has re-direction. When an offense player positions himself in front of the other team's goalie. Another offensive player, skating farther away from the net, takes a slapshot directly at the goalie. As the puck zooms toward the goal, the redirecting player lifts his stick and tries to deflect it past the goaltender. He does not want to get in the way. He does not want to block the puck. He simply tries to give it a slight touch, just enough to change the course of the shot past the goalie and (hopefully) into the back of the net. When done well, it's almost impossible to stop. I've also learned that Austin Matthews and Mitch Marner are a couple of the better-known players for re-direction on the Maple Leafs. [Of course, good old Wayne Gretzky too!] Re-direction is a lot like repentance. This is John the Baptizer's message in Mark's Gospel. The important work of readying the hard dry soil of humanity to see Jesus Christ, Son of God as the embodiment of the Gospel. John is the prophetic forerunner. After nearly 400 years of silence from God through any voice, He cries out from the wilderness. John is like a military scout leading a squad into combat. He's like an asphalt melting machine, crushing the crooked turns in the road, making the path wide and open for the Saviour to walk. Mark's first sentence takes us immediately into Jesus' earthly ministry. The good news about Jesus Christ, the Son of God" says a lot. "Jesus" is "Joshua" in Hebrew. Common and yet holy, meaning The LORD GOD IS Salvation". Jesus' name ties Him to the world -- He is a person –And gives the reason He's here – to bring God's Kingdom to earth. Christ identifies Him as the long-promised Messiah", the Anointed One". As the anointed prophets and kings of old. Christ shows He is The One set apart Who rescues His people from their enemies. Not always physical enemies, but THE enemy, Satan and death, results from Sin. The title "Son of God" beautifully unites the religious and political expectations destined for the Prince of Peace. A war waged -- not fought with sword but in suffering. An unexpected redirection. Prophetic writing Isaiah and Malachi are highlighted in John's job resume. He has purpose tied to salvation history. God is deeply involved with this plan. He sinks His only Son into it. Beginning not at the top, with Temple, Kings or Pharisees, but with a single voice from the wilderness speaking simply and directly. The Hebrew religious leaders had long forgotten the common man. John speaks against the dead legalism, the empty worship, the endless rules. John is from the wilderness and is baptizing people in the wilderness.

The Biblical understanding of wilderness isn't scary. It's more like a weight room for training. *God sends His people* to meet Him there as a temporary stop-over. A place of testing, learning, and refining. The wilderness is not a place to stay. It's desolate, uncultivated, and unfit for habitation. In the wilderness God has our attention. This is why John's baptism is there and not the like the ritual washing in the Temple. John's washing is a preparation.

Ending the need for ritual washing of sacrifices and offerings. Repentance comes with a bath because it carries over into our Baptism. Where our washing brings faith, forgiveness and the grace to live repentantly. In Mark's Gospel, repentance is *metanoia* in Greek [like our English word metamorphosis.] It's literally a mental stretching exercise. A change of preconceived notions in the mind. A basic transformation of a person's outlook; Not only of ourselves, but our world and how we fit into it. Totally, it's a conversion to a life lived not for self alone but for everyone. Repentance in this way is NOT Getting your act together before God will love you; Feeling guilt, saying sorry and forgetting all about it; Convincing yourself you keep the commands of God and are A OK. As the Greek view has a change of mind, the Hebrew view includes being moved by God to remain closer and closer to Him and His Son. It's not like a diet where you never eat sugar again. Repenting is not a giving up as much God moving us closer to Himself. It's confessing your wrong as wrong, receiving forgiveness and in that forgiving grace you look to Christ and not to the thing that grabbed your attention. It's not a one and done. It's an hourly, moment to moment, regular awareness Of who you are as a sinner and who you are as a forgiven saint in Jesus. This is how John expected God's people to repent. You see, John lives at a time when God's people are in desperate need for renewal. Non-Jews had long given up on religion, excusing away most religious beliefs as superstition and foolish tales. Both groups need John's message. Our times are not so different. So many churches have succumbed to fear and apathy. There are people searching and craving and longing for love and a listening ear. We Lutherans have often misunderstood repentance by either teaching it wrongly or ignoring it altogether. Repenting must never be separated from the Gospel. It calls us into a life growing good fruit - from faith -- love. **Kindness**

Peace Joy

Patience.

Gentleness

Truth.

Mercy.

These are hard when we get caught up in cycles of despair and depression,

where we're unable to imagine a time when our trials will never be solved,

where we hope to feel whole, a life without stress and worries; In the midst of tour trouble, there is the waiting: Waiting as hoping. Hoping with trusting. Walking by faith and not by sight. One of the best parts I enjoy when I work with clay and ceramic art, Is the anticipation of unloading a fired kiln oven. Seeing what unexpected imperfections are etched into the pottery, hoping nothing is broken. This is our Advent season. The anticipation that the world *can* be different – we *can* live into the promise of the Holy One. The Holy Spirit does blow though our tired souls with wind and fire. Just like the 1st Advent– full of anticipation and uncertainty and dreams. Because we know that Christ IS coming [again] – John the Baptizer's community did not know that for sure. And yet he says "the Kingdom of heaven has come near!" Repent. Believe. Repentance, like accountability, is not easy. Letting go of old patterns, releasing control of coping skills that no longer work, Re-writing and re-living of dominant narratives that harm – letting go of these things feels like a loss, and like fire. The sinful heart burns with sentimental jealousies. But repentance is is rooted in God, who gives the growth, with faith in Christ. Faith and grace embrace us so closely to God's heart That we can and do trust

that the fire of transformation will not burn us up, that baptismal waters of mercy will not drown us to death because through it all our Lord is holding us. Jesus has already burned in the fire of judgement and got washed in a bloody baptism on the cross. He's made the way into the Heavenly Kingdom as one of abundance and transformation and joy. The good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, and His kingdom Help us grow as we assess our methods. Praying that we love Go and love our neighbour. Praying for those who wish us harm. Faith actively lives out God's kingdom of peace and justice as our faith lights Shines like little cities of God set on hills for all to see. Through it all, Jesus helps us die with Him to our selfish ways so that we may have freedom and peace now, and in the Heaven awaiting us. While we anticipate, we are fed. While we wait, we are hugged and welcomed by Jesus. Bread and Wine carry Him into our mouth to remain in our hearts and lives. His life in our life is seen as we are seen. This past week, I had 2 encounters with non-Christian people. Both Muslim. The 1st, Abdul, at a hospital waiting room. Wearing a medium blue clergy shirt provoked him to ask about my church. Soon a faith discussion took off. "We are truly Abrahamic religion. We believe the prophets. We believe Jesus. We have Mohamed but Jesus Christ is better. He is life!" I just listened and validated the connections he made. He asked for prayer for himself and family sitting with him. "We [Muslims] love to talk faith and find common ground". I sat and thought: wow. I just witnessed a miracle. A few days passed, I'm at Walmart checkout. A young female cashier asks me "can I ask you a guestion"? Sure. Seeing my clergy collar, asks "you are working in a church?" Yes. "If I wanted to come to your church, what do I need to do? Are there rules?" "When you come, you only come with faith in Jesus to believe. His way is simple. Love God. Love your neighbour" [all in the course of 30 seconds]. She lit up like a Christmas tree smiling ear to ear. What good news. This tells us that there is hope. In the daily world there are people searching Needing Love, hope, peace, joy. Answers.

God is using their faith And re-directing them to His Son Through our voice. Crying out from our own wildernesses. Preparing the way for the Lord's great return. Amen.
