


The Holy Gospel, according to St. Luke, the 1st chapter: Glory to You, O Lord.


# THE SACRAMENT

# **REV. TODD HOEFFS**

**Advent 4** 

Scripture: St. Luke 1: 26-38 December 24, 2023 (10 AM)

What do you want to be when you grow up? It's a common question. It was probably asked of you in your younger years. We ask it of our children and grandchildren. Teachers talk about it in school.

In ancient times kids lives and futures were pre-arranged by parents. Martin Luther, for example, was the 1<sup>st</sup> born and his dad expected him to be a lawyer (not a priest). Artist Vincent Van Gogh was the 2<sup>nd</sup> born (but eldest, as his older brother died in infancy) and his dad expected him to fulfill every Dutch family's expectation as the 1<sup>st</sup> born, to be a Dutch Reformed pastor. World leaders pre-arranged marriages to for their infant children in the hopes of securing empires of power.

From the moment I discovered crayons and paper I wanted to be an artist. I used to dream of creating sets for movies and TV shows. And yet all those years the Lord was moving me into the direction that I become a pastor in the midst of learning how to make and teach art.

Sometimes I still hear adults saying that they don't know what they want to be when they grow up. Because the idea of a vocation today isn't as set into stone as in the past.

In university they told us that in an average working life, most people will change jobs at least 4 times. I'm sure it's more like 8 now.

Sometimes we can allow ourselves to dream of being something or someone else. At another level such dreams and desires point to the assumption that we are responsible for creating the life we want.

Look at your relationships, friendships, your family and marriage, your jobs and careers, your education, your home. All of those are attempts to create your life. That is not necessarily wrong. We have decisions to make and opportunities before us. We must be good caretakers of our resources and what God has given us. The difficulty comes when we start to believe and carry the burden that we are the ultimate creator of our life.

For in the beginning, God said and there was. He said let there be light and there was, let there be sky, dry land, earth that brings forth vegetation, fish that fill the waters, a sun and a moon.

Let us create humankind in our image and likeness. God said let there be all these things and there was all those things. Creation is the larger context for today's gospel, the Annunciation to Mary.

God speaks the creative word. Today, however, we remember Mary's words, "Let it be with me according to your word." Mary's words, "Let it be," echo God's words, "Let there be." It's like an ongoing call and response between God and humanity. He literally prays creation into existence with His Word and Spirit... and Mary says, "Amen. Let it be so." This is not an ending to the creation story but the continuation of creation and beginning of our salvation...ending with the new creation on Easter morning after

Good Friday's hauntingly glorious crucifixion – for us – for our world. God says, "Let there be" and his words bring forth creatures into the world. Mary says, "Let it be" and her words recognize that she will bring the Creator into the world. How amazing is that? 6 months along after cousin Elizabeth's miracle pregnancy enters the angel Gabriel...to Mary...a virgin betrothed to Joseph. It's not every day one sees or hears from an angel. Not even every century. The last time Gabriel was heard from was over 500 years before to Daniel during the Babylonian exile. And now he comes not once but twice within six months, first to Jerusalem and the temple and then to Nazareth in Galilee. And while the appearances of an angel may be very rare occurrences, they do serve the purpose of being God's method of announcing to something really important. People may still hear from angels today, but there's no promise that we will. I recall praying with a dying man in a hospital who saw hovering in the corner of his room "angels in frills". He died a few days later. With God nothing is impossible.

# It's an unconventional birth announcement.

Faithful. Prophetic. Unsentimental. We like to paint Mary in the softer hues—her robes clean, hair combed and covered, body poised in prayerful surrender—but this young woman was young, full of strength and the Holy Spirit. When she receives the dangerous charge before her, (every birth was risky in those days, this one especially so), rather than reciting a maternal blessing, Mary offers a prophecy: "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant."

With her famous words, words from Scripture itself, Mary not only announces a birth, she announces the inauguration of a new kingdom, one that stands in stark contrast to every other kingdom—past, present, and future—that relies on violence and exploitation to achieve "greatness."

This Kingdom will come because the power of the Most High God is in control and HE will direct NOT only the birth of her baby but His Work to Save Humanity.

Mary stands at the end of a long promise line that began with Eve in the beginning and God's words to the devil, "I will put enmity between you and the woman, between your seed and her Seed." Mary is Eve's historical counterpart, the bookends of motherhood. Eve is the mother of all the living; Mary is the mother of the One who is life. Eve heard the tempting devil's word, and with Adam, believed the serpent's lies; Mary heard the Word of God through the angel, and she carried the Christ child, born to take away all sins. Eve conceived and bore a sinner, Cain, the murderer of his brother. Mary conceived and bore the Lord, the Savior of His brothers.

All according to God's Word. The Holy Spirit's seed will overshadow Mary, and God will take on flesh because Mary's humanity gives him that possibility. Through God's gift of humanity to Mary He transforms our humanity because we are forgiven and carry the Holy Spirit within. The incarnation of God in Jesus is not, however, limited to Mary. It is an affirmation of God's creation and the goodness of humanity. God chooses human flesh, not a cedar house, as the place of God's dwelling. Each one of us can stand as the "favoured one," with Mary.

Each of us is called to grow up as God-bearers, to carry the life of God within our own humanity by faith in God's Word and Baptism. So let it be to us, who are washed in the

Blood of God's own Son. Let it be to us who fight against our own failures and faults and sins and have only the one hope of Christ our Saviour Whose birth as a human means we will remain with our God forever. Nothing stands in the way. The infant in Mary's womb makes the way easy for us to journey to God's Kingdom of Heaven. Jesus the Christ could have come as a mighty man born of royalty; but He came as an infant born of a virgin. He could have come in glory; yet He came in hidden humility. He could have come in power; and still He came in hidden strength. He could've skirted the suffering, the manger, the brutality, the thorns, the nails, the spear; but not only did our LORD not avoid it but fully embraced it with open arms. Arms stretched out across the beams gathering all of the lost world into His embrace.

So let it be unto us. Let His birth give us life and His death give us eternal peace. Mary is a part of us, too, as we die and rise anew in the mother church. For as part of God's redeemed faithful creation we carry the Christ child in our word, our preaching, our singing and in our serving.

Like Mary, we discover the life God is creating in us and who are to be when we grow up. Mary teaches us how to say, "Yes."

We echo Mary's words, "Let it be so unto me according to Your Word." This is not a "live and let live" whatever attitude. It means we are made humble, vulnerable, open, receptive to God and His Word and His plan to take care of us in good and bad. To trust that the Christ child born anew in us through the Holy Spirit will keep us safe and secure and certain of the hope that we have. That nothing can ever separate us from God's Love.

"Let it be so unto me." With those words Mary receives the life God is creating in her. Between "How can this be?" and "Let it be" the impossible becomes a reality, the never before heard of will forever be spoken of, and the veil between divinity and humanity has fallen.

Baptism is the connecting watery word that births you from above in a birth that is every bit as miraculous as Jesus' birth from a virgin mother. That same Word forgives you daily and richly, in an absolution spoken not by an angel but by a fellow sinner called and ordained to an office that dares to speak in the stead and by the command of Jesus.

And it is by the same Word that a bit of bread brings that Body born of Mary given into death on the cross to your mouth, and a sip of wine that brings that Blood which is the life of the Son of God to your lips.

God's Word of hope spoken by the angel Gabriel is clear, at Christmas time and every time.... "Nothing will be impossible with God." No matter where life takes us or whatever we become when we grow up, we are 1<sup>st</sup> and foremost growing up into Christ, our light and Life - "Let it be so unto us, according to our God." Amen.

# REV. TODD HOEFFS CHRISTMAS DAY CAROL COMMUNION

Scripture: St. John 1:1-10 December 25, 2023 + 10 AM

It begins with...a word.

Words are everywhere.

Our Christmas carols are words set to music.

Words fill our Christmas cards, our dinner conversation, our emails, lists and our worship. John's Gospel begins with a word...the WORD.

Mirroring the WORD at the very beginning, when God created the heavens and the earth. John's Gospel in fact connects the creation of the world to the birth of Jesus Christ.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. Christmas and Creation. New life and new birth. And both begin with THE WORD. Words are used without much thought or care by people but to GOD, the WORD means everything. It means life. It does what the speaker says.

And the Word is Jesus. THE VERBAGE spoken at the beginning of everything was the VERY LORD JESUS himself, without a human body. So what John is saying is that Jesus' story doesn't begin at his birth in the manger nor at his baptism. It doesn't begin with his ancestors. No, Jesus' story begins all the way back at the beginning of all things. At the beginning of creation.

John makes a startling claim. In the beginning was the Word, and... All things came into being through him. Without him not one thing came into being.

Notice that in *this* Christmas story, it isn't Mother Mary who is giving birth. No manger, no lack of room in an inn, no angel messengers, no visiting shepherds. Here, Jesus is the one who is giving birth as John says, "*All things came into being through him.*" All things came into being *through* him.

What is most important to John is that the Word, Jesus, has given birth to all things. To the world! To you. To me. To the very snowy cold ground beneath our feet.

So, according to John, today isn't just Jesus' birthday, it is ours. We are re-born anew in Jesus' birth, re-created in His image as redeemed, saved, love brothers and sisters. The Word of God has given birth to all things, which makes it our birthday and a day in which we are claimed as children of God. By His light and life and water and word. For His Word is not meaningless or powerless but accomplished whatever our Lord deems appropriate.

But John's story doesn't stop there. Because this isn't just about birth. This Word of God, this light of all people -- shines in the darkness. Jesus the real LIGHT – enlightens -- Everyone.

Which is amazing and remarkable. Not only does he give birth to all things, but he illuminates everything He makes. Not only revealing what is hidden in the dark, but we become aware of what God has done and continues to do in our lives. We are made aware of our sins but also aware of our forgiveness by the WORD, the Lord Jesus.

Yes, Christmas is a birthday indeed. Unlike candles on a birthday cake, Jesus' light shines into every dark corner so that nothing is hidden from sight.

John's story still doesn't stop there. The true light, Jesus, enlightens everyone and is coming into the world **even though the world received him not**.

Jesus comes to us and opens us up to His holiness and grace even when we do not know him. THIS is good news.

And we can only know HIM because He has made Himself knowable. As the Word of God born in a manger for us to see and embrace and relate to. HE's like us. He's a baby, same way we all enter this world. Only He is without any sin or fault. It's also good news for those of us who struggle to know Jesus. Or for those of us whose family members struggle to know Jesus. Or for those who either have given up on seeking Christ or who feel abandoned by God. It is most truly at Christmas time we see our God cozy up very close to us in winning us over to His saving Kingdom. Not by coercion or bribery or good works but by His WORD, the Living Word, Jesus. Christmas is not simply when we celebrate the birth of Christ, but when we celebrate the birth of all things. All of us. It is when we are reminded of where we come from. And to whom we belong.

# For *The Word became flesh and dwelled among us.*

Dwelled is the word for Tabernacle in the Greek Bible. The Word tabernacled among us in the flesh in Bethlehem just as He tented with His people of old in the wilderness. The spoken Word took on a body. Flesh that bleeds and blesses. Flesh that touches and tears. Flesh that callouses through hard work and grows thin when the work of life is finished. Finished on Calvary. At the manger we see the cross. The ancient Word of promise that life will grow new from death. From suffering we have salvation. Such a fragile, vulnerable idea, this incarnation. Such a risky thing, this love of God for His wayward people. That God would put His very own life and flesh on the line (HIS ONLY SON'S LIFE) just to be with us. By actually becoming part of us. In the fleshyness of life. Into this everyday stuff.

So "all of human life and history is infused with God's goodness." Which isn't to say that everything in life is just perfect and wonderful. Or that people are connected to God apart from faith. To trust in this Word of God does not mean that people do not waste their lives, get hurt or hurt other people. It does not mean that there is no hardship...no evil, no tragedy. (But) what it does mean is that there is no corner of (this life) so hidden that (God's presence) cannot find it...There is no moment so dark that it can extinguish the light of God which even now shines in it."<sup>[2]</sup>

It means that God is at work in every place at every single moment, no matter how dark it is, bringing light to this world. That is the story that John is trying to tell. You are God's children. Each and every one of you. You came into being through Jesus – born out of God. And God is with you. In our Hebrews reading, it says that the Son of God is anointed with oil of joy. As God's very own sons and daughters, adopted into His family with the baptismal shower, you too will have a chance to be anointed

with the oil of joy this morning during holy communion. At the very WORD bread holds Jesus' Body and wine holds Jesus' Blood. A great and mighty wonder, Christmas comes to your mouth. As the oil of WORD AND SACRAMENT is placed onto your fragile flesh, know that it's there to soften your life and your heart, so that there will be no doubt in your mind who you are – you are the children of God.

And as children of God, we are called to share in the risk of incarnation. In the midst of heartache and fear that life can bring, we too are asked to embody the Word and words of God – to allow words like love, mercy, forgiveness, grace to be enfleshed in our bodies.[3]

From here, we go back to our homes, or travel to other places and encounter other beloved children of God for Whom the WORD has come to save. May we see each other and others as fellow redeemed in the Light of Christ. This means that others like us are worthy of love, forgiveness, and grace. That around our meal tables we share in the great gift of life, that the Christmas joy be born in our words and attitudes and actions. That includes siblings, parents, in-laws, strangers. And yourself. In the beginning...with a word, THE WORD. That Word has become flesh, dwelling among us. The child has been born in a manger, worshiped by shepherds, sung by angels.

The Word has been spoken and enfleshed. What words are left to say? Like John, we are Gospel storytellers and we have an amazing story to tell. The Word of God, Jesus, gave birth to you, which means you are his descendants. You have his DNA coursing through your veins. Let us then do the world a favor and share his story with everyone. Let us witness about how Christ is God's Word, embodying His promise to never leave us forsaken. And when you tell that story to another person, Jesus is right there, born anew there with you. In the flesh. Close. And not far off. So with our words and lives, let us celebrate birth and life and this holy Christmas day. Amen.



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
