

The Epistle: Acts of the Apostles 19:1-7 Baptism of Jesus Reading

While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul passed through the inland regions and came to Ephesus, where he found some disciples. He said to them, 'Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?' They replied, 'No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit.' Then he said, 'Into what then were you baptized?' They answered, 'Into John's baptism.' Paul said, 'John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus.' On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. The Holy Gospel: St. Mark 1:4-11 Baptism of Jesus Gospel

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Mark, the 1st chapter:

Glory to You, O Lord.

John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, 'The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit.' In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of

Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to You, O Christ.

Yes, I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of Heaven and earth.


Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son?

REV. TODD HOEFFS
Epiphany & Baptism of Jesus
Acts 19:1-7
"Bridge over troubled waters"
January 7, 2024

Mr. Ruff was a tall, thin, well-dressed church member where I served as my 1st call in Edmonton. Wearing a 3 piece suit every Sunday. A WW2 veteran serving as a blacksmith in southern Alberta for army Cavalry in 1939. By the time I was his pastor, He was 89 years old. He was on his 8th pacemaker. When he needed number 9, I visited him in the hospital. His wife of nearly 60 years had already died years prior. Conversing about his deep love and affection for her, Mr Ruff cried tears of love as if she died moments ago. Her beauty, her care. her personality, her love. How he longed to see her in the Heavenly kingdom. We don't let go of those we love, especially spouses and even more-so if we lose a child. This is why the followers of John the Baptizer can't immediately switch their love. John's disciples adhered to him. His abrasive charisma radiates powerfully drawing people to the source of renewal – In the hope of a better messenger, a perfect teacher, a divine Servant. Jesus Christ. Their love and devotion to John will shift to Jesus. All within God's salvation time-frame. John had been dead since 31 AD. Apostle Paul is on his 3rd mission travel to Ephesus around 52 AD. Ephesus is 990 kms away from Jerusalem. Ephesus is a busy seaport in present day Turkey across the Aegean Sea east of Greece. I've been wondering: Why are John the Baptizer's followers not already Christ followers & how did they end up in Ephesus?! Turns out, many Jews fled to any place safe during the dominant & often turbulent reign of Rome. God is also unfolding His great miracle of Epiphany again & again. All nations still seek Jesus. All people are drawn to the Light of Jesus. It's happening again. When Apostle Paul gets to Ephesus after being in Corinth, he teaches daily in the lecture hall of Tyrannus [a pagan cultural centre] and creates a church there. Very smart. Share the Gospel by hanging around public venues and in the style of the philosophers lecture people into believing. I know I've gained so many more witnessing opportunities in stores, malls, hospitals, than in regular Christian gathering places. Since the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost, faith authenticity rests in Jesus & the Spirit. The Spirit keeps us in the faith of Christ -- this is the heart & soul of the church. John the Baptizer even said "there is ONE Who comes that's mightier than I... He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire". We also can't assume because John mentioned the Spirit, these believers know about the Spirit. [Just as we assume if an activity is printed once in the bulletin we all read it!] It helps to know that John had been a popular prophet. (If an appetizer is great, why have an unknown entree?) John remained crystal clear to his followers HE IS NOT the messiah. He's an unworthy messenger preparing the way. John didn't invent baptism. Pools for washing away impurities, such as handling blood or contact with skin ailments, existed in John's community and near the Jerusalem Temple. Ritual cleansing before approaching God had long been a part of Jewish life. Washing basins, utensils, even sacrificial offerings. Besides washing, repentance had long been part of Jewish life and faith. Time after time, God led them through oppression by a foreign power until they repent, often at the urging of a prophet. John's message of readiness was the last word 12 of his followers heard. Paul is moving them from John the messenger to Jesus the Saviour; from a water baptism for repentance to a water baptism by the Holy Spirit

and with fire. Pointing out: "John [was] telling the people to believe in the one who comes after him, that is, in Jesus." You can't ignore Jesus and adhere to John.

You can't have 2 masters. You can't say you're a Christian and live a life where the Light of Jesus doesn't show. Loyalties connected to faith are hard to break. How easy is it believing those lies than the hard truth. We have favourite politicians. Beloved teachers.

The only pastor you ever known and ever liked. Favoured child or parent – "mom always liked you best". We all have preferences. But there can be no other god in place of Jesus.

When we allow our preferences to become words or actions, it can be damaging,

Even divisive [which Paul had in his churches] We get an idea set in our minds or trust an inner feeling & unless someone says the narrative we've woven in out heads, we put our back up immediately. My same Edmonton Parish, A new candidate 25 years old.

Had a pastor they adored 28 years. New pastor came for 5 years – they HATED.

Drained the church of 300 to 40 My 1st Voters meeting. People sat on opposing sides of the room with arms folded. Visible Division. Support one of the other – us vs them.

Deadly. Took 10 of my 12 years to dismantle the toxic environment. It would be splendid creating quick unity but, like all relationships, Real true lasting unity takes time and patience and prayer and communication. Because God is the creator of unity.

Christ died on the cross alone to bring us all together. Apostle Paul can't in good conscience allow disunity in the Lord's new church. Disagreements are healthy and common; what is deadly is how those get settled. Disagreement need not become disrespectful nor abusive. When it becomes all about what a few want as opposed to what the Lord wants. This is selfish and unhealthy, and repentance then is needed to help us live out Our calling as followers of Christ. Its very unwise fighting against the Spirit, thinking any of us know better -rather filled with the Spirit we can trusting the change and growth will come. That creates a healthy church life. This brings new health to John's 12 followers.

So Paul baptizes them in the name of the Lord Jesus, lays hands on them And they receive the Holy Spirit. All taking place about 19 years after the Day of Pentecost.

The Spirit is actively working & their response is immediate. The gift of faith inspires tongues and prophecy. Tongues here is speaking in a heavenly dialect not known to the hearers; And in worship setting they usually have another person as an interpreter witness.

Prophecy here is truth telling, sharing the faith in Christ, validating the work of the Spirit as peace inspires justice. Tongues and prophecy might seem odd to us, 2000 plus years later. We're skeptical at times of these in our day. Lutherans historically have discounted tongues and prophecy. True, the visibility of the Holy Spirit might not always be in front of us -- Yet God allows access to this in every age and will offer this gift when and if any believer needs it. He always gives us what we need at the right time and place.

[Story? Glenda – saw angels fly around my head as I consecrated Communion.]
All believers in Christ have the indwelling of the Holy Spirit – and there are many gifts.
Tongues and prophecy are but two [teaching, encouraging, evangelizing...The true test of faith we see and hear throughout Scripture is Loving God, loving your neighbour as yourself, grace through faith, All prompted by the Holy Spirit. This comes into our hearts by grace in Baptism -- Giving us access to use of whatever gifts and talents we've been given to witness to what God has done in Christ. Baptize and teach. Jesus says this.

Apostle Paul is doing it. John is fine, his baptism had its day and purpose.

Jesus Himself gets baptized and makes our baptism the direct avenue for forgiveness, new life and faith. When Jesus steps into our world as a person like us He makes us worthy vessels of the Spirit. Makes us worthy to wear the cross He will have to die upon.


He will suffer and die alone to ensure we are never alone. This is why the Spirit comes down to Jesus when He is baptized. His Father and Spirit remain with Him, as the living Trinity on earth. This is why God's validates His well-pleasing Son with a heavenly voice. This validates not only Apostle Paul's baptism -- It also validates every church's baptism all these centuries later. By allowing the hands of Christ to be laid upon us once again, the church can speak with a new tongue in our daily mission to show the love of Christ in the world. We may not always see such immediate Spirit driven activity among us. It may look different. It may look absent at times. It may look lonely or isolated or in chaos. It may mean less of our own desires and more listening and caring. More interest in the community or a stranger or person in need of a kind word. God is divinely shifting our preferences and wants to an embracing of the present moments of mercy here, now. Embracing everything the Gospel of Jesus is – Caring less for what was

And caring more for what is - Jesus and His Spirit.
