

for his class is longer. Asser celebrated his 4th birthday on January 9th. He had a cake on January 3rd and one on January 8th. Ameer's 6th birthday was on November 15th so he missed celebrating it here in Canada, so he

also got a cake to celebrate it with Asser.



Thank you to everyone who helped furnish the home for the Al Humaidi family. The boys are using and enjoying the guilts Gloria made. They have also been enjoying the gifts of toys given to them.

Many things have been accomplished. They were registered for OHIP and have their new cards. Bank accounts have been opened for Kareem and Hamida, as well as Social Insurance Numbers for both of them. An Ontario ID card has been obtained for Kareem, and we will apply for one for Hamida as well. They both had their language tests early in December which made them eligible for the ESL training. The boys have dental appointments with Niagara Dental health this coming week. The family has been registered with Niagara Folk Arts for settlement help. Kareem has already met with them and has two more appointments this coming week. They will assist Kareem with putting together a resume for job applications. Kareem is anxious to get a job so if anyone has any leads please let one of the committee members know. He needs to take one step at a time and have some additional English training. and comprehension. Immigration Canada decided that Kareem's photo for his Permanent Resident card was not good enough, so this week he had to have his photo retaken and submitted to the processing centre. Niagara Folk Arts told us this has been happening quite often with new immigrants, so hopefully we won't have to do it for Hamida and the boys. Kareem is continually expressing his thankfulness for everything you have done for him and his family. Please continue to pray for them as they continue to make their new home here in St. Catharines with us.

THE WORD

The Old Testament: 1 Samuel 3: 1-20

The boy Samuel served the Lord under Eli. In those days the Lord did not speak directly to people very often. There were very few visions. Eli's eyes were so weak he was almost blind. One night he was lying in bed. ³ Samuel was also in bed in the Lord's Holy Tent. The Ark of the Covenant was in the Holy Tent. God's lamp was still burning. Then the Lord called Samuel. Samuel answered, "I am here!" He ran to Eli and said, "I am here. You called me." But Eli said, "I didn't call you. Go back to bed." So Samuel went back to bed. The Lord called again, "Samuel!" Samuel again went to Eli and said, "I am here. You called me." Again Eli said, "I didn't call you. Go back to bed." Samuel did not yet know the Lord. The Lord had not spoken directly to him yet. The Lord called Samuel for the third time. Samuel got up and went to Eli. He said, "I am here. You called me." Then Eli realized the Lord was calling the boy. So he told Samuel, "Go to bed. If he calls you again, say, 'Speak, Lord. I am your servant, and I am listening." So Samuel went and lay down in bed. The Lord came and stood there. He called as he had before. He said, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel said, "Speak, Lord. I am your servant, and I am listening." The Lord said to Samuel, "See, I am going to do something in Israel. It will shock those who hear about it. At that time I will do to Eli and his family everything I promised. I will not stop until I have finished. I told Eli I would punish his family forever. I will do it because Eli knew his sons were evil. They spoke against me, but he did not control them. So here is what I promised Eli's family: 'Your guilt will never be removed by sacrifice or offering.'" Samuel lay down until morning. Then he opened the doors of the Tent of the Lord. He was afraid to tell Eli about the vision. But Eli said to him, "Samuel, my son!" Samuel answered, "I am here." Eli asked, "What did the Lord say to you? Don't hide it from me. May God punish you terribly if you hide from me anything he said to you." So Samuel told Eli everything. He did not hide anything from him. Then Eli said, "He is the Lord. Let him do what he thinks is best." The Lord was with Samuel as he grew up. He did not let any of Samuel's messages fail to come true. Then all Israel, from Dan to Beersheba, knew Samuel was a prophet of the Lord.

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.


The Epistle: 1 Corinthians 6:12-20

[St. Paul writes]: 'All things are lawful for me', but not all things are beneficial. 'All things are lawful for me', but I will not be dominated by anything. 'Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food', [a] and God will destroy both one and the other. The body is meant not for fornication but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. And God raised the Lord and will also raise us by his power. Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Should I therefore take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Never! Do you not know that whoever is united to a prostitute becomes one body with her? For it is said, 'The two shall be one flesh.' But anyone united to the Lord becomes one spirit with him. Avoid sexual immorality! Every sin that a person commits is outside the body; but the sexual adulterer sins against the body itself. Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, which you have

from God, and that you are not your own? For you were bought with a price; therefore glorify God in your body.


The Holy Gospel: St. John 1:43-51





REV. TODD HOEFFS Epiphany 2 1 Corinthians 6:12-20 "Don't Just Go To Church, BE The Church" January 14, 2024

Teaching Elementary School art classes was so much fun! Kindergarteners had the best imaginations and uses of colour! But there was something about grade 1 classes. I recall introducing clay for creating small handheld pinch pots.

Nearly every grade 1 boy in every classroom felt compelled to create – toilets! [With a little something in it!]

My colleague teacher [with tons of experience] told me to say -

"You must make something you would not be afraid to show your grandma!!!"

That did it. I kinda got the feeling though –They just had to get it out of their system and could move on. Title grade 1 clay toilets was lawful, maybe not permissible! LOL This brings us to Apostle Paul's wisdom to the very new Corinthian church. Corinth is an important and wealthy city on the narrow strip of land separating Northern and Southern Greece. St. Paul will spend 18 months there on his 2nd Missionary Journey. This letter is response to a report from Chloe's people about problems in the Corinthian church. Chloe is interesting enough in and of herself. She has authority in her household of faith. And is treated by Apostle Paul on almost the same level; which did to exist in the ancient world. The Corinthian church struggle with 2 main issues: Whether or not they keep to a strictly Jewish diet or embrace a Greek/Roman style? The other issue pertains to our reading for the day – sexual sins pertaining to lust of the heart. Corinth in Paul's day [50 AD?] saw a population of 200,000. Philosopher Cicero called it the "Eye of Greece". A seat of government with 2 major busy ports. Corinth hosted Isthmian Games, a Pan Hellenic festival, second in status to the Olympian Festival. Contests were usually dedicated to Zeus, Apollo and Poseidon. Emphasising song, dance, archery and chariot skills. Culture thrived. Elaborate wardrobes, jewellery, art, theatre and romance. A hopping place for Paul to preach. Nearby the church in Corinth the Tempe of Aphrodite could easily be seen. The goddess of love, intimacy, and fertility.

Nearly 1,000 male and female priests "ministered" to the temple gatherers.

It is in this context Paul writes about what is lawful or permissible. He's choosing a very basic legal term. Whatever is enforced by the law of Rome and/or the Law of God. We have to be careful here: Much of Corinthian life can be available to any city around the world. He's NOT saying THE WORLD IS EVIL, avoid it at all costs.

He's also NOT saying HEY, WHATEVER FLOATS YOUR BOAT, go ahead.

We Lutherans have often used a phrase – we can do everything -- Moderately [LOL]. Thinking about this helps be critically sound as the Body of Christ in the world. MANY things are legal. And we are in the world as examples of how we follow the law here and How we are enjoined to a Kingdom not of this world.

Jesus says it best – nothing that goes into the Body [or comes at the Body] Is sinful and wrong, But what come OUT of the body, that is full of sinfulness. Example: gambling is lawful. I really enjoy going to Las Vegas. [Lights, sound, culture, shopping, dining...] There is no end to throwing your money away at the snap of a \$20 bill. Not to mention the "other" unmentionable entertainment places. It's lawful for me to go there—I don't care for gambling-- And I make sure there are plenty of performers or shows to

see to occupy my time. That's lawful. But if I was easily attracted to gambling [and no one can really afford to gamble] And to lustful shows, or spending too lavishly,

Then it would be best to stay away. This is really the issue. Most of our English Bibles translate the other part of Paul's advice as permissible. But that isn't true to the Greek origin. SYMPHERO is the word – where we get our term Symphony.

It means "bringing together." Symphonies bring together wonderful instruments to perform one song. How brilliant of Paul to use a word from the Corinthian theatre! Not every lawful thing creates unity of bringing people together.

Labour party Harold Wilson once told the Queen – He'd rather smoke a cigar but chooses to smoke a pipe. Cigars signal the upper class, business barons and monopolists. Pipes represent the working class, real down to earth people.

One can make changes and still be true to oneself he said. Black clergy shirts signal austere, even unapproachable. Colourful clergy shirts signal every day, common, creative, open, and makes people wonder what denomination you represent! Martin Luther taught that none of us are truly free. We cannot choose God or work hard to obtain saving faith in the Gospel. We cannot decide to follow Jesus because we are born with the inability to recognize the truth about God. We come into the world as God finds us, knows us even before we make our 1st cry. We are in bondage to sin, the threat of eternal death and a sitting target for Satan. When faith is born anew, by the Word in Baptismal water, We are then captive to God through Jesus Christ with the Holy Spirit. For it is only by faith can any of us say with Paul, Is this lawful or beneficial? Food is made to supply nourishment to our bodies; Our bodies also are made to enjoy such foods.

Both our stomachs and our food will be gone one day. Another reason why our personal appetites cannot be our only concern. We can & should be concerned with others' needs, bread of life and daily bread. Hence, the warning against the sexual sin. Because it is more than just a momentary outward feeling. Most English Bibles use the term fornication or sexual immorality. Paul uses the Greek term PORNEI, where we get the term pornography. Pornei is cheap payment for sex with someone who's been with numerous people. Pornei was not speaking of any LGBTQ gay or trans issues here. It's prostitution; payment for a gift God has given us to use freely with the one we love. Leviticus in the OT forbid this; Greek and Roman culture did not. It was LAWFUL. It's the heart. The lust, the desires without concern for one's faith life. Having numerous intimate partners means you're giving yourself away to people In a way that is supposed to be with one person. It abuses you emotionally, psychologically, and spiritually. In God's view, such a person is connected to each partner the same. This breaks down the entire human family. This does not reflect a Godly life as the Body of Christ in the world. Since Christ lives in us by faith, we no longer follow strict laws of circumcision, or sacrificing bulls and lambs, or avoiding pork chops or shrimp and lobster. Those had been for ancient hygene and religious sacredness. If someone chooses not to eat such things, fine. If they do, that's fine too. In Christ, all the ceremonies, sacrifices, priesthood, temple, festivals in the Old Testament have now found their fulfillment in Jesus. They had a purpose; that purpose is complete. Jesus makes all things new. Now we are bound to Christ. Jesus gives the new and best commandment, to love God & love one another. Because of the completely sacrificial and generous love God has lavished on us in His Son, We, in turn, by faith, love Him and learn to love each other. How do children come to love their parents? Is it because their mother and father demand their love with ever increasing

Is it because their mother and father demand their love with ever increasing threats of punishment if the children do not give it? No, you just love them, protect them, nourish and guide them. And they respond in love, too. And that love, that generosity, that interest in helping, Is the sole motivating Spirit-led growth of the church. The Body of Jesus

around the globe. We rely on Gospel-inspired judgement. We want to go easy on ourselves, and be hard on all those out there – We want to hide our sin and expose all the others. Because I'm in here, I'm good?! Uh, no. The opposite. The Body of Christ, followers, believers, worshippers, Are the insiders. We are temples of the Holy Spirit. We are called not to hide sin, or make excuses for sinful behaviour; We are gentler with the outside world, kinder to new seekers to the faith, So that they have an easy welcome and allowed time to grow into the faith. No one comes in here perfect. But we all leave forgiven & restored. It's less about going to church but BEING the church. We are here because we get to have the food needed for living out there as Jesus' Body. No different than eating breakfast, lunch or dinner. Baptism seals our identity. The Holy Spirit animates our feet forward in faith. The cross of Jesus marks our bodies as His temple. We are bought with a price.
