CONFESSION & FORGIVENESS

In the name of the Father and of the Son + and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.** If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.

But if we confess our sins, God, Who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. [Brief silence for reflection]

Let us then confess our sins to God our Father:

Most merciful God, we confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean. We have sinned against You in thought, word and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved You with our whole heart. We have not loved our neighbours as ourselves. We justly deserve Your present and eternal punishment. For the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us, forgive us, renew us and lead us, so that we may delight in Your will and walk in Your ways to the glory of Your Holy Name. Amen.

Almighty God in His mercy has given His Son to die for you and for His sake, forgives you all of your sin. As a called and ordained servant of Christ and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all of your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son + and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

THE WORD

The Old Testament Genesis 17: 1-7, 15-16

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the Lord appeared to Abram, and said to him, 'I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous.' Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, 'As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you the father of a multitude of nations. I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you. I will establish my covenant between me and you, and your offspring after you throughout their generations, for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you....And God said to Abraham, 'As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name. I will bless her, and moreover I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall give rise to nations; kings of peoples shall come from her.'

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

The Epistle: Romans 4:13-25

[St. Paul writes:] For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation. For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, as it is written, 'I have made you the father of many nations')—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. Hoping against hope, he believed that he would become 'the father of many nations', according to what was said, 'So numerous shall your descendants be.' He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was already as good as dead (for he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. Therefore his faith 'was reckoned to him as righteousness.' Now the words, 'it was reckoned to him', were written not for his sake alone, but for ours also. It will be reckoned to us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, who was handed over to death for our trespasses and was raised for our justification.

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.



The Holy Gospel: St. Mark 8: 31-38 The Holy Gospel, according to St. Mark, the 8th chapter: Then [Jesus] began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, 'Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.' He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels.'



THE NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of Heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. And in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of the Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, Very God of Very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father; by Whom all things were made. REV. TODD HOEFFS Lent 2 Genesis 8 & 17 Even Storms Run Outta Rain February 25, 2024

By the end of the week, we have Feb 29, our leap year.

This means we have an extra day this year, so everyone's birthday this year leap a day. If your birthday should be on a Monday, it'll be on a Tuesday. There is a science to this. Our calendar year is 365 days long. Defining the number of days it takes the Earth to complete one orbit around the Sun. But 365 is actually a rounded number. It takes Earth 365.242190 days to orbit the Sun, or 365 days 5 hours 48 minutes and 56 seconds. If we didn't account for this extra time, the seasons would begin to drift. This would be annoying if not devasting, because eventually our summers would begin to occur in December! Why? Because even the earth's orbit is affected by imperfection. And yet, all Heaven and nature sing because of Jesus Christ! By the time our Old Testament reading from Genesis comes to life. The earth is overgrown with a corrupted, evil, people turning their backs on God. He let the earth get flooded after much warning to embrace salvation And join Noah in the ark. As depicted in the sermon slide. Noah trusts God and builds an ark when the countryside is desert dry. He preaches about this for 120 years. And no coverts. Yet he keeps building the ark. Noah is confident. He is hopeful. He is faithful. He takes 2 of every kind of creature of the earth [up to 6800 creatures with him!] His wife, 3 sons and their 3 wives. Once the devastating flood waters subside after 40 days and nights, God brings a covenant. God speaks an oath to Noah and his family: "...the covenant I am making between me and you and every living creature with you...for all generations to come: I have set my rainbow in the clouds...and whenever it appears... I will remember my covenant. Never again will the waters become a flood to destroy all life." God's great covenant. This is important. Prior to this, God promised to save the entire world with the seed of a woman Who will crush the Satanic serpent's head. God speaks directly to Cain after killing his brother Abel And gives Cain a mark to spare the rest of his earthly life. Know, God speaks a much broader, all-encompassing promise. Covenant in the ancient Hebrew is berivth. A cut. Like the cut of circumcision. God is cutting a promise. Noah is grateful to the Lord for saving him and his family. After the flood, he builds an altar to God (Gen. 8:20) and makes an animal sacrifice. God loves it, and Noah says "the Lord smelled a soothing aroma" (Gen. 8:21). Later covenants will be made as the spoken Word of God passes through 2 cut pieces of animal flesh on the Temple altar just like Noah. Covenants are binding spiritually and legally. God speaks to Abraham. His covenant identifies the family that God uses to bring the Messiah into the world. Abraham has heard for many years he's going to have a son and his descendants would be as numerous as the stars in the sky. Through the family history of Abraham, all the families of the earth will be blessed. Not just a child, a son; But the saving of the world and people will come to be through this promise. God's covenants form the unifying thread of His saving action through Scripture. This is laying the groundwork for the sacred nature of Israel As they carry the promised Saviour. Jesus' cross removes our sin. It transforms our entire lives. We are made new.

Christ empties Himself and fills up His Body with us - redeemed and cleansed,

And know we dwell in Him and He in us, By rising up from the dead, He fills all as He is in all. Like Noah, we are saved. Like Abraham, we are saved for a purpose.

We have an identity in crucified One. An inheritance, a hope and a way of peace. Christ is our life.

He is God's promise come to life.

We are His new covenants, living, breathing promises of help to a helpless world. Year in, year out.

Leap year and every other year.

We are the Lord's for 365 calendar days plus. Amen.
