



THE SCRIPTURES

First Reading Acts of the Apostles 4:1-12

While Peter and John were speaking to the people, the priests, the captain of the temple, and the Sadducees came to them, much annoyed because they were teaching the people and proclaiming that in Jesus there is the resurrection of the dead. So they arrested them and put them in custody until the next day, for it was already evening. But many of those who heard the word believed; and they numbered about five thousand. The next day their rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem, with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, 'By what power or by what name did you do this?' Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, 'Rulers of the people and elders, if we are questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are asked how this man has been healed, let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. This Jesus is "the stone that was rejected by you, the builders; it has become the cornerstone." There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among mortals by which we must be saved.'

This is the Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

The Epistle *1 John 3:16-24*

We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us—and we ought to lay down our lives for one another. How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help? Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him. And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Holy Gospel St. John 10:11-18


The Holy Gospel, according to St. John, the 10th chapter: **Glory to You, O Lord.**

[Jesus says:] 'I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord: **Praise to You, O Christ!**







REV. TODD HOEFFS

April 21, 2024 - 4th Easter + Good Shepherd Sunday

1 John 3:16-21

It's Real Love, It's Really Really Real

In the Bible, "love" appears almost 700 times.

And not the intimate passionate kind, that's depicted in movies.

It's the love centred in God's love for us, His people.

Makes love a pretty important teaching.

So often we think love is just emotional, or about feelings or sentimental words.

There's nothing wrong with those things and they can be very loving.

We all want to hear "we are loved".

We want to feel that warmth, security, and tenderness that comes with love.

At some point, love becomes real and tangible.

Words tied to actions.

As consistent as can be through the work of God's love in us.

This is how John writes his letter.

"We know love by this:"

Love in Greek here is AGAPE; its HESED in Hebrew.

Both are sacrificial love; generous, tied to an action.

We often disregard sacrificial love as something too big for us to carry.

Jesus did it, we can't or don't need to.

Even though He not only says we should, but we can and do.

Because of Him.

Because of God's love, which loved us from the beginning.

Jesus lays down His life for you, me and the world.

He is not the victim of another's power or agendas.

If he is a victim at all, He is the divine victim of His own all consuming love.

His life is not taken from Him;

He hands it over and gives it to us.

A free gift of grace.

This is why Jesus is the good shepherd.

Even the laying down has a relevant meaning for us today.

It is a choice.

You lay down money at the cash register to pay for goods.

You lay it on the line when you choose to be honest.

You lay your reputation down as your good word of truth.

Ancient people laid down their lives in complete honesty.

It exposes yourself to loss, damage or death.

When you have to go to bat for someone to help them, that is laying down your life.

When you do the right thing

even though all who look at you want you to do what's easy -

that is laying down your life.

When you give a few coins to a homeless person

and your friends say "oh he's just gonna buy beer", that is laying down your life.

When we give without strings attached.

When we give without expecting a return on our investment.

When we give because God's love moves us to give.

When we protect and defend those who need help.

All of these and more involves laying down your life.

The love part of it is both the action and the consistency.

We are not to be those who only do it when we are seen.

When we can get credit.

Integrity is doing the right thing when no one is looking.

Hired hands among the shepherding culture are like this.

They are motivated by what they get out of it and only help those they like.

Which is unchristian.

This is why so many Christ-like people suffer silently.

They patiently endure, loving, giving, helping.

God's love for humanity became tangible

in the life, death, and resurrection of his Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

God begins with love.

He invites each of us to be with Him, to sit with Him, dine with Him, remain with Him.

God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God,

and God abides in them.

We can trust in God's love,

For love is not an ideal, it's a relationship,

and is lived out in relationship with our God and our neighbours.

Love puts our selfish ego aside,

and sacrificing your immediate wants for other's needs.

It means seeing the need and doing something to help.

We love because God first loved us, our passage states,

not once, but three times, in slightly varying ways.

John reframes is again – that if we are loved, we can also love others.

I think we all know deep down,

its often hard to actually do the loving thing.

We all know it's not loving to nurse grudges, seek revenge,

or act carelessly with the way other people live their lives.

We can't honestly see someone in need and keep our material goods closed up

And ignore them when compassion is so obvious.

A closed up heart can shut out God, love and a healthy conscience.

Just as we can't love an unseen God in truth when we act in dislike or apathy

To brothers and sisters whom we can see.

It's mostly because in our heart we don't want to lay down our lives.

Sacrifice costs.

Not even so much of our material goods.

No one wants to lay anything down on the line for another.

Then we are responsible and accountable.

Like the Good Samaritan putting up the beaten man in an inn with pay.

We spend out time getting out of work.

It's sinful feeling this way and makes ourselves very small and selfish.

Love is at the heart of our faith.

Jesus' laying down His body on the cross lays it all on the line.

Heaven, humanity, divinity, Word, reputation, all – all sacrificed

You allow us access to God through the crucified and resurrected Lord.

For Christ, love is lived;

and how we live comes with choice.

Our steps are all known and numbered by God; but we are not robots.

In Christ we are moved by compassion and the life-line we can offer.

This can begin with our own families, people in here, or on the other side of town.

If we believe, we will love. If we do not love, neither do we believe.

Our belief in Jesus cannot be separated from how and whom we love.

Our belief in his name is revealed in laying down our life for another.

This shows the relevance of the cross and empty tomb.

Laying down our life becomes as natural and a part of life and sitting down to eat.

Only because Jesus first laid down his life for us.

The shepherd never takes his sheep somewhere he is unwilling to go.

He never asks of his sheep something he is himself unwilling to give.

Every time we lay down our life in love for another

we remember Jesus' death and proclaim his resurrection

even as we await the day of his coming.

The opportunities for a laying down life kind of love are everywhere.

You don't have to go far.

They are the strangers who pass through our lives.

They are the anonymous ones talked about as issues

of poverty, hunger, homelessness, education.

The opportunities are people, human beings created in the image and likeness of God.

In Christ, we will be present, aware, open, willing and ready.

It is no longer business as usual.

The life and well-being of another person now is our mission and vision.

This marks the beginning of a new life.

A life that looks a lot like Jesus' life.

Following where and when He leads.

Trusting His way of generously loving.

God creates with love, rules with love, judges with love.

God loves becomes real when we're bathed into Jesus' Body with Baptism.

God's love becomes real when we dine with Him at Jesus' Meal.

Here Jesus' glorious Body and Blood abides in our Bodies.

We become walking, talking bodies of Jesus.

Christian author CS Lewis once wrote,

"forgiveness is a lovely idea until you have something to forgive."

We love, we help, we care, even if we don't like it.

We are called into a life of living it. Embracing it. Treasuring it. Because it is real.


In Jesus, there is always really real love.


The puzzle is based on John 10:11-18
