

THE SCRIPTURES

The Old Testament Exodus 16: 2-4, 9-15

The whole congregation of the Israelites complained against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness. The Israelites said to them, 'If only we had died by the hand of the LORD in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the fleshpots and ate our fill of bread; for you have brought us out into this wilderness to kill this whole assembly with hunger.' Then the LORD said to Moses, 'I am going to rain bread from heaven for you, and each day the people shall go out and gather enough for that day. In that way I will test them, whether they will follow my instruction or not. Then Moses said to Aaron, 'Say to the whole congregation of the Israelites, "Draw near to the LORD, for he has heard your complaining." 'And as Aaron spoke to the whole congregation of the Israelites, they looked towards the wilderness, and the glory of the LORD appeared in the cloud. The LORD spoke to Moses and said, 'I have heard the complaining of the Israelites; say to them, "At twilight you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread; then you shall know that I am the LORD your God." 'In the evening quails came up and covered the camp; and in the morning there was a layer of dew around the camp. When the layer of dew lifted, there on the surface of the wilderness was a fine flaky substance, as fine as frost on the ground. When the Israelites saw it, they said to one another, 'What is it?' For they did not know what it was. Moses said to them, 'It is the bread that the LORD has given you to eat. This is the Word of the Lord.

The New Testament Letter Ephesians 4: 1-14

[St. Paul writes:] I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope

of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all. But each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore it is said, 'When he ascended on high he made captivity itself a captive; he gave gifts to his people.' (When it says, 'He ascended', what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is the same one who ascended far above all the heavens, so that he might fill all things.) The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ. This is the Word of the Lord.

The Holy Gospel St. John 6: 24-35

The Holy Gospel, according to St. John, the 6th chapter:

Glory to You, O Lord.

So when the crowd saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they themselves got into the boats and went to Capernaum looking for Jesus. When they found him on the other side of the lake, they said to him, 'Rabbi, when did you come here?' Jesus answered them, 'Very truly, I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves. Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For it is on him that God the Father has set his seal.' Then they said to him, 'What must we do to perform the works of God?' Jesus answered them, 'This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent.' So they said to him, 'What sign are you going to give us then, so that we may see it and believe you? What work are you performing? Our ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, "He gave them bread from heaven to eat." ' Then Jesus said to them, 'Very truly, I tell you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.' They said to him, 'Sir, give us this bread always.' Jesus said to them, 'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to You, O Christ.

PENTECOST 11

Scripture: St. John 6:21-35

Title: "THE Jesus Diet"

August 4, 2024

FOR PASTOR NOEL RICHARDS

There's really two kinds of diets: ones that work and ones that don't. Diets that don't work we call fad diets. Promising fast results with little effort. Results, if any, are almost always shortlived and soon you're right back where you started.

Diets that work promise slow, gradual results with considerable commitment over a long period of time. You don't lose much, but rather gain better nutrition from making healthy food and life choices. The best advise not is increased exercise and leaving alone refined sugars and carbs. That's helpful for some, not for all.

One of the most prominent features of our Lutheran faith tradition is being able to eat and do just about everything, in MODERATION. At least with what goes into our mouths. But when it comes to Jesus, the Bread of Life, a DAILY INDULENCE, a regular feast is preferred.

John's Gospel is highlighting a "Jesus Diet". A truly healthy way of eating – a lifetime commitment from Baptismal waters guaranteeing Heavenly results. More than a personal trainer or dietician, Jesus is with you every single step of the way. Not only guiding or encouraging you, but the very bread for your journey. Literally He's getting you into spiritual shape for serving people now and for a heavenly feast yet to come.

Jesus' Bread of Life teaching takes place the day after He miraculously fed over 5000 people with a few loaves of bread and fish. The crowd thinks they've caught the gravy train and they don't want this party to end. After some probing, they put in their order: Give us a sign to believe in You. Jesus suggests they're looking for security. We'd call it food security. In past eras its like when people stock pile foods for fear of shortages. To their disappointment, Jesus isn't promising an endless buffet of material goodies. He's offering Himself as the only real food that will fill all peoples' deepest needs.

Truth be told, the crowds of people really don't want a special, miraculous sign from Jesus. They want bread. Bread is the staple of life. The occupying Roman army there in Israel understood this, so they used bread and entertainment as a distraction. Allowing people to let the government do as they pleased. If bread could be conjured up so cheaply, why not have Jesus do it again. Like the genie in Aladdin's' lamp offering 3 wishes!

Their own personal pantry. Remember, later on they try to make Jesus into a BREAD KING?!

We tend to be just as needy for freebies as the crowds gathering there. We want easy access to food, good health, pain-free bodies, no more stress or anxiety in our lives, more money, or at least cheaper items for us to afford. Plus all the individual little wants and desires we all crave. We have out own little ideas of what we think Jesus should be doing in our lives that He isn't doing at this very moment. Is very selfish. That's what we want our religion to become. Quick, tangible evidence that God's on our side. If faith in Him or His Son can't make our lives easier and quicker, well, we figure, what's the point!?

But for Jesus, Bread means faith and life in abundance, by eating of Him and enjoying eternal life. Dining in perfect freedom. Feasting while completely forgiven. A new start each morning we take a new breath. Not so that we'll forget our sins or troubles or responsibilities; but recognize and treasure and enjoy the Living Lord Who's inside of us keeping us going. That should take a load off our minds. For God's Kingdom in the coming of Jesus isn't about getting more stuff or a life of ease. It's a transformational life helping us cope with who we are: broken sinners redeemed and loved and welcomed and fed in Jesus Christ!

That's why Jesus doesn't get angry and yell at the crowds, or us, for seeking "more bread," but rather for *chasing after* bread that doesn't last. Why stress and strain and worry over bread (and all goods in life) that don't last. Employment and being a good caretaker is one thing; but letting have 1st place on your life, occupying your thoughts minute by minute, that's the problem Jesus is indicating. Especially when He's offering bread that lasts, bread that keeps on feeding in all of life's ups and downs. This is why He says: *I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry.* Doesn't mean your stomach won't growl at the end of this sermon, indicating its close to lunch. But by feeding on Jesus' Body and Blood, our true need of spiritual nourishment will always be fed.

Such a gift is met with arrogance. Jesus JUST miraculously fed the crowds and they try teaching Jesus about Moses' feeding their ancestors in the desert! As if Jesus is the first one to ever feed them! As if Jesus wasn't there Himself all those hundreds of years earlier. Did they forget Jesus IS the Son of God, the Word of God made flesh!?

Moses may have alerted His people of Israel of the MANNA when they wandered around for 40 years. Manna is Hebrew for "What is it". It was unexplainable. God's gift of Bread which fell down from heaven like rain in the morning, gathered up, eaten and any left on

the ground rotted away. The next day, same thing, more manna fell.

Moses himself called it "the bread that the LORD has given you to eat." Moses didn't feed them, God did. And here is Jesus doing this – and more!

It shows that the crowds truly didn't understand nor fully believe in Jesus. They need Him to prove Himself. Show more signs, do more wonders, give them reason to trust in Him. Jesus can only show them the obvious. THEIR family members ate the manna with Moses and died. Jesus' Bread will keep them alive forever! That's NEW. THIS JESUS IS PROMISING LIFE. Life in Him. Forever.

Well, we don't understand what the Lord has in store for us, either. HE had to come down to earth on holy divine terms to be of help to humanity. People don't automatically want saving. We want to be told we're A OK. We don't want to be sick or wrong or caught in trouble. So to escape hellish judgment Jesus comes to our complete rescue. Becomes our food, our freedom, our self-sacrificial offering. He's the perfect exchange we need to be rid of sin and filled with God's holy life.

And we are only rid of such things because Jesus became the sins of EVERY HUMAN CROWD on this earth. On the cross He died to make them miraculously disappear, just as if we never, ever sinned. That's the goodness of the gift.

By being earthbound, Jesus could create countless miracles and those around Him could access His presence. But by dying and rising on Easter, Jesus makes Himself available to EVERYONE on this globe at all times and in all places. The Bread He shared then is the Bread we share today, the celebration of His death and life in Holy Communion. When we receive the Bread of Life, we, too, live and dwell in Him and He in us.

Jesus, The Bread of Life, is the gift of God's love in human form, the vessel of redeeming grace. By our baptism into Him we're not separate individuals experiencing something that is strictly private and unique to us. The Bread of Life is not an individual a la carte offering that we get to pick and choose. It's a common feast that unites us. We are fed and fueled by the same bread, the same faith, the same peace, the same love. That's what makes us Church, no matter what our different ideas may express. We're not Christians because we call ourselves Christians. We are Christians because we are baptized into Christ's very own Body; nourished and strengthened, fully committed, fully absorbed in the love of Christ. In Jesus we start each day. We end each day. We live each day.

Jesus our Bread of Life offers with it a transformational purpose. Eating and drinking of Him, we're turned into Jesus' hands and feet and face to the world. Sharing the Bread of Life with a world that is stuffed with want and starving for real love.

We're called to love and serve and listen and give as we are able and expect nothing in return. To give people a "Jesus diet" of relying on God's Word and Sacrament to heal their brokenness. It's a tall order. It takes time, trust, caring, true friendship and loyalty.

Remaining in Jesus is the only way. He'll keep you make healthy life choices. His Holy Spirit will keep you connected to him with prayer, scripture and His meal. Your life will be a workout with Him in ministries of worship, outreach and fellowship. His Body and Blood in the piece of bread and drink of wine will be your strength and support. If He's running through your veins, you can't lose. You only gain.....

...gain serenity, purpose and confidence in this life... gain the joy of eternal salvation at

the next great heavenly banquet in His kingdom.

We don't just follow our Saviour, we consume Him. We don't just think about Him, we drink Him. He's part of us and we of Him. The only good Jesus diet is a steady feasting on He Who is the Bread of Life. Amen.
