In years gone by, many people felt ashamed about struggling with depression or other mental disorders, and this stopped them from reaching out for help.


THANKSGIVING DONATIONS / DISPLAY FOR THE

that the old Adam in us should,

SCRIPTURE READINGS

The Old Testament: Numbers 11:4-6, 10-16, 24-29

The camp followers with them had a strong craving, and the Israelites also wept again and said, "If only we had meat to eat! We remember the fish we used to eat in Egypt for nothing, the cucumbers, the melons, the leeks, the onions, and the garlic, but now our strength is dried up, and there is nothing at all but this manna to look at....Moses heard the people weeping throughout their families, all at the entrances of their tents. Then the LORD became very angry, and Moses was displeased. So Moses said to the LORD, "Why have you treated your servant so badly? Why have I not found favor in your sight, that you lay the burden of all this people on me? Did I conceive all this people? Did I give birth to them, that you should say to me, 'Carry them in your bosom as a wet nurse carries a nursing child, to the land that you promised on oath to their ancestors'? Where am I to get meat to give to all this people? For they come weeping to me, saying, 'Give us meat to eat!' I am not able to carry all this people alone, for they are too heavy for me. If this is the way you are going to treat me, put me to death at once—if I have found favor in your sight—and do not let me see my misery." So the LORD said to Moses, "Gather for me seventy of the elders of Israel, whom you know to be the elders of the people and officers over them; bring them to the tent of meeting and have them take their place there with you.....So Moses went out and told the people the words of the LORD, and he gathered seventy of the elders of the people and placed them all around the tent. Then the LORD came down in the cloud and spoke to him and took some of the spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders, and when the spirit rested upon them, they prophesied. But they did not do so again. Two men remained in the camp, one named Eldad and the other named Medad, and the spirit rested on them; they were among those registered, but they had not gone out to the tent, so they prophesied in the camp. And a young man ran and told Moses, "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp." And Joshua son of Nun, the assistant of Moses, one of his chosen

men, said, "My lord Moses, stop them!" But Moses said to him, "Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the LORD's people were prophets and that the LORD would put his spirit on them!" This is the Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

The Epistle James 5:13-20

Are any among you suffering? They should pray. Are any cheerful? They should sing songs of praise. Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven. Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective. Elijah was a human being like us, and he prayed fervently that it might not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the earth. Then he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain and the earth yielded its harvest. My brothers and sisters, if anyone among you wanders from the truth and is brought back by another, you should know that whoever brings back a sinner from wandering will save the sinner's soul from death and will cover a multitude of sins.

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

The Holy Gospel St. Mark 9:38-50

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Mark, the 9th chapter:

Glory to You, O Lord.

John said to [Jesus], 'Teacher, we saw someone casting out demons in your name, and we tried to stop him, because he was not following us.' But Jesus said, 'Do not stop him; for no one who does a deed of power in my name will be able soon afterwards to speak evil of me. Whoever is not against us is for us. For truly I tell you, whoever gives you a cup of water to drink because you bear the name of Christ will by no means lose the reward. 'If any of you put a stumbling-block before one of these little ones who believe in me, it would be better for you if a great millstone were hung around your neck and you were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to stumble, cut it off; it is better for you to enter life maimed than to have two hands and to go to hell, to the unquenchable fire. And if your foot causes you to stumble, cut it off; it is better for you to enter life lame than to have two feet and to be thrown into hell. And if your eye causes you to stumble, tear it out; it is better for you to enter the kingdom of God with one eye than to have two eyes and to be thrown into hell, where their worm never dies, and the fire is never quenched. 'For everyone will be salted with fire. Salt is good; but if salt has lost its saltiness, how can you season it? Have salt in yourselves, and be at peace with one another.' This is the Gospel of the Lord.

This faith God gives for righteousness in His sight.





REV. TODD HOEFFS Pentecost 19 Mark 9:14ff September 29, 2024

My own pastor, who baptized me, confirmed me & ordained me, Called this little white square tab in our clergy shirt A MILLSTONE.

Sits right at the throat, over the voice box.

It's a vivid reminder and warning to all pastors [even to all believers]:

make sure what you say speaks of Christ to all we encounter.

IOW Walk the talk.

Speak corrective law and grace-filled Gospel.

A millstone is a heavy large flat rock.

Attached to a stone container and grinds grain into powdery flour substance.

No doubt a few are visible when Jesus' gives this warning.

Deadly if attached to a person.

Better to drown to death weighted down in the sea

than to cause a little believer to get lost.

We don't want to stumble nor be the cause for others to stumble.

The Twelve disciples think they've unearthed a scandal:

Someone outside their elite circle has been caught in the act. Doing what? Sinning? No.

Acting in Jesus' name (in this case, casting out demons in His name).

That's supposed to be the job of the disciples.

How amazing. Earlier in Mark chapter 9,

none of the Twelve could exorcise an unclean spirit from a boy.

Now they forbid someone who is doing the same thing, but successfully.

Jesus stops this privileged status.

Anyone acting in a good work in Jesus' name has faith and authority.

Anyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

'In the name of Jesus' isn't a formula to stick on the end of a prayer,

It expresses the reality of a life lived under the reign of God's Kingdom.

Any act or thought in the name of Jesus means faith in action.

Jesus wants His disciples to cease nitpicking or else they'll cause him to stumble.

Jesus speaks of Gospel and condemnation in this issue.

As a Gospel point, when you act compassionately

(giving a cup of water to a little one,)

GOD IS PLEASED.

As a condemnation point, perilous danger awaits anyone causing

'one of these little ones who believe in [him]' to stumble.

Little ones follow Jesus in faith.

Not little as in kid, or little as in weak;

Little as in we come as God's children -- who trusts in being dependent on God.

The Stumble meaning here, like tempt to sin, is SKANDAL in Mark's Greek text.

Originally used as bait on the end of a fishing hook.

Like wafting a piece of chocolate cake under the nose of a person with a sweet tooth.

It's placing a stumbling block in the way as a trap to cause someone to fall.

The Gospel, the Cross, the Word of God, are all such skandals.

If that Scandalous stumbling block gets in the way of a person's belief

The offender will be condemned in the end.

Pharisees, Temple leaders and religious experts in Jesus' day are such stumbling blocks.

How do we know?

Well, ask, do they care about only themselves or Christ and His people?

It's easy to blame the little one -

That they must be overly sensitive or haven't developed a thick skin.

Not so.

Little ones are precious in God's sight

Who sends Jesus to gather up the least.

Jesus isn't going to the cross to die for the world

only to have His inner circle disciples

turn faith into a work and His church into a commandment factory.

The temptation is huge, greater than you can imagine.

We're out there in the world "competing" for religious following.

It's a consumer driven society.

People know what they want, and the wise marketer supplies it.

People want rigid principles, give them rigid principles.

People want a good feel, give them a quick fix.

People want promises of success, give it to them.

But who on earth wants the only thing we need –

Jesus Christ, crucified, risen and given to all who believe.

Seems too easy, free, worthless, cheap.

It's so not.

One of my personal heroes in the faith is Dietrich Bonhoeffer.

In his book, COST OF DISCIPLESHIP, he writes:

Cheap grace, is "preaching forgiveness without repentance;

it is baptism without the discipline of belonging in a church community ...

Cheap grace is grace ... without the cross, grace without the living Jesus Christ."

Cheap grace, in other words, is thinking that we can get to Hollywood

[or join our fav hockey team] without practice,

that we can become a master musician,

or a professional athlete,

without putting in our concerted hours of work.

That doesn't mean if we try hard God is happy.

Or that if we practice daily we'll be in Jesus' good book.

Cheap grace is thinking that since Jesus went to the cross for our sins,

we don't have to deal with our sins anymore.

He's taken them away, so we don't have to confess any sins any more.

We're saved, it's a one and done.

No.

That is a personal stumbling block.

Lutherans never believed once you're saved, you're always saved.

Anyone can fall away.

It's more like – since you are saved in the blood of Jesus,

You will grow in grace, be a living human Gospel in the community.

Once your life-light is lit, it glows and remains connected to the energy source.

Stumbling blocks to faith are till sure to come.

It might be the devil with his doubts and lies,

Could be the current hunger for instant gratification,

The overarching despair and hunger for power;

There's greed and jealousy.

It is even our own selves who fall,

with our guilt and shame and all that stuff in our lives that says,

"You can't possibly be a Christian, a disciple of Jesus. Look at you!"

Oh yes stumbling blocks to faith are sure to come.

The friend who wants you to doubt the Gospel,

who wants you working off your faith.

Your family member who thinks church is a waste of time.

The gossiper running down peoples' lives behind their backs.

The spouse pushing you to take care of only yourselves and no one else.

Jesus has "zero tolerance"

when it comes to throwing stumbling blocks under the feet of his 'little ones" of faith. For Jesus, grace is costly.

Grace cost Him His life-blood.

This grace invites us to long for time to spend learning about Jesus' gifts.

It is the grace that Jesus HAS DIED to give us.

The grace that is worth giving up an eye or an arm and a leg for.

Because it is the grace that ushers us into the very kingdom of God.

Costly grace is the gospel which must be sought again and again,

the gift which is always received, the door of welcome open to all sheep."

Gospel and Forgiveness.

This is the church's work.

This is why sin is called out and confessed for the purposes of forgiveness.

If your brother sins, tell him he's wrong. Show him his fault. Name the sin.

Put it under the light. Bring it out into the open.

And if he repents, changes his mind, turns in his way, seeks forgiveness, then forgive him.

You may remember the sin again, but each time you remember it, forgive it.

If the person's wrong wound up being a stumbling block for a little one,

Then they are still forgiven but may need a time of repentant renewal to live better.

In most addiction rehab programs, one of the mottoes is, "willing to go to any length".

Meaning if an addict is not willing to go to any length to root out their addiction,

including not going to places that might make them stumble,

they will not stay sober.

Many times addicts try to "control and enjoy" their addiction

but it almost always leads to them into full blown stumbling.

We Christians do the same thing with sin.

Well, a little bit won't hurt.

The problem comes – it speaks double message for a younger believer.

They see and do accordingly.

If a life of faith in the church isn't important and a parent walks away,

The kids will usually follow.

That doesn't mean a legalistic approach is necessary.

The Christian life isn't only about do's and don'ts.

Yet teachings from Jesus remind us to lead lives worthy of our calling.

Needing grace when we do stumble. And grace to overcome our weaknesses.

Keep in mind, when we're forgiven of our sins

This is precisely why we are able to repent of our sins and let the Spirit work.

Grace is both costly and free.

Grace calls us into a lifestyle.

Baptism is a full meal deal, where you are enveloped int the Trinity.

You are what God is.

And where God is we go forth.

And as you go forth the Word of God is carried along with you.

This is the salt and light Jesus ends with.

Usually a preserver, its sprinkled onto temple offerings.

Christ know sprinkles you with His Blood

and the salty Scriptures winged along by the Spirit's flight.

Our saltiness isn't meant to rub hurt into others' wounds

But to passionately speak of all that you believe.

Salted witness, peaceful living.

Your words will impact and you will breathe a sigh of relief at the end of the day.

You trust in Jesus.

His love for you carries you.

And we won't fear that big old millstone.
