

October is Cybersecurity Awareness Month

Please be aware there have been e-mails sent out in Pastor Hoeff's name that are Phising Scams.

Ways to prevent Phising yourself from Phish net:

- Be very careful about not replying to any such spam mails that ask you to confirm or update any information about your account.
- Do not follow any links that come with the spam mails, which will lead you to websites that ask for conformation of your account information.
- Never copy an unknown link from these kinds of spam mails and paste them on your web browsers. These links are made to look very humble by the phishers, but they will actually land you to some scam and fraud sites.
- Be careful about opening or saving any document or attachment that comes with spam mails. Do not trust these kinds of e-mails even if they appear to be sent by some authorized entity.
- Never ever send your confidential information about your account in an e-mail.
- It is better to be protected from these scams by using firewall, anti-spyware and antivirus software. Make sure to update this software regularly for security of your PC.
- Do not respond to those scam mails, which even seem to offer sound business or ask you to avail a refund. The fraudsters often sent you phone numbers so that you call them up for business purpose. They use Voice over Internet Protocol technology. With this technology, their calls can never be traced.
- The church will NEVER ask for money or gift cards via an e-mail.

SCRIPTURE

Old Testament *Ecclesiastes 5:10-20*

The person who loves money will never have all the money he wants. The person who loves wealth will not be satisfied when he gets it. This is also useless. The more wealth a person has, the more friends he has to help him spend it. So what does he really gain? He gains nothing except to look at his riches. A man who works hard sleeps in peace. It is not important if he has little or much to eat. But a rich person worries about his wealth. He cannot sleep. I have seen something unfair here on earth: A person suffers harm from saving up his money. Then he loses it all in a bad deal. So he has nothing to give to his son. A person comes into this world with nothing. And when he dies, he leaves with nothing. In spite of all his hard work, he leaves exactly as he came. This, too, is unfair: He leaves exactly as he came. So what does he gain from chasing the wind? All he gets are days filled with sadness and sorrow. He ends up sick, defeated and angry. I have seen what is best for a person to do here on earth. He should eat and drink and enjoy his work. This is because the life God has given him on earth is short. God gives some people the ability to enjoy the wealth and property he gives them. He also gives them the ability to accept their state in life and enjoy their work. Such people do not worry much about how short life is. This is because God keeps them busy with the things they love to do. This is the Word of the Lord.

Epistle *Hebrews 4:1-13*

Therefore, while the promise of entering [our Lod's] rest is still open, let us take care that none of you should seem to have failed to reach it. For indeed the good news came to us just as to them; but the message they heard did not benefit them, because they were not united by faith with those who listened. For we who have believed enter that rest, just as God has said, 'As in my anger I swore, "They shall not enter my rest", though his works were finished at the foundation of the world. For in one place it speaks about the seventh day as follows: 'And God rested on the seventh day from all his works.' And again in this place it says, 'They shall not enter my rest.' Since therefore it remains open for some to enter it, and those who formerly received the good news failed to enter because of disobedience, again he sets a certain day— 'today'—saying through David much later, in the words already quoted, 'Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts.' For if Joshua had given them rest, God would not speak later about another day. So then, a sabbath rest still remains for the people of God; for those who enter God's rest also cease from their labours as God did from his. Let us therefore make every effort to enter that rest, so that no one may fall through such disobedience as theirs. Indeed, the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing until it divides soul from spirit, joints from marrow; it is able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the eart. And before him no creature is hidden, but all are naked and laid bare to the eyes of the one to whom we must render an account. This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Holy Gospel St. Mark 10:23-31

The Holy Gospel, according to St. Mark, the 10th chapter:

Glory to You, O Lord.

But Jesus said to them again, 'Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! Jesus looked at them and said, 'For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible.' Peter began to say to him, 'Look, we have left everything and followed you.' Jesus said, 'Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields, for my sake and for the sake of the good news, who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age—houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields, with persecutions—and in the age to come eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first.' This is the Gospel of the Lord.

"Needles & Pins"

Try threading a needle with thick thread in the dark without your glasses.

That's still easier than Jesus' saying today.

"It is easier for a camel to go through

the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God.'

Jesus is cleverly making an extreme, important life-changing point:

What seems impossible to us

is totally possible with God.

Camels exist in Jerusalem.

They're large, usually weighted down with lots of merchandise and ancient luggage.

Sewing needles are in many ancient households, made from animal bone.

There are stories all over the world which try to get us to think

The "eye of a needle" is an actual tiny gate into the city of Jerusalem.

So a camel would need to lay down, have all the packs taken off, and he could squeeze in.

While that may exist, it did not in the Jerusalem gate in Jesus' time.

Jesus is using an extreme example of God's ability.

Entry into His Kingdom isn't challenging, it is IMPOSSIBLE without faith in Jesus.

Camel passing through a needle's eye is giving us a vivid extreme image.

No doubt the people listening in on this giggled.

But the 'camel through the eye of a needle' saying is no joke to the rich man.

Jesus brings to light the dark humour of every *poor* man and woman in their society – most rich folks remain rich because (deliberately or not)

they exploit or support a system that makes the poor suffer.

So, if anyone continues to exploit and bring harm on those in need,

then those oppressors will not be fit to enter the kingdom of heaven.

Jesus recites the commands to the rich man and includes a new one:

'You shall not defraud'.

Many poor tenant farmers experience their payments being held back by owners, or their deposits of goods or money not being returned.

Jewish law says if a poor person is taken advantage of by a wealthier person, they can make restitution by reimbursing them.

But this particular rich man wants a God who blesses his lifestyle without requiring him to change it.



The problem with a desire for that

Winds up making God into a divine overseer letting one suffer for this man's benefit.

That is the epitome of selfish sinful privilege.

It's like the times I had to deal with bullies when I was a classroom teacher.

Various methods can be used.

You can use humour to diffuse, ignore some of the behaviour, redirect them,

Correct and explain in various ways.

But once a bully's action infringes upon the safety, learning and existing of another student -- the bully must be stopped.

Then a bully has to learn to work with others around them to exist.

That rich man wants absolution from any responsibility to the poor.

He wants his consumer driven wishes sanctioned.

The rich man's wealth should bring a spirit of gratitude and generosity,

But it only reeks of favouritism.

As if he's superior.

This is a problem in every culture, within every era, in every human heart and mind.

Even if we don't mean it to, our comfortable living comes at the expense of others – Our 21st century ease comes at an expense.

Certainly, God is not in the business of making us guilty;

in Scripture Satan is the accuser,

God brings good news.

This exchange between Jesus and a rich man

might make us question our own earthly goods,

but we shouldn't feel condemned by it,

for this truth of scripture contains good news for all people regardless of means.

There's a reason Jesus tells him to sell his stuff and give his money to the poor.

Looking at this guy, Jesus loves him.

Now, this is a remarkable statement.

This is the only place in Mark's gospel where Jesus is said to 'love' someone.

Jesus feels deeply for this guy's situation.

A guy who's bought in to a transactional faith, who possess much but is empty within.

Jesus wants him to be a holy helper in this world with Heaven as the ending.

Giving him this warning is the loving thing to do.

But how could that be?

It makes no sense to us in our driven, privatised society

where the compulsion to own and consume more and more for ourselves

is just like the compulsion driving the rich man and his culture --

Surely, our own society say--

the loving thing to do is look after *ourselves* and our families first; our wishes, our wants, me, me, me.

I can still hear a grocery store shopper back in my high school days speak to a store manager Who complained about people needing welfare government assistance.

This elderly shopper, a WW2 vet simply said to them in a quiet voice:

"Well, we all gotta eat don't we?"

That leveled the conversation.

We are all the same, all have needs and loved by God.

Survival of the fittest must not bleed into our Christ-centred Gospel generosity.

Jesus sees the consequences of wanting more and more,

and his heart fills with love for a rich man lost,

a man searching for release from all that harms his well-being,

longing for the deepest things which money cannot buy.

Jesus invites the man to turn his back on his alienating lifestyle.

He's guiding him towards another way of being,

in turning from his heart outward towards God

whose love for him will release him from his wealth addiction,

and free him to create new, redeeming relationships with others

who he will no longer view as competitors,

but companions with him on the journey through life.

That's the heart of the matter, where the rich man's heart really is.

Rich, poor & everyone in between, all of us can suffer from greed.

Any thing we trust quicker than we trust God is an idol we must cease to serve.

A camel in the eye of a needle doesn't seem so funny or hard know.

It's no longer weird wonder but a genuine joy.

By and large, Christians are usually sincere and well-intentioned people

until you get to any real issues of ego, control, power, money, pleasure, and security.

Then they tend to be pretty much like everybody else.

We often settle for a lite version of the Gospel,

some fast-food religion, without any deep transformation of the self;

and the result has been the spiritual disaster of 'Christian' countries

overly absorbed with consumer-oriented, proud, warlike, racist, class conscious,

and addictive as everybody else - and often more so, I'm afraid.

In this way we as the church can be too much like the world.

We've been told at times accepting people from the world as they are in here

to receive the Gospel of renewal and the Holy Spirit --

IS acting like the world;

It's not.

All are welcome into the Lord's present. ALL, not some, all.

It's when we seek special treatment or become overly concerned with our self or hang onto old grudges or choose to overlook certain peoples' wrongs because we like them –

THAT IS acting like the world.

That's the pecking order of most jobs. That's not the way of the church.

The alternative way Jesus gives the rich man he hands us.

Love God and love our neighbours.

Christianity is not a religion that gives some people a ticket to heaven and makes them judgmental of all others.

Rather, it's a call to a relationship that changes all our other relationships.

A new relationship with God brings us into a new relationship with our neighbour.

Especially with the most vulnerable of this world, and even with our perceived enemies.

In loving the rich man, Jesus invites him to love his neighbour,

knowing that in so doing both will find life in all of its grace-filled beauty.

God's call is the foundation for re-establishing and reclaiming the way of Christ.

Seems like such an impossible task in our times.

That's what the disciples say to Jesus too.

"Then who can be saved?"

But Jesus just looks lovingly at them and says,

'For humans it's impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible.'

For this reason, Jesus comes.

His virgin birth in a dirty manger seems impossible.

His taking up the cross talk and following seems impossible.

His putting up with nasty religious leaders and letting them speak evil seems an impossible act to follow.

From cheers to jeers, from following to forsaking,

With God NOTHING is impossible.

This is why the cross is God's glory.

His dead son nailed onto torturous wooden beams makes all things possible.

What we mean for sin Jesus brings out for the good.

Our Lord Who is rich empties His coffers with blood payment making us both poor and rich.

Poor to our sinful self which dries up and rich to our grace filled forgiven self.

None of us have been hurt because of our faith to the point of shedding blood.

No one has given up more than Jesus,

The One who can lay down His life and pick it back up again.

Because of Jesus' righteousness and grace,

All of us will receive a hundredfold now in this age—

Good and bad. Easy and Difficult. Laughter and tears.

Blessing and persecution.

It's not impossible.

Nothing with God is impossible.

We become possibilities. God's possibilities.

Growing and learning and coping and overcoming and loving.

Even eternal life at the end of it all.

Where we'll see many camels riding through the eyes of needles.
