

The Epistle

Romans 3: 19-28

[St. Paul writes:] Now we know that whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. For 'no human being will be justified in his sight' by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin. But now, irrespective of law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus. Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law. This is the Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God**.

- If you desire Holy Communion, church membership or further information about receiving the Sacrament, please speak with the Pastor or an elder before worship.

REV. TODD HOEFFS Reformation Day John 8:31-38 "We May Never Pass This Way Again" October 27, 2024

Way back in the year 1546, 2 weeks before his death, A very ill Martin Luther travelled from Wittenberg to his hometown Eisleben, Germany. He had premonitions that death would come soon. So Martin preached 2 weeks in a row. His last sermon, shortened in length due to illness, clearly expressed how central faithfulness to the Scriptures for the future of the church. You'd think this kind of event could attract thousands. I mean, the leader of the reformation, who just 30 years prior, nailed his 95 Theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg. 95 issues for discussion against the church of the day, namely paying to be forgiven. The end of an era stood before them. But no, thousands didn't come. Some writers claim Martin expected over 600 to show up and felt sad a little less than 270 appeared. If the death of the church's reformer couldn't bring out the crowd, This fact should keep us from being too proud. That Reformation Day is less about spectacular pride and humble, faithful growth. That Reforming remain a way forward; Reforming that involves reading of Scripture – praying in every situation, Gathering the scattered weekly in the church to embrace Jesus' Gospel gifts. That is reforming. The past is history. We have today, we look in hope toward the future. The moment we are in at this second will not return again. All of our lives are in constant change. A major value in times of change – TRUTH. Jesus nails this directly today in John's Gospel. "...you will know the truth ..." Hear that. You will know the truth. How? Is 'truth' even possible? When we don't believe someone - a family member, a politician, the media, a friend when we don't believe what they say is true, how can we believe what's been written down thousands of years ago to be true? How can we believe anything? When Jesus says these promising, affirming words to His disciples two thousand years ago -

"...you will know the truth ..." – I'm not sure *we* do.

Our Lutheran Reformation history for the last 507 years has placed truth In the same category as doctrine, learned rigid content

and virtually divorced from boots on the ground mission and ministry

among the people who are the reason truth is crucial.

Reformation life in the church

is not about recreating a past we view with rose coloured glasses.

It's not about how good we feel and how rotten the world is.

Sadly the church's collective history is overflowing with examples of

Fighting, back-biting, hoarding beliefs only for ourselves,

ruffling another person's feathers, or another church's, so we feel better or superior. That truth is what I have, but you don't.

That's not what Martin Luther would've imagined for the church.

He said many times he would die a reformed catholic.

A church treasuring the truth of faith and releasing the unnecessary trappings.

This truth convicts the religious leaders Jesus is facing down.

They want it all about them.

But God is saving Israel as a nation, not just Abraham.

God is saving Israel because they carry the promise of salvation, for all, not just a few. God has always been saving *people*, not just individuals.

God is still saving *the* church, through Christ and the Spirit,

not just my church or my friends or my own self.

God has been saving the church *for all time*—the people as a whole—

and not just individuals sitting in the pews.

Gid has been saving BECAUSE people need saving.

Israel constantly got into trouble in the Old Testament.

So Jesus clarifies, "everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin."

Now that's a statement that pounds.

Everyone sins.

Religious leaders then didn't buy that.

Certainly not slaves to sin. As if tied to it or even in love with sinning.

Sin isn't just a bad act, but a power underneath in our hearts that makes us do back acts. We sin because we are sinners.

So our slavery is slavery to this will inside of us.

There may be kinds of freedom that we can make for ourselves, but not this one. That's Jesus's point.

This slavery is too deep. And all of us have it.

Why else do the religious crowd throw the lie in His face

that they've NEVER been slaves?

Really? Assyria? Babylon? Greece? Rome?

The lie betrays their depravity.

Sin enslaves in two ways.

First, sin enslaves us by producing compelling desires.

Sin enslaves by making anything look more desirable than Jesus.

That's what sin is: desiring something above Jesus and then acting on it.

And the second way sin enslaves is that it eventually condemns us.

Unless something intervenes, it leads separation from God.

This is slavery because it leads you down a path that toward destruction. Jesus alone free us from this slavery.

He frees us from the condemnation of sin by becoming a *condemnation* for us.

"Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us" (<u>Galatians</u> 3:13). Jesus also frees us from the domination of sin

by changing our nature at the root through the new birth.

Meaning: with freedom in Christ, we are given eyes to see

that He as our Saviour is more desirable than anything in the world. Jesus alone sets us free.

"So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed."

The freedom Jesus promises involves letting go of our small self,

our many biases and complaints, and even our fear of loss and death.

Freedom is letting go of wanting more and better things;

it is letting go of our need to control and manipulate God and others.

It is even letting go of our need to know and our need to be right—

which we only discover with spiritual growth and maturity.

We become ever more free as we let go of our primary motivations:

our need for power and control, our need for safety and security,

and our need for affection and esteem.

Christ-centred living is real true liberation.

We are people of the truth.

We name what's real, what's true, and what works—now and in the long run.

This way is simply love.

Faith is love.

Love is freeing.

Most people do not grow up thinking of religion as a path of freedom.

Instead, its usually about prescriptions, dos and don'ts, musts, oughts, and shoulds against which we pushed back, like children always do.

When we're young, we think rebellion is the only path to freedom!

Some amount of structure is important, but it is first-level growth.

Far too much religion stays right there.

While Christ is changeless, we are not.

We do not just stand still.

Rebellion isn't freedom; rebellion is sin. And its selfish.

We are not the center of the universe.

We do not need to place our thoughts and feelings in the centre of every conversation. And if we're honest, we learn we don't want to be. Me 1st is isolating and lonely.

The little lost lamb needs finding.

The one lost coin is found.

The pearl of great price is bought at an enormous cost.

Christ sets in place an identity we can rest securely in.

A place of truth.

Where there is truth, there is peace.

Where there is truth and peace there is trust.

What is truth? Christ is the truth.

And our Reformation is participation in the life of Christ as His Body in the world. Baptism gives us Jesus' identity.

Hearing and reading Scripture gives us Jesus' identity.

We can see our own selves in the story of the Bible.

The Spirit makes sure we remain in that identity.

Holy Communion celebrates this identity,

Creating a spiritual family bond --seen on earth and unseen in Heaven.

We are chosen. We are led. We are made free.

The Son sets you free.

The Son unlocks the chains of sin when He is nailed down to the cross.

The Son releases the shadow of death by succumbing to death publicly.

The Son destroys the devil's grip by letting him believe Calvary is a loss.

All that's loss is gain in the shed blood of God's Son

And know the devil is a powerless angry evil angel.

"You will know the truth and the truth will make you free."

Indeed we are.

Indeed Martin Luther enjoyed this same freedom.

Reformation may have been fuelled by geo-political forces and social unrest in Europe.

Power struggles between Pope and Princes, Emperor and economies —

all these helped shape the course of what happened with the church,

far beyond what Martin Luther was essentially all about.

Because Reformation, in the end, is a *movement* in history

and a *movement* of Spirit in the hearts of people

continually changing and transforming, and treasuring our freedom.

Reformation was and is a gift-----

something we continue to cherish, share, work at and move towards.

Not stuck, static. Not fixated, nor constricted. Not divided,

autonomous nor conflicted out of some sentimental view of the past.

But Spirit filled, Spirit driven, transformative, forgiveness, merciful,

Always growing towards Jesus' vision, His Kingdom, His truth,

which never goes out of style no matter what era we're in.
